Membership Cards To Be Available End Of This Week

Rules and regulations governing use of the tract of land on which the Ozona Lions golf course is located, on the W. R. Baggett ranch north of town, have been bert, Bertie Rosen, Irma Teerry, drawn up by the club's golf committee and will be printed on application blanks for playing privileges and on membership cards to be available the end of this week.

The rules as drawn up by the committee cover points of the con tract between Mr. Baggett and the Lions Club governing use of the plot of ground. A pledge to strictly observe these rules will be required for issuance of the privilege cards. Infraction of the rules will necessitate suspension of players guilty of such infraction to avoid nullifying the confor the golf course purpose.

Among the rules as required by the contract is that no person shall climb fences surrounding the plot or let down water gaps. Members are to be responsible for actions of their guests and caddies, Immediate suspension from privileges will be the penalty for violation of this rule. ed in the third on Hetherly's RAIN REVEALS NEWLY DUG GRAVE IN CEMETERY WHICH REMAINS MYSTERY AFTER INVESTIGATION BY OFFICERS

A newly dug grave of about the size and proportions to hold the coffin of a small child, discovered in the northwest corner of Cedar Hill cemetery here following the rain last week, re mains a myster to local officers after digging out five feet of loose dirt in the hole.

The small "grave" was discovered by Dean Phillips, care taker at the cemetery, when the rain softened the loose dirt and caused it to sink and crack open. Knowing that no grave had been dug in that vicinity recently, the caretaker notified officers who made an investigation.

The loose dirt had been thrown back into a hole about four feet by 21/2 or 3 feet, whose walls were dug smooth and perpendicular as in a grave. The officers and Phillips dug the dirt from the hole with shovels down a distance of five feet when the earth became firm and it was apparent that !
