A list of highly erodible soils was recently released by the USDA Soil Conservation Service as mandated by the Food Security Act of 1985. The list revealed that all land in Hansford County is highly erodible.

The conservation compliance provisions of the Act denies most USDA farm program benefits to farmers who farm highly erodible land unless the land is being farmed in accordance iwht a conservation plan approved by the local Hansford Soil & Water Conservation District.

The Act allows a grace period for those who are not using a conservation plan. They have until January 1, 1990 to develop and begin actively applying a plan. They have until January 1. 1995 to have the plan fully in effect,

The provisions will have no effect on farmers who are using up-to-date conservation plans. If you are farming highly erodible land with a conservation plan, check with the Soil Conservation Service office in Spearman to find out if it meets conservation compliance provisions.

"We are ready to help anyone perpare a conservation plan that doesn't have one", Monnie Edwards, district conservationist for the SCS said. "We will do our best to try to

"In the past, the New Year holiday is usually the most deadly period we have on Texas streets and highways'', stated Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety. "There are several reasons for this, but the main one is the fact that this is a celebrated holiday and much of that celebration includes alcohol", Major Cawthon

Many people have the misconception that as long as they remain under the legal limit of intoxication, they are not impaired as drivers. "Nothing could be farther from the truth. Even small amounts of alcohol begin to slow a persons ability to make quick,

accurate judgements and reduces their reactions, both of which are vital to the safe operation of a motor vehicle", Major Cawthon said.

Each year over 25,000 people are killed by the drinking driver nationwide. In Texas, at least 551/2 of the fatal accidents are alcohol related.

Once again, your Department of Public Safety troopers will be highly visible with all available troopers working this holiday. They will be trying to remove as many intoxicated drivers as possible to make our highways a safer place. Please don't drink and drive. Together we can make this a happy New Year for all.

There is probably no other holiday that gets people in a more festive spirit than Christmas. With all the gift shopping, holiday music, and the excitment of having the family all together, it's no wonder why this is a favorite holiday among Americans.

But for some Texas families, this will be a special holiday, one to be remembered forever. Not because it was such a good time, but because they have lost a friend or loved one in a traffic accident.

Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety stated, "Last year 15 people lost their lives on Texas streets and highways during the Christmas holidays. This was with the holiday period falling during middle of the week. This year however, most Texans will have four days off during this holiday, so the potential is there for a more deadly period."

"Historically, speed and the drinking driver have been responsible for most of these holiday fatalities," Major Cawthon added. Each year roughly 20,000 people die in this nation because of speeding, and that many or more will be directly or indirectly related to alcohol. Once again extra D.P.S. troopers will be on the roads watching specifically for these and other traffic violations to keep the road a safer place for you and your family.

Please don't become one of this year's highway death statistics. Slow down, don't drink and drive, and make sure everyone is buckled up.


