Looks At Landfill Problem
(R-TX) made the followin statement this week concerning the proposed landfill regulations: Government regulators are asking communities across the country to plan for cushioning, protecting and babysitting. garbage. The Environmental
Protection Agency (EPA) has plans to require cities to spend hundreds of thousands of dollars to wrap an entire garbage municipal landfill in plastic or clay, cushioned above and below
with sand. The EPA suggests with sand. The EPA suggests
rules for monitoring groundwater even when there is a lack of groundwater. Furthermore, local communities will have to bear the enormous cost of watching these
buried garbage heaps for 30 buried garbage heaps for 30
years. We cannot just dump our
garbage without consequences to the groundwater we drink. However, rules must account for
differences in the amount of differences in the amount of
waste cities bury in their landfills. While the big cities pack as many as 10,000 people living in a
square mile of land, towns in our area count fewer than six people per square mile.
Mayors, city managers, and
council members council members have called or
written me about the financial written me about the financial hardship new EPA regulations
will have on towns in the 19th will have on towns in the 19th
Congressional District. Just this past week, representatives from past week, representatives from
Andrews and Denver City have
come to my Washing come to my Washington, D.C. office to personally express their
views and mounting views and mounting concerns.
Garbage collection that Garbage collection that may
currently cost six dollars, might currently cost six dollars, might
escalate to thirty-five dollars if the EPA dumps their regulations on West Texas residents. I will fight this type of overregulation every way I possibly can, but I must be straightforward: just like
the garbage, this issue will not go the garbage, this issue will not go
away. However, there are ways away. However, there are ways
to make these environmental regulations workable and reasonable. Ribbons of red tape
regulations cannot mandate landregulations cannot mandate land-
fill operations-without conse-


I would much rather see West
Texans deciding what is best for our skies and water based on our own circumstances. If Congress legislates the control over landfill
regulations back to the states regulations back to the states,
provisions could be made for unique areas like ours which experience little rainfall, and have fewer people threatening groundwater pollution.
We might think the EPA will
bury us alive in bury us alive in governmen
regulations. Environmental regu regulations. Environmental regu
lations are real, not reasonable. However, town governments can continue to urge their associa-

## Year Credit Contract, Limits Are Explained

## This is the third installment of

 a four part series on the topic of using consumer credit. In the first two installments, credi worthiness, building a credit record and the types of credit were discussed. In this part wewill discuss the credit will discuss the credit contract
credit limits and the costs of credit. The final part will discuss credit histories and preventing credit problems.
The Credit Contract All credit, even revolving store credit, involves a signed con-
tract. Be sure you read and tract. Be sure you read and
understand everything in the understand everything in the
contract before you sign it. Some questions you should ask before you sign a contract are:
-Do the payments fit into your
budget? budget?
Can you make the payments for the length of time agreed upon? It may be better to keep your
monthly payments smaller for longer period of time than pay out more money than you can afford each month. Although extending your payments costs more in interest, you can pay off
the debt sooner if money is the debt sooner if money is
available. If you agree to make large payments and money becomes tight, you find yourself in a difficult situation.
What are the consequences if you default on the agreement? What will you lose? When an installment contract is not paid
by the terms agreed, the creditor can repossess the collateral. You would lose not only the item, but also any money that you have
already paid. You may even owe
borrow. The best way to compare
interest charges is to look for the interest charges is to look for the
Annual Percentage Rate (APR). Advertisements may claim you can get a bank card without, prior credit history. These cards have a high annual fee and financial institution from higher risk customers.
Before deciding to use credit, determine whether you really need the goods or services or not. Sometimes it is better for you t put a specified amount of money
into a savings account each month until you can pay cash for these items rather than purchase th $\stackrel{m}{ }$ on credit.

your money and compare different agreements. For example repayment terms can vary from creditor to creditor. The creditor determines these variables, but you can find credit to suit your needs and situation on terms you can live with-if you shop around. One credit cost is an annual fee. Many financial institutions
charge an annual fee of $\$ 20$ or more for a bank credit card. To avoid surprises, be sure you understand if there are fees involved.
