AMARILLO -- A Plainview firm, High Plains Pavers Inc., has been awarded the contract by the State Highway and Hansford--FM 760, from SH 51 to FM 759, 7.9 miles, \$40,660. Hansford--FM 520, from SH

Public Transportation Commission to perform the work of the Amarillo District 1979 Seal Coat Program. 207 to SH 136, 10.9 miles, \$55,075. Hansford--FM 2349, from the Sherman County line 6.9 miles

High Plain's bid of \$1,440, 530, was the lowest of five received by the Commission, including Interstate, U. S. highways, and Farm and Ranch to Market Roads. 
