a distance of 81.2 miles The grant of 3 to 1 aid on the Crockett County project was brought about through the presentation of facts concerning the non-taxable University lands in the county. The proposed road project will penetrate approximately thirty miles through University lands and this fact was taken into consideration by the Highway Commission in making the unusual grant of three to one aid on the project

The proposed bond issue, if voted, will provide for construction of 53.7 miles of modern hard surfaced road east and west through the county over the Old Spanish Trail, from the Sutton County line to the Pecos County line at the Pecos River, and 27.5 miles from the intersection of the Old Spanish Trail, Highway 27, to the Irion County line about four miles this side of Barnhart.

Calling of the election to decide whether or not bonds in the amount mentioned in the petition is mandatory on the part of the Commissioners Count, 50 signatures of qualified voters and taxpayers being necessary on the petition. The petition also requests that the question of whether or not a tax should be levied in an amount necessary to provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the interest on the bonds and redeem them at maturity be submitted in the same election.




