

intendent. The pump station, which will operate as a booster for oil flow through the line, is to be powered with two big six-cylinder Diesel engines, pulling two huge pumps. In normal movement of oil volume through the line, one pump will be operated, with the second in reserve, and both may be operated where necessary.

Concrete foundations for the heavy machinery have been completed. More than two carloads of cement were used in this Youndation work. Forms are now being built in readiness for pouring con crete foundations for the building itself. The building is to be of structural steel construction, covered with heavy sheet iron,

Upwards of seventy men have been on the pipe line company payroll in the past month in which construction has been in progress. The number will be decreased as work progresses, with an average of around forty to find employment during the next two months, Mr. Brooks declared.

Payments Must Be Made In June

Collector Warns Of Heavy Penalty After June 30

Under the split payment plan, a taxpayer is permitted to pay half of the taxes due if paid before November 30, the last half being held over without penalty if paid on or before June 30. If the second half split payment is allowed to become delinquent beyond June 30, a penalty of 81/2 per cent of the amount due automatically applies, increasing each month of delinquency by onehalf of one percent.






