Hearing Is Set for McCamey Drug Store

AUSTIN, June 7. (P).—A new type of attack by the state on drug stores violating medicinal liquor permits in the sale of whisky were revealed Thursday by the comptroller's department.

Under a law enacted at the time of prohibition, but never previously enforced, the comptroller announced five drug store medicinal permits had been voided after hearings on affidavits alleging violations.

All were surrendered voluntarily after hearings before Comptroller George H. Sheppard. Three were in Wichita Falls, one in Abilene and one in Corpus Christi, which was the first filed.

Thirteen other affidavits have been filed. Eleven charged violations by Fort Worth drug stores, on which hearings were set for next Monday. Affidavits in Fort Worth were filed by Rangers, and in other cities by citizens and officers.

Hearing on an affidavit filed against one Tyler drug store was set for next Tuesday, and one in McCamey, June 18.
