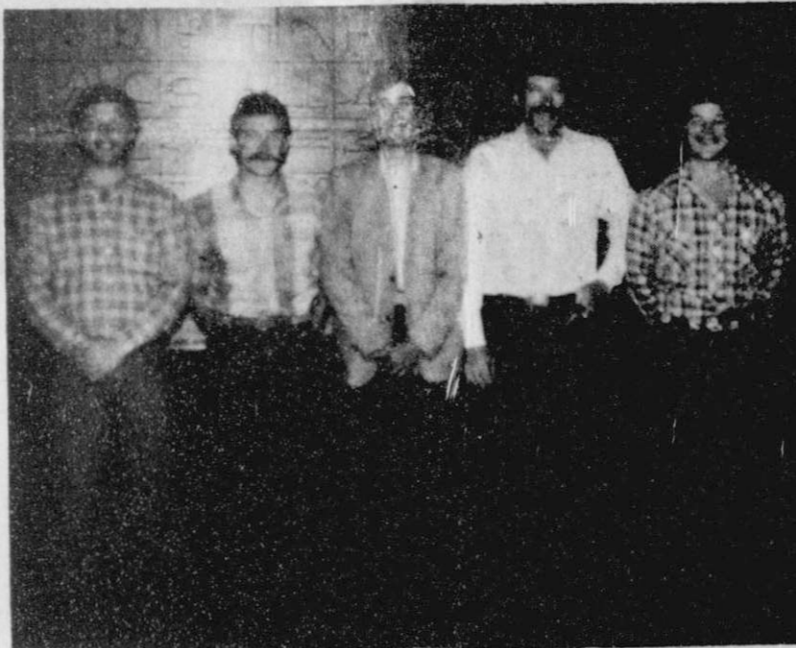

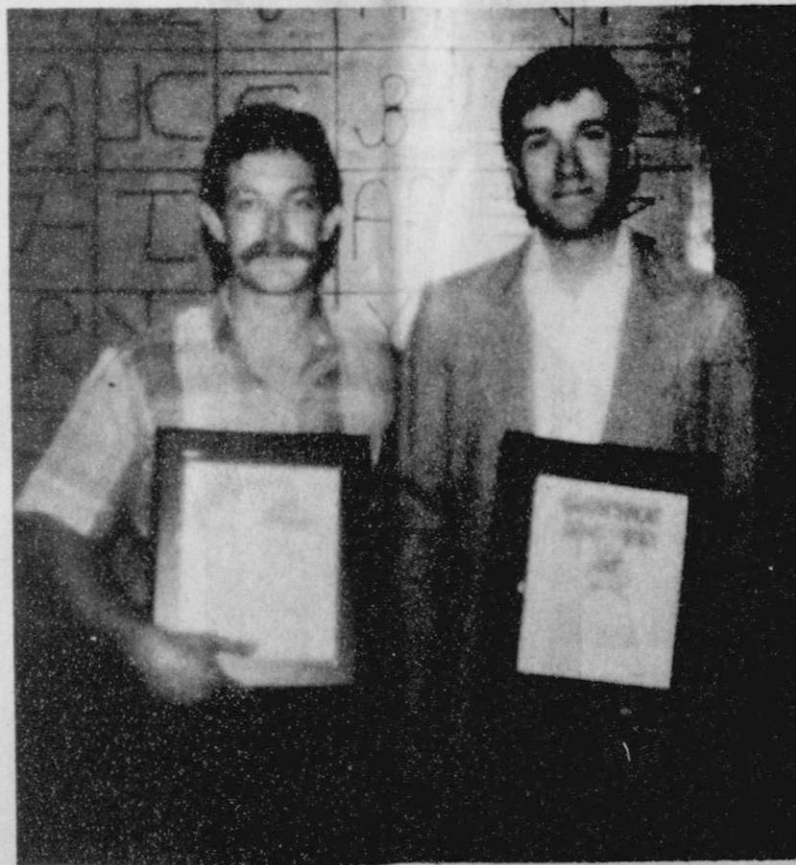

Monthly bills payable in the amount of \$792,780.86 and the current cash position were approved.

The meeting adjourned at 9 p.m.

"We are winning the fight," said Mrs. Harris. "Progress is being made but we've still got a lot more to do. I think our memorial program, remains a convenient and dignified way of turning losses into victories."

These patient services as well as education materials and of all types are just a few of the ways we can help."

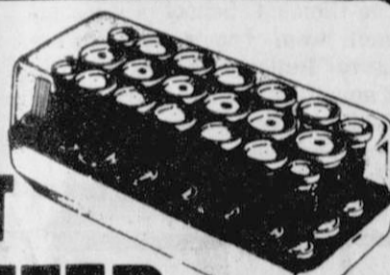

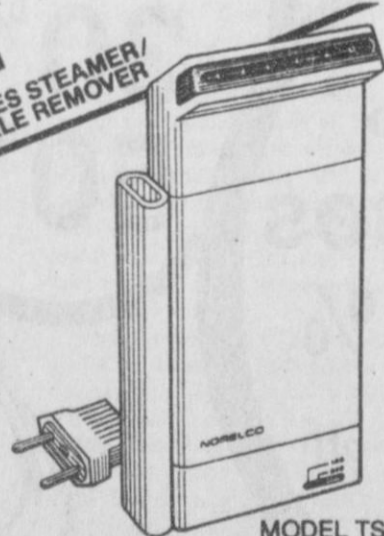

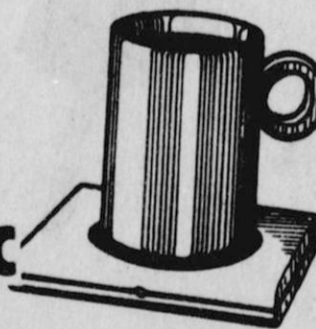
