Bid For Conservation Reserve Program Improved

Ante raised . . .

USDA 'reserve' acres increase

Thirteenth District Congressman Beau Boulter (R-13) said today that the US Department of Agriculture has upped the maximum per acre bid for the Conservation Reserve Program in North Texas and the Panhandle.

"The second sign-up period for the CRP is completed," Boulter said, "and the USDA has agreed to a \$40 maximum per acre bid for our region. That means we're going to see more program participation, which will be to the overall benefit of farmers and the conservation effort."

The Conservation Reserve Program, part of the 1985 Farm Bill, is designed to remove highly erodible land from production. The goal is to remove 40-45 million acres from production within the next five years.

During the initial sign-up period less than one million acres were placed in the program by farmers. Boulter, who said that the relative failure of the first

sign-up was due to "poor program administration and a lack of equity in the way bids were accepted," arranged a meeting in Amarillo with the top USDA officials and local farmers.

"Our district," Boulter explained, "was given a lower maximum bid price than similar areas in both New Mexico and Oklahoma. Needless to say, our farmers were upset, and they let the USDA officials I brought to Amarillo know about it. As a result, the producers I represent will receive \$40 per acre for qualified land."

The second sign-up period has seen a significant increase in acreage enrolled, with a total now reaching 3.8 million acres. Annual payments will be made to compensate farmers for retiring erodible land from production. Participating farmers will also be paid up to 50 percent of the costs of planting trees and grass on the acreage placed in the reserve.

Rains cause slight rise at Meredith

Lake Meredith is rising slowly from recent heavy rains on its Texas Panhandle-eastern New Mexico watershed with the depth at the dam pegged at 75.34 feet early Wednesday.

The slow rise -- about six inches in a week -- has reversed a trend. Lake Meredith has been dropping slowly from a 79.43 depth reading last October to a 74.78-foot level on May 29.

"The lake is up over six inches," declares John Williams, manager of the Canadian River Municipal Water Authority at Sanford. "It's not rising rapidly but the increase is a lot better than a 6-inch loss."

Fed by the Canadian River, the lake is located in southeastern Moore county and in Hutchinson and Potter counties.

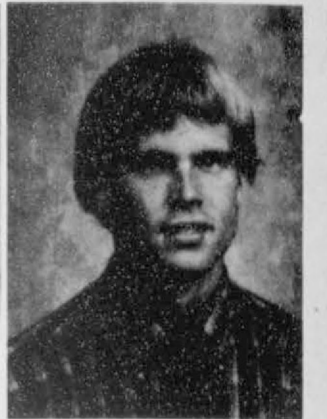

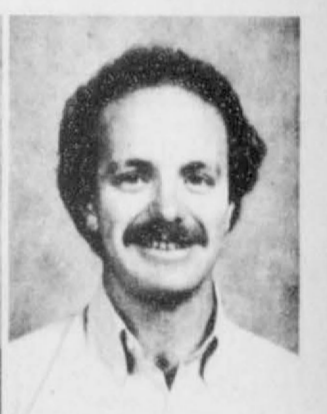

Classes**

Men! Do you want to achieve aerobic
fitness? Do you want to increase muscle
tone, coordination, and endurance?
Would you like to strengthen your
backhand in racketball? Then take
yourself to the Y.M.C.A. and join one of
the two aerobics classes offered to both
men and women.

The Total Fitness Class, taught by
Christy Brock, meets on Mondays,
Tuesdays, and Thursdays from 5:30 to
6:30 and Saturdays from 8:30 to 9:30.
This consists of a warm-up, a short
period of vigorous aerobics (mainly
jogging) a longer period of floor
exercises toning all parts of the body,
and a cool-down.

The T.U.F./Power Aerobics class,
taught by Wanda Archer, meets on
Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:30 to
7:30 and Saturdays from 9:30 to 10:30.
This is a new class to the Y.M.C.A. and
consists of a warm-up, approximately 25
minutes of aerobics (jogging, knee lifts,
kicking, etc.), then a dash to the fitness
center where 30 seconds of an aerobic
activity is alternated with 30 seconds of
lifting weights, using the machine. This
enables the working heart rate to stay
up for another 20 to 25 minutes, which
forces the body to burn fat for fuel.

The heart rate is carefully monitor-
ed during all phases of this class. The
last 10 to 15 minutes of the class are
upstairs again, where additional leg and
stomach toning exercises and a stretch-
ing leg and stomach toning exercises
and a stretching cool-down are used to
finish the class.

If you are a Y.M.C.A. member,
either/both of these classes are free. If
you aren't a member, each is \$20.00 per
month. You are welcome to visit either
of the classes to see if one of them is for
you.

Fitness Plus classes for women are
offered three different times: from 8:30
to 9:15 A.M. (taught by Judy Davis) on
M,T,W; Th, F; 12:05 to 12:50 noon
(taught by Stephanie Crossland) on
M,W,F; and from 4:15 to 5:00 on
M,W,F; taught by Wanda Archer.
These are Dance Aerobics and are lots
of fun without seeming like exercise.
Nevertheless, they are good exercise.
They use simple choreographed routines
for the aerobic phase and the
classes also have floor routines for
additional toning.

...or someone who is just wanted for unauthorized use of a vehicle, Larry Wayne Alfred is sure attracting a lot of attention from several Texas police departments.

Alfred, 25, allegedly stole a 1984 Mazda pick-up in Corpus Christi in April.

However, that might be the least of his problems.

Corpus Christi police detectives would like to talk to Alfred about the December 8, 1985, murder of Leo Cantu during an armed robbery.

And Beaumont police detectives would like to question Alfred about the March 30 armed robbery at a local convenience store where the clerk was shot in the leg.

This week Alfred has been added to the Texas Most Wanted list. A reward of up to \$1,000 is being offered by the Governor's Office for information leading to Alfred's arrest.

Alfred is described as a black male, 5-8, 160 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes.

The warrant charging Alfred with unauthorized use of a motor vehicle was the result of a complaint filed by the Blinking Caution Lites company of Corpus Christi. Alfred, an employee of the firm, allegedly took a company truck

to Portland, Texas, on April 28 and never brought it back.

At the time of the theft, Alfred was being investigated by Corpus Christi detectives for Leo Cantu's murder.

Investigators say Cantu and his wife had driven to a car wash around 10:30 p.m., when they were suddenly confronted by two armed black men. The offenders forced the couple back into their own vehicle and had them drive to a downtown Corpus Christi restaurant, where Ms. Cantu was an employee.

The gunman ordered Ms. Cantu to open the restaurant and the safe, then tied her hands and feet and left her in the office.

Cantu was taken as a hostage. His body was found about an hour later near the city landfill. He had been shot several times.

The Beaumont convenience store clerk was much luckier, receiving only a leg wound in the March 30 robbery at the Market Place #3 store. Investigators say an armed robber entered the store and ordered the clerk to get on the floor. When the clerk refused, the offender aimed a .45-caliber automatic at the employee's chest and squeezed the trigger.

Fortunately, the weapon misfired. When the gunman fired a second shot, it hit the clerk in the leg.

Bob Bullock's Tax Information

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said Friday that a roundup of delinquent and inactive taxpayers in April netted more than \$9.1 million in back taxes for the state.

Last month Bullock refused to hand out new sales tax permits to some 150,000 businesses that owed taxes or failed to file reports last year. Of the taxpayers who lost their permits in April, Bullock has reopened the accounts of 18,787 taxpayers who have settled their debts.

"We let folks know that if they wanted to do business in Texas, they had to hold a new permit. And we weren't issuing permits to tax delinquents until they paid what was due. I guess they knew we were serious. We have \$9.1 million in the bank to prove it," Bullock said.

Besides the delinquent taxpayers who paid up, another 300,000 taxpayers with clean records received new permits. The remaining taxpayers who failed to file returns or reported no sales during 1985 are considered to out-of-business.

"Sometimes businesses fail, but the owners forget to tell us so we can take them off the books. Besides the money we picked up from back taxes, we're saving the state another \$250,000 each year in paperwork, processing and postage on those 134,000 dead accounts," Bullock said. "I've got to declare this project a success."

Bullock reminded consumers to be on the look out for the new red, white and blue permit and "b aware of who you're doing business with." Businesses not displaying the new permits are operating illegally, he said. The money collected in back taxes has been placed in the General Revenue Fund.
