Paralysis Said Rare Aftermath of Polio; 75 Per Cent Recover

Dr. Hart E. Van Riper, acting medical director of the National Foundation or Infantile Paralysis, said today that evidence from many sources tended to show that 75 per cent of those stricken with poliomyelitis could be expected to recover without serious after-effects.

Discussing the role of the National Foundation and its chapters in the June issue of "Hospitals" magazine, official publication of the American Hospital Association, Dr. Van Riper declared:

"The paralysis so commonly regarded in the past as being an integral part of the disease process has finally been shown to be comparatively rare sequela of a wide spread innocuous ailment."

He said such recovery, however, was predicated upon accurate diagnosis, adequate medical nursing care with early therapy and immediate hospitalization.

"This latter consideration," he declared, "looms large. Without hospitalization, the entire treatment structure collapses. Unless the patient can be cared for in a hospital, none of the other essential services is possible."

New Drug Protects Children From Measles

AUSTIN, Tex. — With the incidence of measles more than sixty per cent higher than the seven year median, Dr. George W. Cox,

State Health Officer, has issued a statement concerning the use of gamma globulin for protection of very young or frail children from an attack of this perennial childhood disease and its often serious complications.

"If you have a child less than five years old who has been exposed to measles, your family doctor may recommend giving him gamma globulin," Dr. Cox advised. "Through city, county or state health departments, doctors can obtain gamma globulin free to be used as they think advisable for infants and children, whose bodies make it inadvisable for them to suffer an attack of measles, may postpone the disease if gamma globulin is administered within eight days from the time of exposure here."

Extension Service Recommends DDT in Wettable Powder Form

COLLEGE STATION. — Texas county agricultural agents have advised that for the present, only treatment recommended by the Texas A. and M. College Extension Service for the control of flies, lice and mosquitoes on stock in wetttable DDT powder form is now on the market in two very different forms. 1) dry, in wetttable powder form, 2) liquid, in oil or xylene solutions or emulsions. Both forms are diluted with water for use as a spray or dip.

The decision to recommend only DDT in wetttable powder form for use on livestock was made by a committee of entomologists and animal husbandmen who checked known sources of information. The group will make further recommendations as research goes on. The committee pointed out that DDT in wetttable powder goes into suspension when diluted with water for use as a spray or dip. There was no evidence that it was harmful to animals even if used in strength somewhat greater than that recommended by the manufacturer.

It was further reported that DDT in oil solution or emulsion form does not remain in suspension but goes into a true solution.

When applied to animals in this form it can be absorbed through the animal's skin. If the solution is used as a spray or dip at less than the manufacturer's recommended strength, it may not give effective or lasting control. If it is used at more than the recommended strength and if the precautions listed by the manufacturer are not exactly followed, it may have toxic results.

Two reports of the U. S. Department of Agriculture's Animal Research Administration were quoted. August 22, 1945: "Oils should not be used on animals and they are not recommended for general use on buildings. They offer an opportunity for DDT to be absorbed by the skin; on buildings they increase the possibilities of a fire. Because they penetrate porous surfaces like concrete, brick or soft wood, oils can transport DDT into the walls where much of it is not accessible to the flies and other insects. On the other hand water sprays made of wetttable DDT powder or suspensions remains on the surface where the treatments afford full advantages for killing insects."

And on March 27, 1946, the Animal Research Administration warned "DDT in oil solutions or emulsions is readily absorbed through the skin of man or animals. Persons using it in this form are urged to take special precautions to avoid repeated or prolonged exposure to the material."

Eight-Inch Fire Hydrants Installed In Business Area

New eight-inch fire hydrants were being installed in the business section of Ozona this week along the course of the new big water main being laid from the hilltop water tank around the square. The big main was being laid up the hill and work on this phase of the water works extension program was nearing completion as workmen near the point of connecting the new main to the eight-inch line originally laid from the tank.

As soon as work is completed on installing the fire hydrants and connecting the new main, W. E. Kimrey, San Angelo contractor, is expected to begin work on the \$57,000 contract for the extension of water and sewer mains over the city and for expanding the sewer disposal plant. A bond issue of \$50,000 was recently approved by voters of the water control district for this expansion program, the county to make up the deficit between the bond fund and the contract price for the work.

NOTICE TO PATRONS OF THE SANITARY SEWERAGE SYSTEM

Effective June 1st, 1946, the following rates have been adopted by the Board as fair and reasonable:

Private Residence - \$1.00 (minimum) per month for one unit (comprising lavatory, toilet, bath and kitchen sink) and 25 cents for each additional toilet.

Commercial - \$1.50 (minimum) per month for one unit (comprising lavatory, toilet, bath and sink) and 25 cents for each additional fixture of any type.

Hotels, Rooming Houses, Apartments, etc. - \$3.00 (minimum) for one unit (comprising lavatory, toilet, bath and sink) 25 cents for each additional toilet and 15 cents for each additional lavatory or other fixture.

These rates are in accordance with the recommended practice for communities similar in size to our own and compare favorably with neighboring cities.

In order that the system be enlarged and kept in a condition satisfactory to our State Board of Health it is necessary that a maintenance charge be made.
