Agebo Barrera Victim Knife Fight On W. Odom Ranch

Agebo Barrera, 25, Mexican sheep shearer, was fatally stabbed in a shearing camp fight on the Worth Odom ranch in Pecos County Monday night. Another Mexican, said to have been a close friend of the dead man, was taken to Fort Stockton, where murder charges were to have been filed. Barrera's body was brought here Monday night and prepared at the Joe Oberkampf funeral ome for shipment to Eldorado. his home town, where burial took place Tuesday.

A slash across the throat which severed the jugular vein was Barrera's fatal injury. He was stabbed in several other places over the body and arms.
