



All Texas counties are now un-

partment of Agriculture. The action qualifies farmers who have for loans from the Farmers Home Administration to put in 1952 crops. Announcement of the designation was made at Dallas, headquarters of the Farmers Home Administration by L. J. Cappleman, state director.

Bad weather conditions in 1951 reduced crop yields materially and tightened up credit conditions, to the extent that many farmers were unable to finance crop plantings. Disaster loans are now available in each county. Farmers who have sustained production losses on crops and livestock may apply for funds to pay for seed, fertilizer and materials for insect control where needed, gas and oil for tractors, feed for livestock, essential farm and home operating expenses, machinery repairs and other expenses incident to the production of a crop.

Credit is advanced under authority of Public Law 38 and is available to farmers who have sustained losses, and who cannot obtain from local sources the funds needed to plant a crop this year. Before a loan is made a county committee of three farmers must certify that the applicant suffered a substantial production loss. Farmers may apply for loans at the office of County Supervisor Denny O. Sullivan located at San Angelo in the Tom Green county courthouse.

Funds will be available to ranchmen whose herds have been depleted by the drouth. They can borrow to restock their pastures.

Farmers who qualify under the disaster loan regulations may discuss their needs with the county supervisor.

Better farming practices are emphasized in the FHA loan program. These will be discussed and agreed upon by the county supervisor and the applicant when the loan application is prepared. --000-







The will of his constituents is likely to be dimmed out by his intense desire to hold his own particulary in a system like ours where there is no effective way for the electorate to register its will except through pressure groups.
