Thery should then be dried on the hand with a bath towel. Then they should be taken off and immediately stretched back to their original shape and hung up to dry. The gloves should be softened before they become thoroughly dry by rubbing gently. <br> All leather gloves stamped "washable" can be depended on to wash.
