

SENSIBLE RELIEF

President Roosevelt's action in ordering the prompt expenditure of \$75,000,000 to buy surplus farm products for the use of the needy seems to be one of the most sensible things he has done since he entered the White House.

It provides a way out of an exceedingly contradictory situation—a situation in which vast quantities of the raw materials for food and clothing were in the process of destruction at a time when millions of people had neither ning and enough to eat nor enough to wear.

It is an expensive action, of course; but in the long run the money should prove money well spent. So long as people are hungry and cold, the greatest conceivable waste is to throw away the materials that might feed and warm them. Even if it costs a good deal more than the announced \$75,000,000, this step is very much worth tak-
