Lacoste has definitely decided that he will not play in the challenge round this year and his friends fear that he is out of championship play for good.

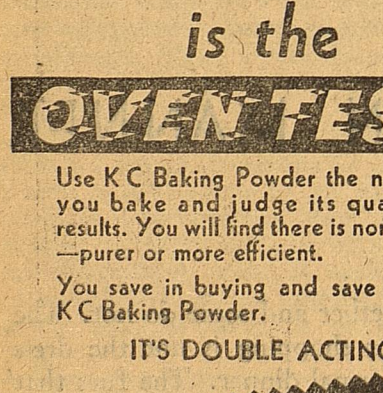
When appendicitis developed with Lacoste and the surgeons decided to operate, it was feared that an anesthetic would be harmful.

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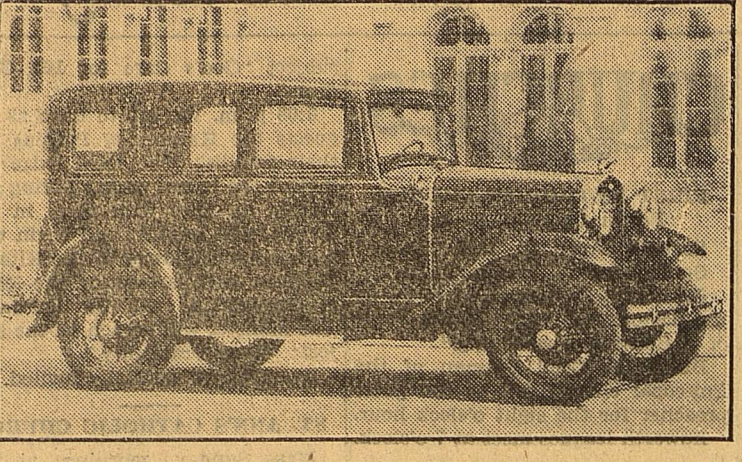
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New Ford Town Sedan

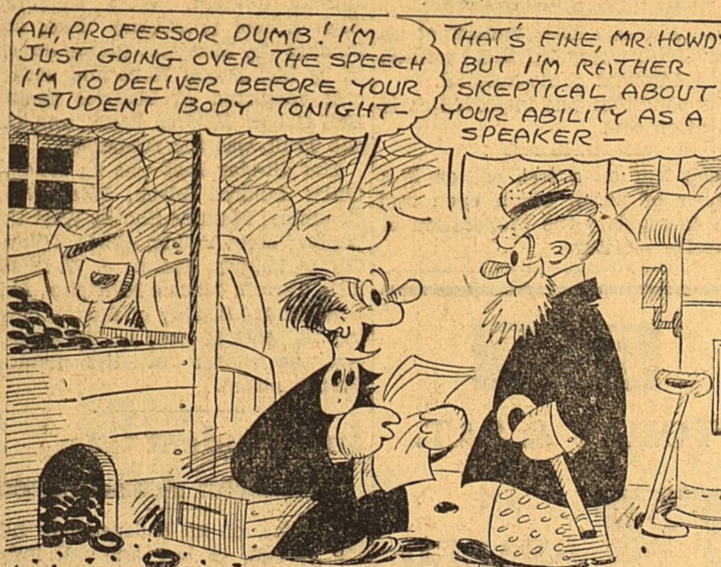
The above diagram shows how the three neighbors laid out their paths in such a manner that no path crossed another path.

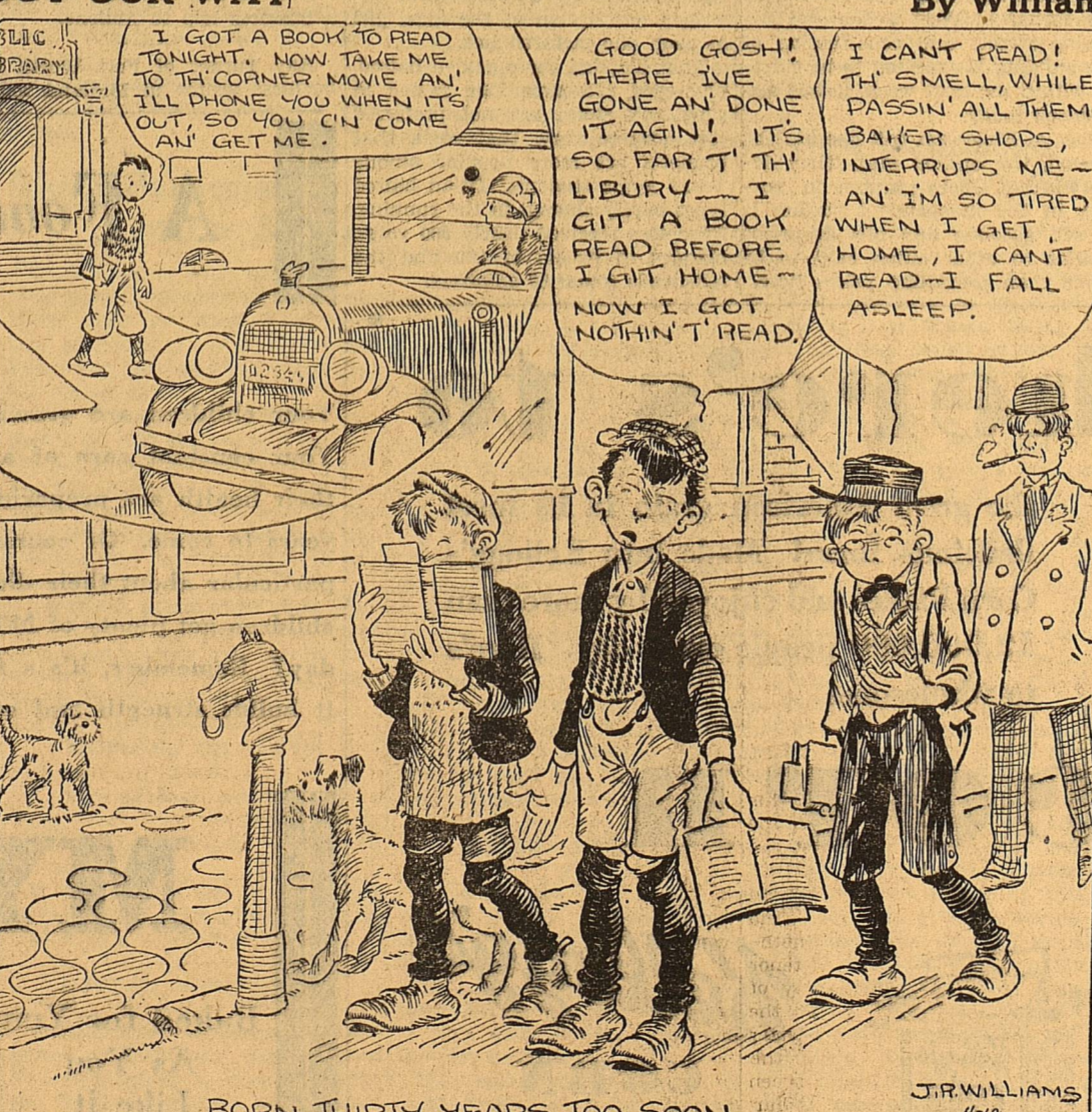

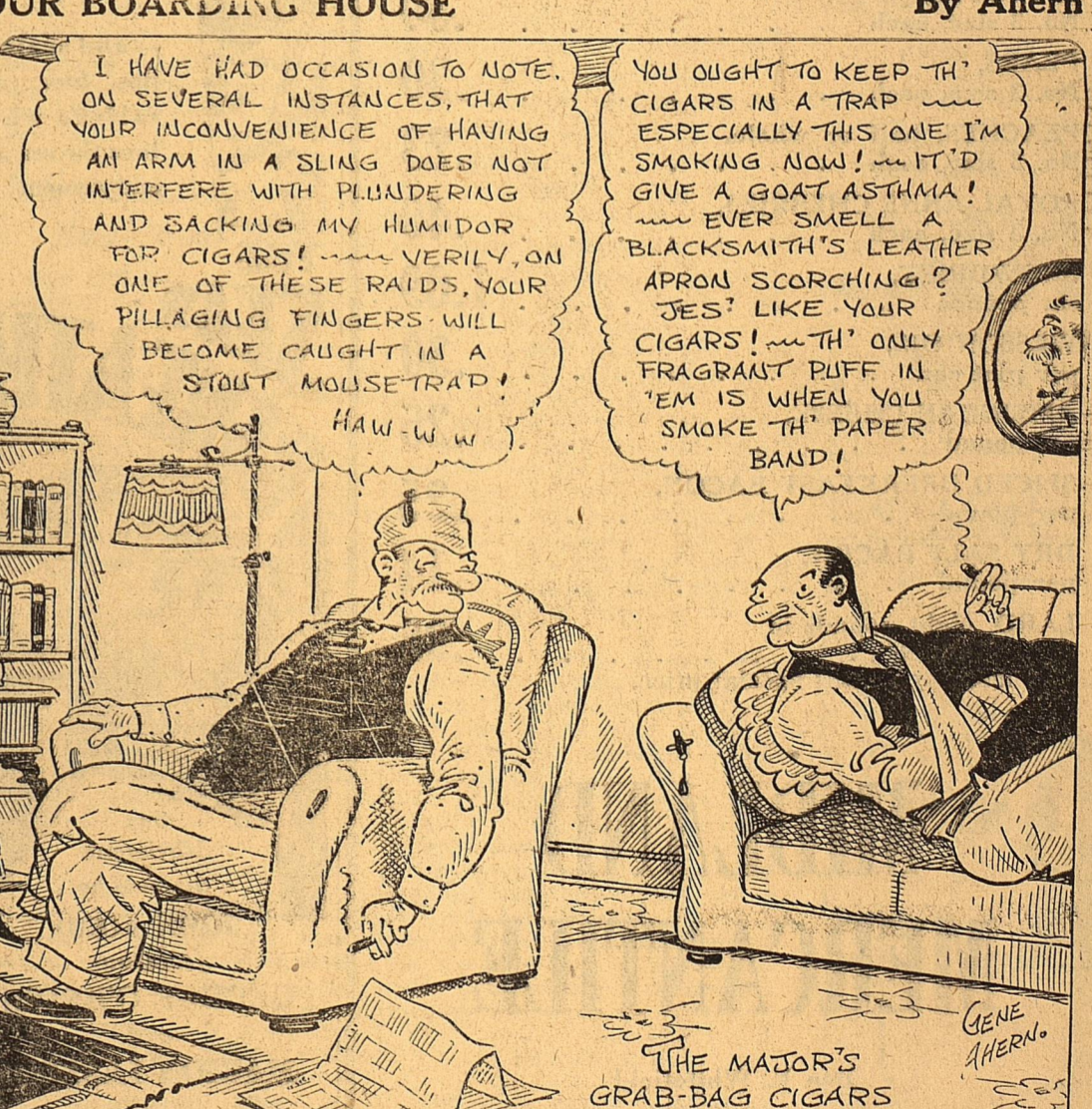



FOUR LEADERS URGE HOOVER'S RENOMINATION

WASHINGTON—The movement for renominating of President Hoover is beginning to take form. Four prominent Republicans, two of whom are not directly connected with the administration, have announced themselves in favor of entrusting the party banner to the president again.

They are Senator Moses, New Hampshire; W. Kingsland Marcy, New York state Republican chairman; James Francis Burke, Pittsburgh, and Postmaster General Walter Brown. They have not only pledged themselves to Mr. Hoover, but some of them have also urged the rank and file of the party to join in.

The airing of their views is being considered here in connection with Brown's return from a personal trip through the south, during which he is understood to have looked over the delegate situation with the next Republican national convention in mind. His reports were encouraging to the Hoover high command.

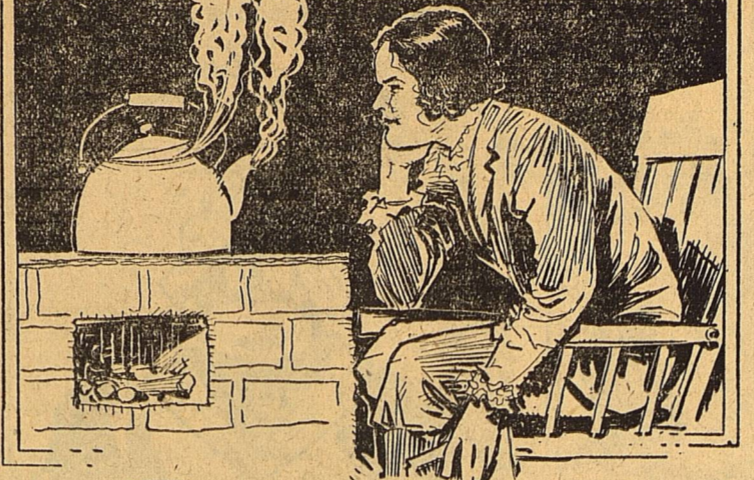
The plan is simple. Anyone desiring to send such a gift places his order with a member store who telegraphs it to a member in the desired city and the gift is then delivered by him.

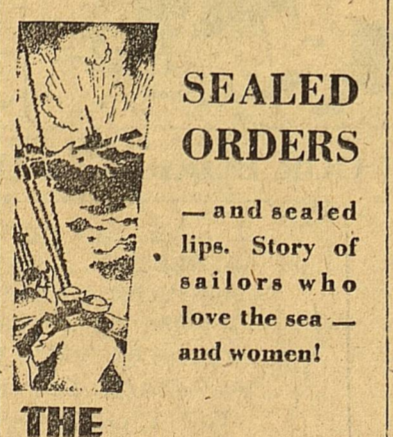
