

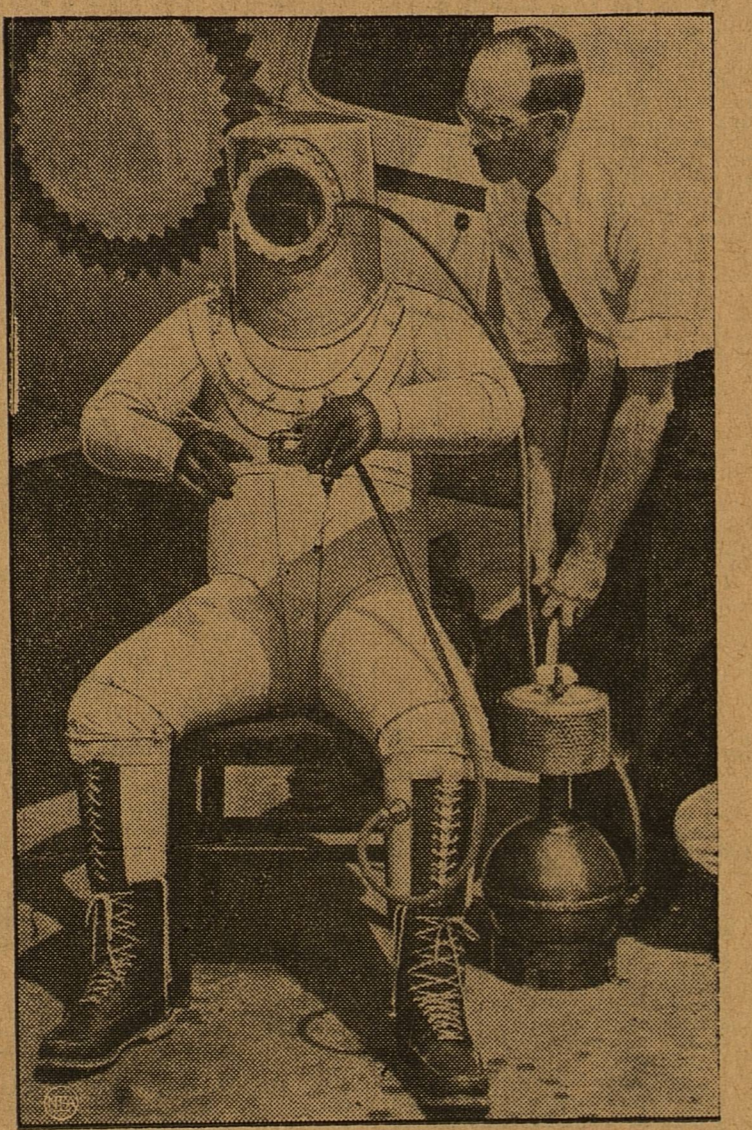


GOVERNOR PARDONS MILITARY GOOD



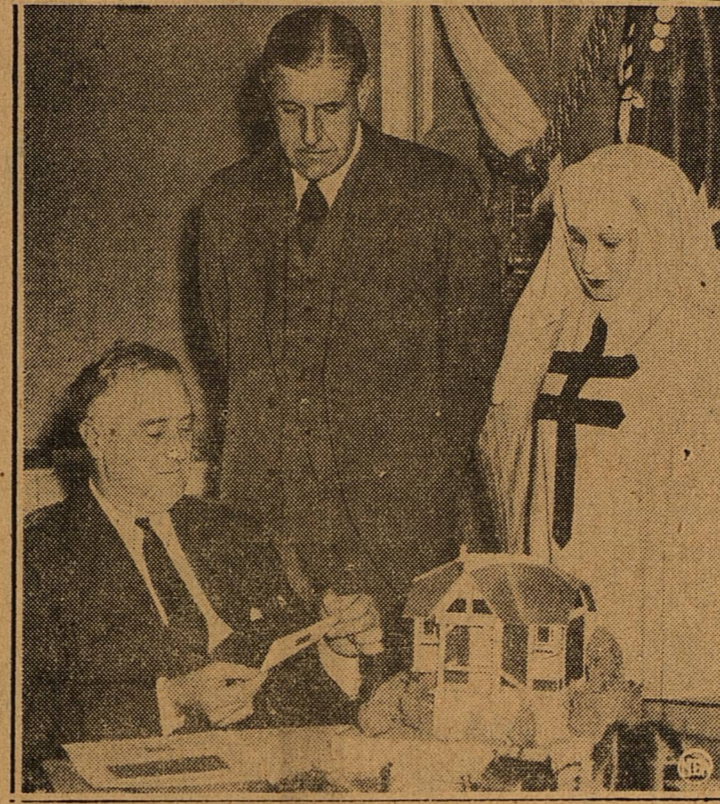
