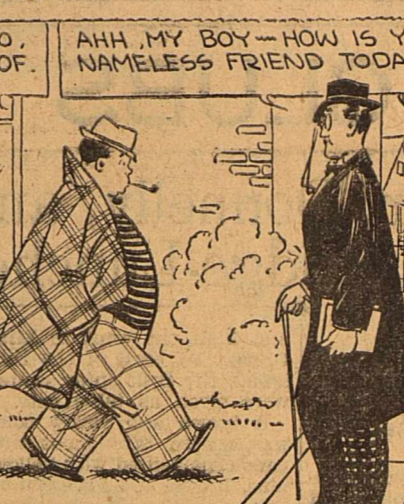
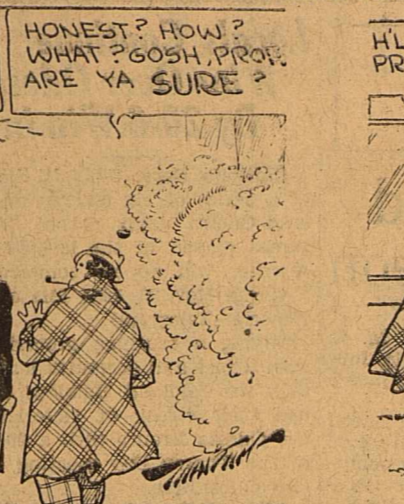
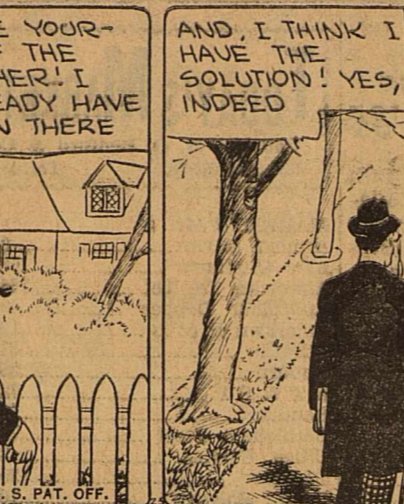
The army is eager to provide soldiers with the clothing and equipment most appropriate for the particular service to which they are assigned, summer or winter, and the War Department recently has called for rigid
