CORPUS CHRISTI TENSE IN FACE OF CITY ELECTION

Fear Bloodshed If Rangers Remain In City

By Associated Press. CORPUS CHRISTI, April 2.—All city and county officers were heavily armed last night as tense Corpus Christi feared bloodshed over an asserted investigation of absentee voting by Texas rangers.

Started by Fight. Nesbitt's denial of the alleged investigation and his statement that he did not receive the telegram only added to the intensity of the situation.

The troubled city last night traced beginning of its misgivings to a fight in front of the police station between Ranger Al Allen, Maxwell Dunne, local undertaker and political leader.

Chief of Police A. R. Mace filed assault charges against the officer in corporation court.

Several hours later Dunne filed charges of false imprisonment against Allen and City Detective Ed Flint and charges of assault against the rangers.

The fight followed shortly the alleged arrest of Dave Allen, political ally of Dunne, by Allen and Flint.

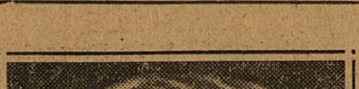
Dunne saw the rangers and city officer pass in a car. With them was Allen. Dunne followed them to the police station, where the fight occurred after Dunne asked Allen if Allen had been arrested.

Questioning of a number of persons in private Saturday by Allen added to the general excitement caused by his arrival the day before.

Rangers Silent. Allen and Neal were non-committal over their presence here.

Chief Mace, however, broadly hinted they were here for the absentee vote investigation when he said the city police were cooperating with the state men in every way and that the "investigation will be continued for an indefinite time."

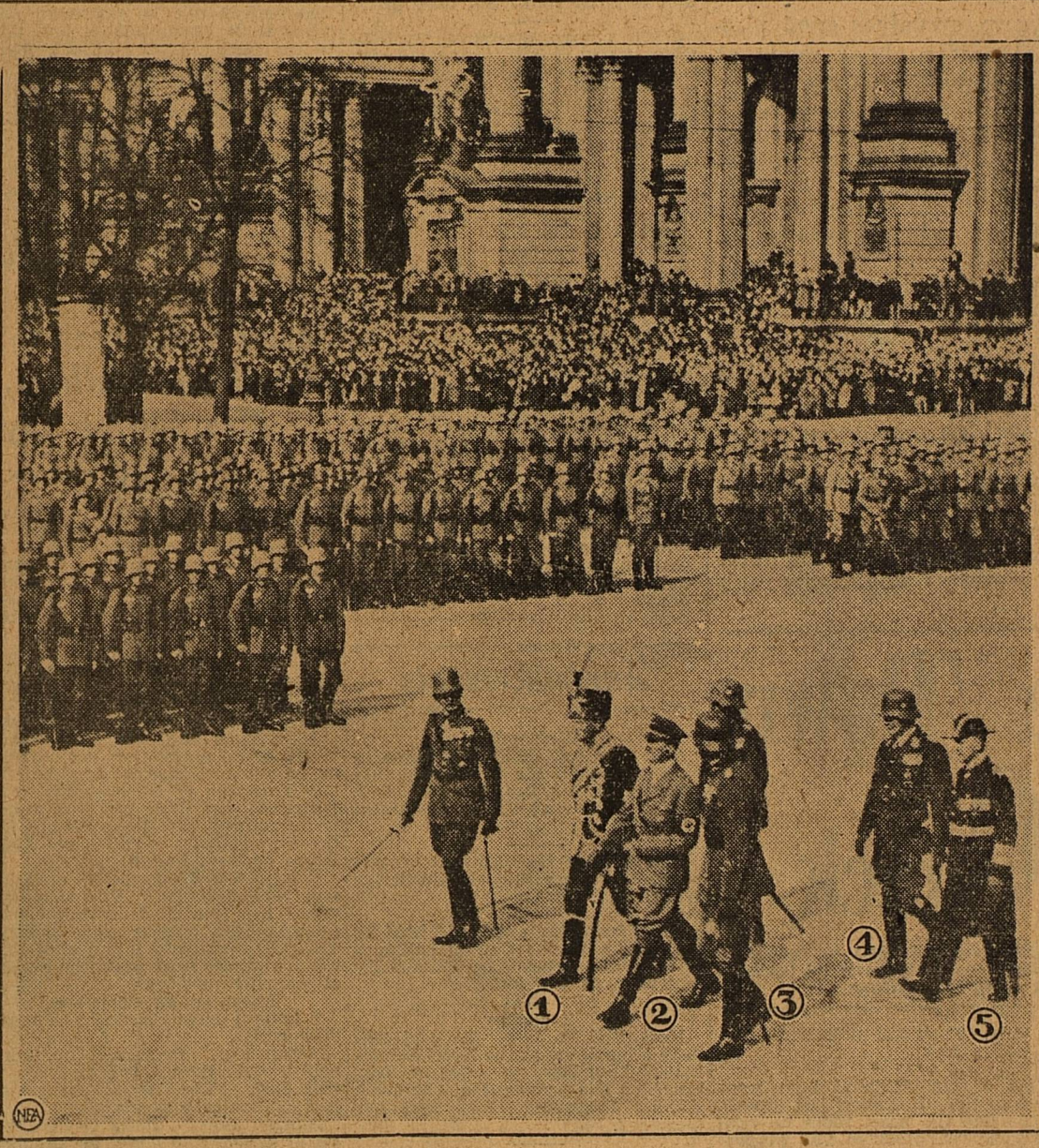
DAUGHTER BORN TO HEJLS

"The preservation of the honor and security of the German Reich from now on will again be entrusted to the German nation's own might," Chancellor Hitler assured his people in renouncing the Versailles treaty. The next day the most spectacular mustering of armed forces since the war took place in Berlin as part of the Heroes' Memorial Day Service, with the militant chancellor reviewing "the demonstration of might. Above the official reviewing party marches past the troops: (1) Field Marshal von Mackensen; (2) Hitler; (3) General von Blomberg; (4) Premier Goering of Prussia; (5) Admiral Eric Raeder. In the background, part of the 500,000 Berliners who witnessed the spectacle crowded every vantage point.

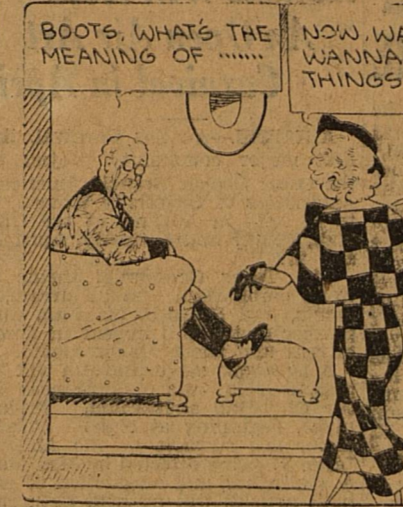
Fog Delayed Murphy Trip
