

Election

Voters will decide on August 26th whether to authorize the Palo Duro River Authority to sell \$22.3 million in bonds to construct a new reservoir 10 miles north of Spearman, Johnnie C. Lee, the Authority's general manager, announced.

The Authority's board of directors set the election during a special meeting on Tuesday, July 22nd. The Authority covers Hansford and Moore counties and includes Spearman, Gruver, Sunray, Cactus and Dumas, as well as Sunnett in Hutchinson County.

The reservoir would provide water service and recreation opportunities in the Authority's district.

"The reservoir is needed to ensure that our cities have sufficient water resources for the future," Lee said.

"We currently get all of our water from municipal wells in the Ogallala Aquifer, but we anticipate that these wells will be depleted by the years 2000 to 2030," he said.

If approved by voters, the \$22.3 million in general obligation bonds are expected to be sold to the Texas Water Development Board at a fixed 7.6 percent interest, maturing over a 25-year period. This would cost property owners a maximum of 15 cents per \$100 valuation, or about \$75 a year for a home appraised at \$50,000, excluding exemptions.



Equal Access

Equal Access, a service that allows customers to "presubscribe" to the long-distance company they want to handle "1+0+" calls, will be available November 22 for customers in Spearman.

Equal Access also lets customers make long-distance calls using other companies serving the area by dialing their five-digit access code, plus one, plus the area code and number. Currently, customers not using AT&T Communications (AT&T-C) must dial a seven-digit local number and an identification code of up to seven digits just to connect to their company's network.

An information packet will be mailed to Spearman customers. It will include an explanation of Equal Access, a ballot listing long-distance companies serving the area and a

consumer checklist to help customers make their selection.

Customers who do not choose a preferred long-distance company will receive a second mailing. This packet will name the long-distance company randomly selected for them and include a ballot for customers wishing to change their assigned company. The customer notification process also will be supported by news releases and advertising.

"If all this seems like a lot of communications on a single subject, it is," said GTE Operations Manager Bob Meyers. "This is a major change in the way our customers place long-distance calls. We want to make the process as understandable and easy as possible."
