### NO BOMBS DROPPED BUT POPULACE IS PUT INTO PANIC

### Rome Strengthening Troops In Lake Tana Area.

### TURKEY TO ARM Asks Permission of League to Fortify Dardanelles

Nine Italian war planes wheeled over Addis Ababa today, throwing the populace into a panic. The planes circled the city, but dropped no bombs. They later turned back toward the northern base.

Rome reported troops were strengthening positions in the conquered Lake Tana sector, center of vital British interests.

Turkey requested the League of Nations permission to fortify its Aegean island entrance to the Dardanelles channel near the Dodecanese islands, heavily fortified by Italy.

Italy and Ethiopia charged each other with violating international conventions of war. Rome declared it was observing "laws of war," but must punish "every inhuman atrocity committed by its adversary."

Tomorrow, the Italian and Ethiopian representatives are scheduled to meet for opening peace talks with Salvador de Madariaga, Spain, man of the league conciliation committee.

In Manchoukuo, Japanese general headquarters announced 20 Japs and 50 Soviet holders had battled for half an hour on a sand bar in the Ussuri river. The outcome was undisclosed.

Tokyo sources announced six high officials of the Manchoukuo government had been arrested and charged with plotting subversive movements and furnishing information to Russia. The governor of the North Hsichang province and five others—all Mongols—were seized. It is suspected they will face a court martial.

ROME, April 13 (AP)—Italian dispatches from Ethiopia today said the Fascist advance guard of the northern army had entered Dessse, former field headquarters of Emperor Haile Selassie.

Prime Minister Baldwin has summoned the cabinet ministers for a meeting tomorrow to decide England's course if Mussolini refuses to conclude an armistice with Ethiopia.

The long postponed decision on invoking military sanctions is believed at hand—economic and financial sanctions having failed to halt the war. Drastic steps are believed necessary to preserve the league's prestige.

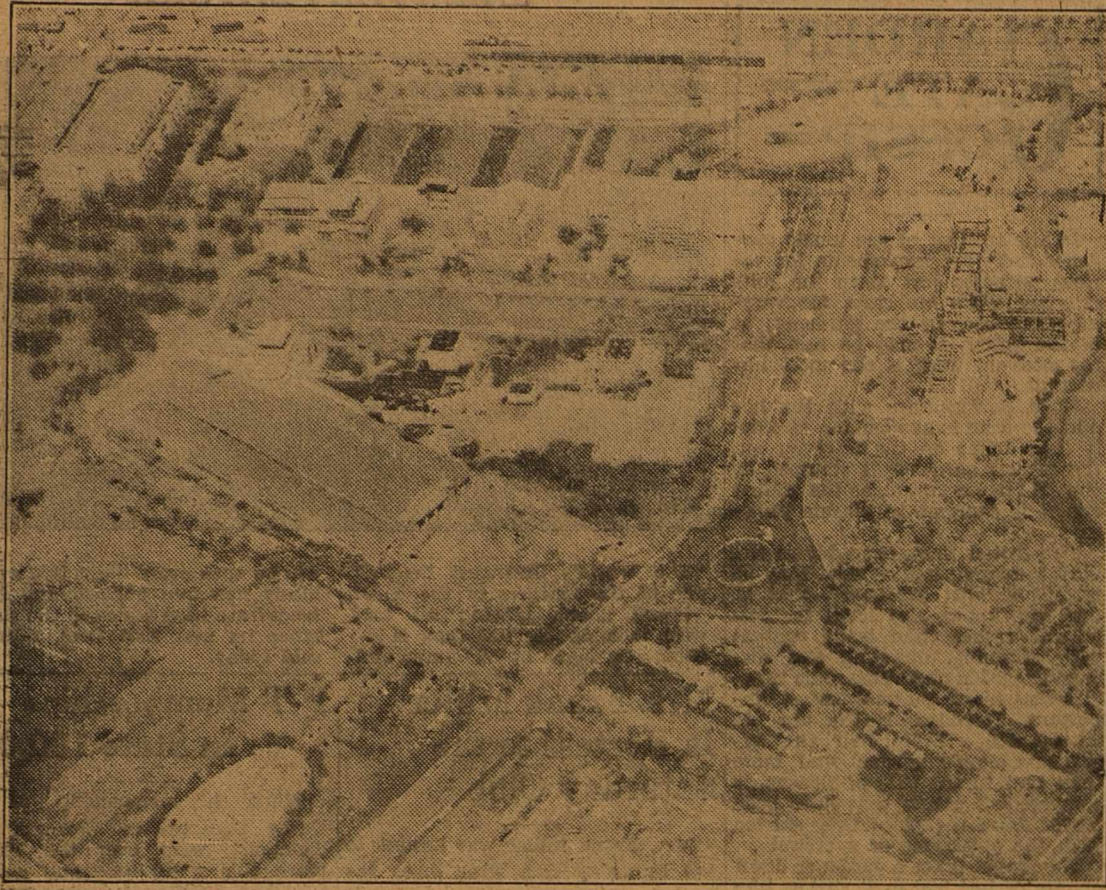

## Here Are Five of Exposition's Fifty Buildings



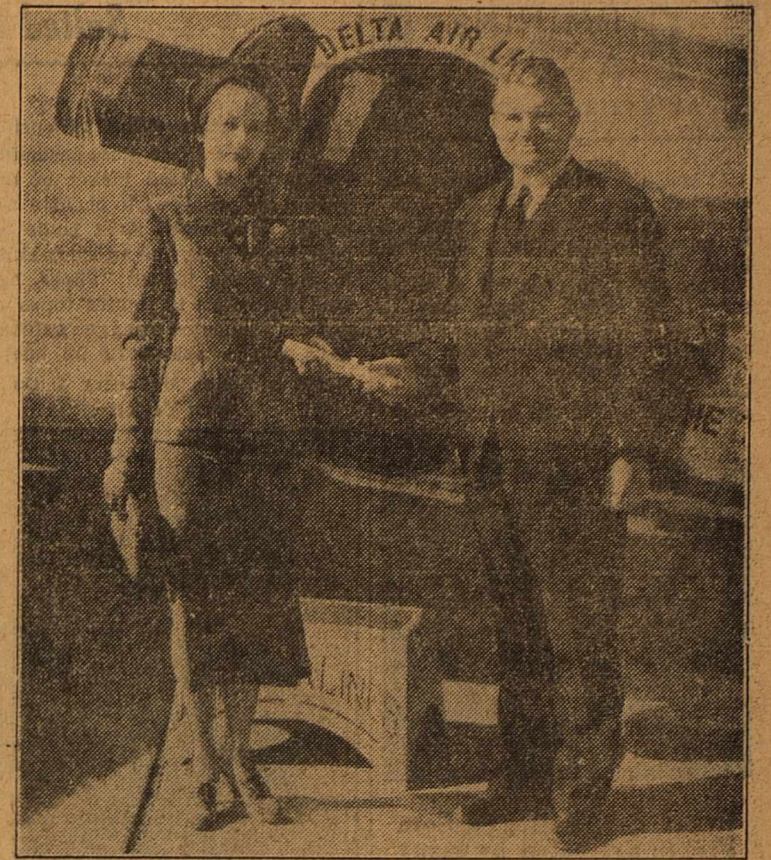

## Where 14 Died in Mexican Air Liner Crash



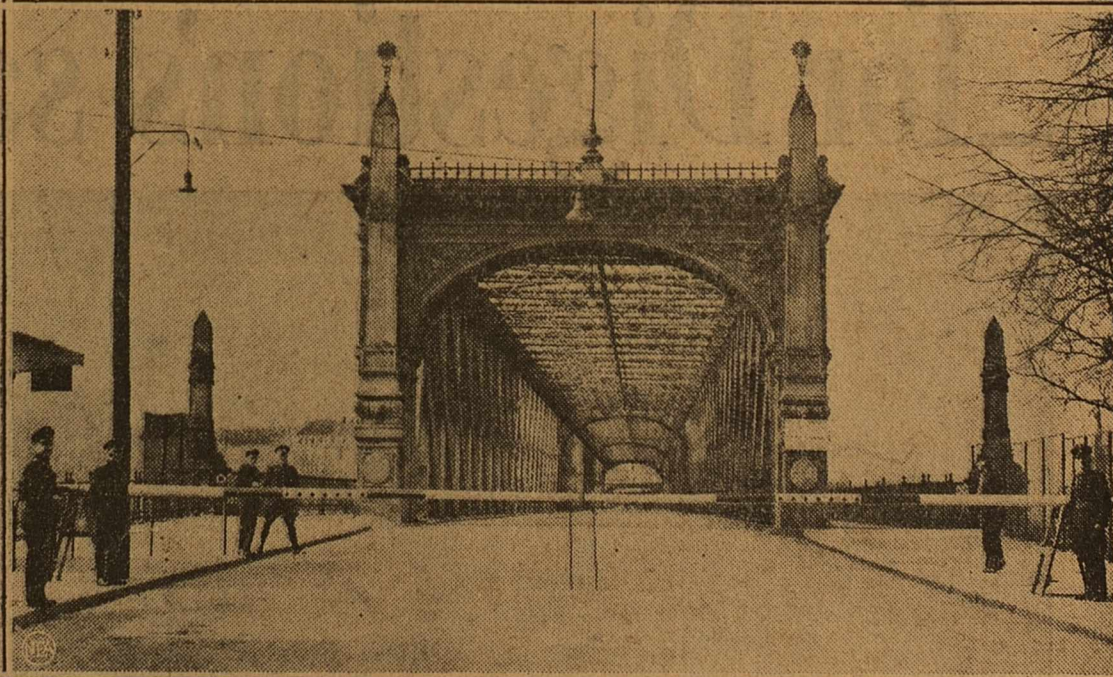

## Sets Spanking Pace for Movies



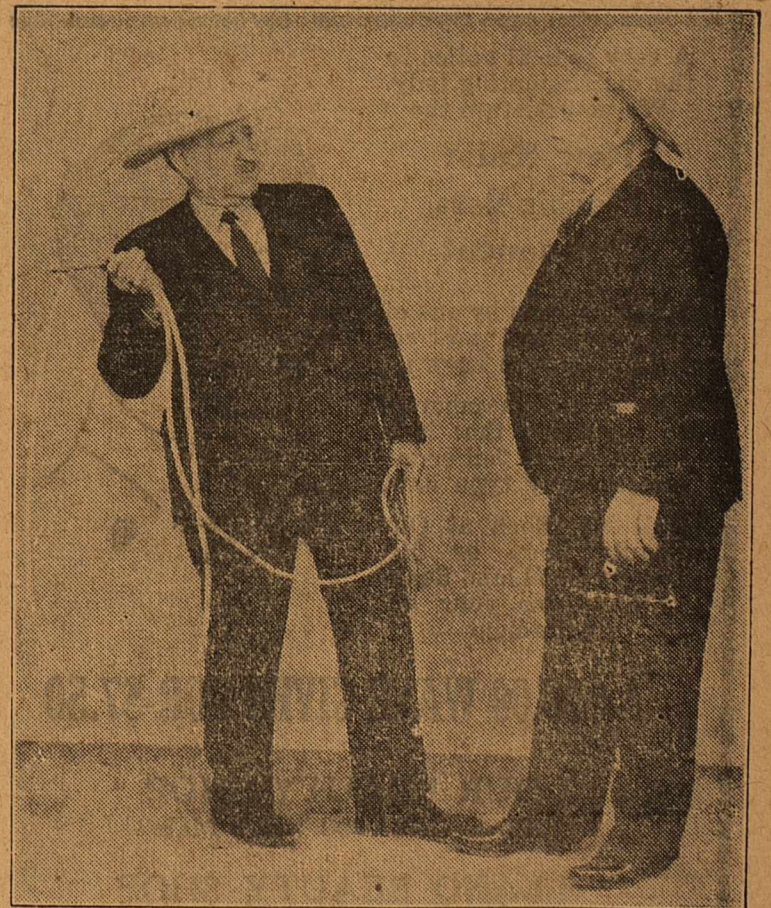

## Soldiers, Soldiers All Around—But Not One in Sight



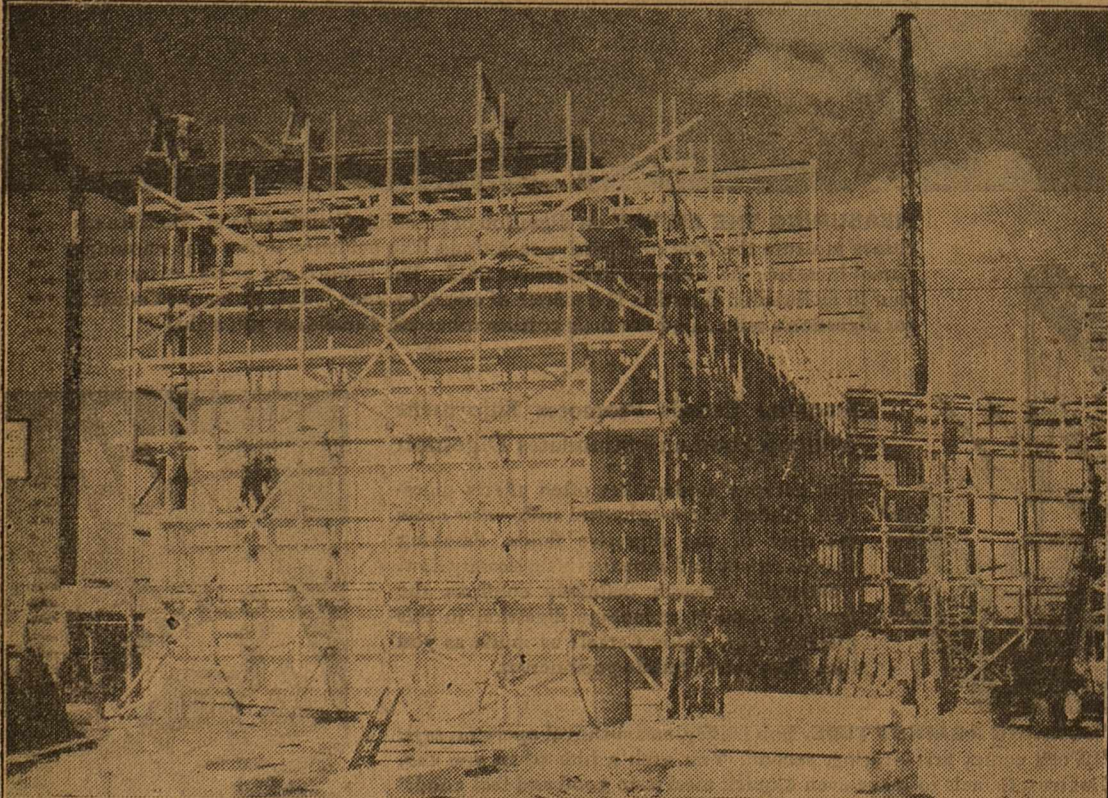

## Texas Rodeo Heads for Paris



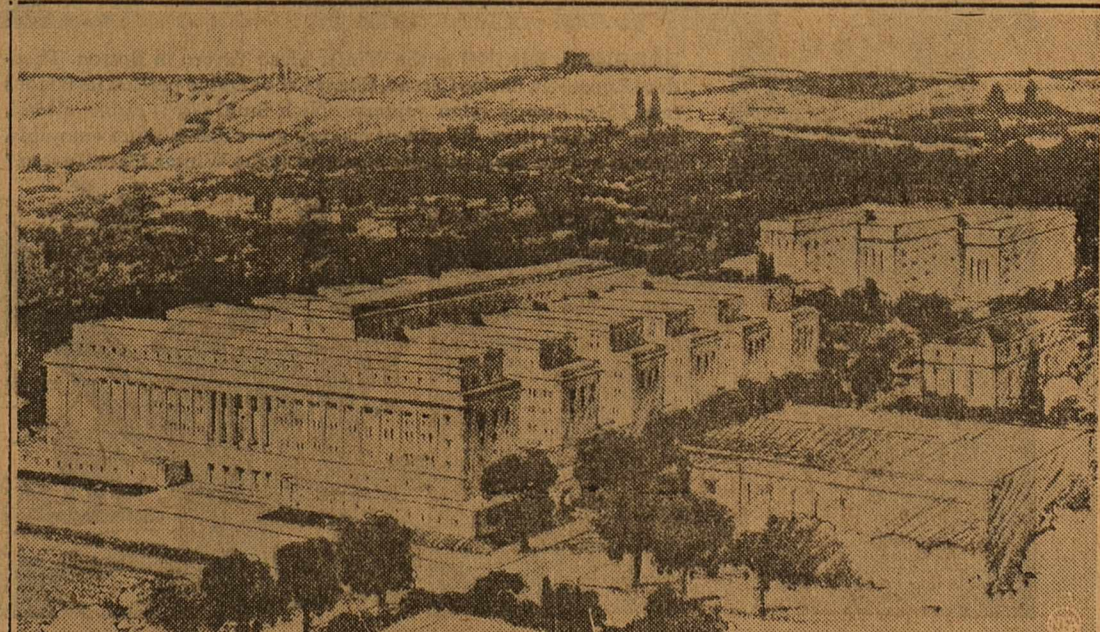
