Live Oak School To Be Abandoned **End Present Term**

ts Vanquish Big, Board Decides To Discontine Smallest School In Co.

> When the present school term ends, the Live Oak school, on the western edge of Crockett County, will be discontinued permanently. it was decided by the school board in session Saturday night.

Only two pupils of school age were enrolled in the Live Oak school during the present year, school officials said, and the expense of maintaining the school was so great and the benefits so small that decision was reached to bondon and provide for transfer of these pupils to another school. One other pupil, below school age, s attending the school this year. Mrs. T. Prrisher is teacher this year at Live Oak.

The school has been maintained for more than ten years. The largest enrollment ever registered there was twenty pupils. This enrollment record was established when road workers and pipe line crews were located in the vicinity several years ago.

Substantial salary increases for teachers of the county's schools were voted by the board in its session. The salary hikes will be effective with the opening of schools next term.



Child Health Day Observance Urged By Health Officer

AUSTIN, Texas, April 15-Call has gone out from the State Department of Health to county health officers to act as chairmen and organize committees for observance of Child Health Day during May. Dr. J. W. E. H. Beck. field director of the material and child health division, is State chairman by designation of Dr. John W. Brown, State Health Of-

ficer. Although May Day is Child Health Day by act of Congress, communities are free to choose any day for the observance.

This slogan has been officially adopted for Texas Child Health

"Annual physical examination by your physician and dentist. Immunization against diphtheria, typhoid fever, and smallpox. Safe water and proper sanitary equipment for home and school."

These suggestions are set forth in Dr. Beck's letter to county health officers:

"May Day-Child Health Day is a challenge to all parents to take stock of the health needs of their children, with special reference to immunization of those of the preschool age. The records of this office reveal that during the year of 1935: 64% of the deaths caused by diphtheria occurred before the child reached 5 years of age, 23% between the ages of 5 and 9 years, 6% between 10 and 14 years, and 7% were over 15 years of age. Therefore it is imperative that you have your children immunized against diphtheria during that first

year of age. "We recommend an annual examination for each child, by your family physician and dentist now. and hereafter this annual examination should precede the opening of your fall school term.
