Lettermen and J.V. Players showing great promise include; Kevin Nelson, M. Parks, Matt Tucker, Tim Woolley, Mark Garnett.







Election

Voters will decide on August 26th whether to authorize the Palo Duro River Authority to sell \$22.3 million in bonds to construct a new reservoir 10 miles north of Spearman, Johnnie C. Lee, the Authority's general manager,

The Authority's board of directors set the election during a special meeting on Tuesday, July 22nd. The Authority covers Hansford and Moore counties and includes Spearman. Gruver, Sunray, Cactus and Dumas, as well as Stinnett in Hutchinson

County. The reservoir would provide water service and recreation opportunities in the Authority's district.

"The reservoir is needed to ensure that our cities have sufficient water resources for the future," Lee said.

"We currently get all of our water from municipal wells in the Ogallala Aquifer, but we anticipate that these wells will be depleted by the years 2000 to 2030," he said.

If approved by voters, the \$22.3 million in general obligation bonds are expected to be sold to the Texas Water Development Board at a fixed 7.6 percent interest, maturing over a 25-year period. This would cost property owners a maximum of 15 cents per \$100 valuation, or about \$75 a year for a home appraised at \$50,000, excluding exemptions.




