Army Day Parade in  
San Angelo Saturday**

Two general officers of the U. S. Army, Brig. Gen. Laurence B. Keiser and Brig. Gen. Bruce C. Clarke, will be San Angelo's honoree guests for an Army Day celebration this week-end.

Further, both men and material, including some of the tanks and guns which cracked the European fortress and the Nipponese outposts, will be presented in quantity both in the highlighting Saturday morning parade, and an afternoon open house program at Goodfellow Field.

Lt. Col. T. F. Passarella will command 450 crack troops of the 11th Headquarters Special troops at Camp Hood who will participate in both parade and open-house.

Guns, tanks and armored vehicles will be in the line of march of the April 6 parade. Some of the heavier tanks and other vehicles will be displayed and demonstrated on railroad flat cars at the air field southeast of the city.

Gen. Keiser is to present a number of high military awards to personnel of the local field, now a permanent military installation, in ceremonies following the Saturday morning parade.

The parade is to start at 11 o'clock Saturday morning from the old Santa Fe station

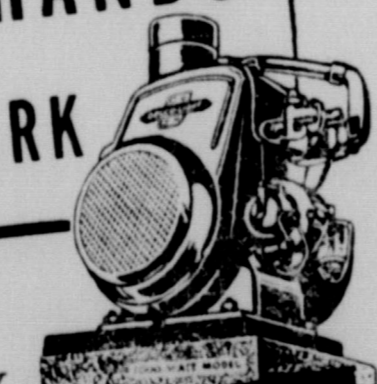

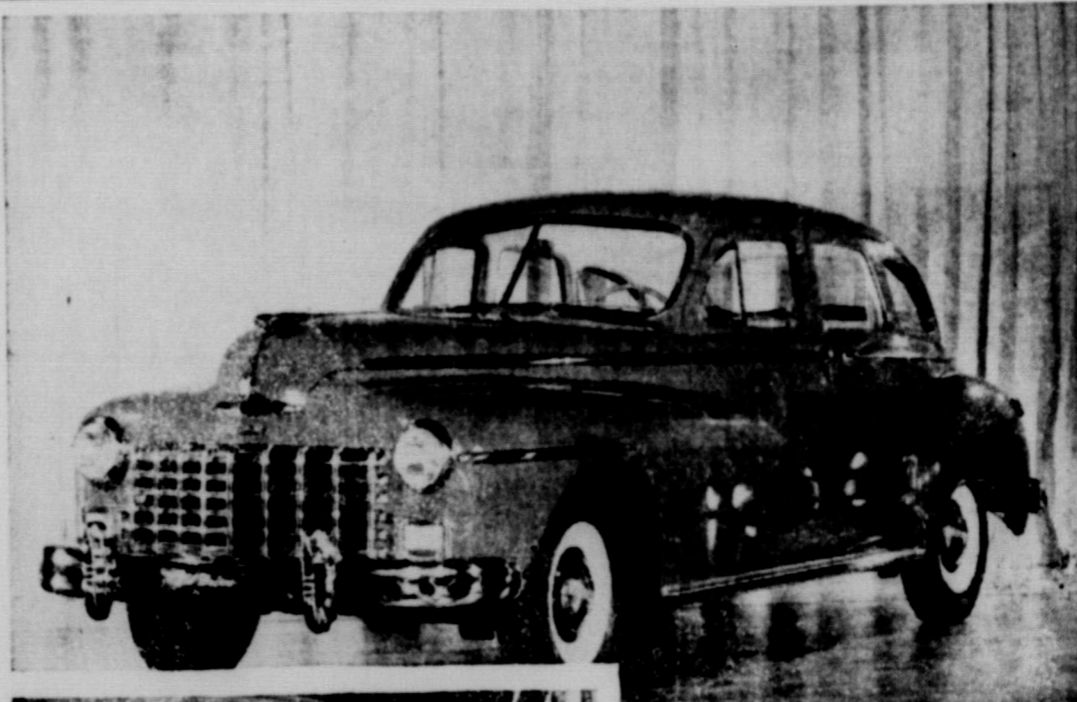
