## Halifax Resolutions Day

The first American colony to make a formal declar tion in favor of separation from Great Britain was North Caroina--on April 12,1776 .
North Carolina's resolution was highly influential in bringing about the American Declaration of Independence at the Continental Congress three months later, on July 4, 1776.
North Carolina had scted to organize a militia and create a provincial council, and committees of safety had been set up in the various districts when a British force under Sir Henry Clinton went south to subdue the colony early in 1776 .
The British called on loyalists in North Carolina (they were considerabie in number) to gather and
