Engineer Begins Street Survey For Paving Program

Estimated 90 Per Cent Of Footage Signed For Surfacing

Julian Montgomery, Austin engineer, this week began a survey of Ozona's unpaved streets to be included in the proposed paving program for the city. The engineers will complete the preliminary work, including measurement of each street to be included in the program for a total footage, running grades and setting stakes for the base work, to be done by the county.

Tom Harris, general chairman of a committee named at a mass meeting of citizens to contact property owners along unpaved streets, reported this week an estimated 90 per cent of all property owners along such streets had signed agreements to participate in the paving program.

The preliminary agreements which property owners were required to sign specify that the owner agrees to pave in front of his property at a rate estimated at \$1.85 per running foot for a 36 foot street, this figure being the engineer's estimate of the cost, the agreement providing for va-Humble Oil & Refining Co. Texas collections totaled 858, 656,063 during the month for a six million dollar gain over last July's \$52,638,018.

Offsetting the sharp income tax decline weere boosts of 10 per cent in employment taxes, 46 per cent in withholding taxes, and 4 per cent miscellaneous taxes over July 1946 collections.

WARNING

To Sellers and Buyers of Used Motor Vehicles

A new law is now in effect in Texas which requires the transfer of current motor vehicle registration papers and properly assigned certificate of title at the time of sale of any used or second hand motor vehicle.

The law also requires the new owner of such vehicle to make application at the office of the tax assessor and collector within ten days after purchasing the vehicle for transfer of title to his own name.

The new law provides a penalty of a fine up to \$200 for failure to deliver registration papers and assigned certificate of title at the time of sale and assesses a penalty of \$5, to be collected by the tax collector, against the new owner for failure to make application for transfer of title within the prescribed ten-day limit. A fee of 50 cents is provided by the law for transfer of license plus the regular fee for new certificate of title.

Since the tax assessor-collector is required by this law to collect the \$5 penalty against new owners of used cars who fail to apply for transfer within ten days, and since the sale of a used vehicle without surrendering registration papers and title certificate is a misdemeanor, punishable by fine, we urge all who sell or buy a used motor vehicle to see some member of the sheriff's force if you are not certain that you have complied with all the terms of the new law


