Lynx Upset Dalhart

Spearman's Lynx thrilled a large basketball homecoming crowd Friday night by soundly trouncing the Dalhart Wolves 61-51 in Lynx gym.

The Lynx played superb basketball all the way, fought off two Dalhart surges to keep the lead and never did come apart as they have done in other games this year.

Dalhart had the lead only one time, right at the beginning of the game when Bob Cunningham made one of his many free shots to give the Wolves a 1-0 lead.

Jim Kirkland erased that lead with a long outside shot and from there the Lynx were the leaders. At one point in the second quarter, they stretched the lead to 14 points, then saw it shrink to four in the third quarter.

The Lynx managed to stave off the Wolves and build the lead back out to seven at the end of the third quarter. The quarter scores were 18-7, 34-22, and 47-40.

In the fourth quarter Dalhart chopped the lead to two points but a three point play at the foul line sent Spearman well out in front again. Spearman hit a free shot, then missed on the second one. Ronald McDonald beat the taller Dalhart Wolves on the rebound and stuffed the ball in for two more points.

In the closing minutes Spearman started stalling the ball and Dalhart started fouling. The defensive tactic failed as the Lynx hit the one-and-one free shots regularly.

After getting the ball following the free shots, Dalhart could not score and Spearman recovered the rebounds to put on the stall again.

Spearman's basketball squads crowned themselves a King and Queen, then proceeded to whip both Dalhart teams Friday night with some great basketball.

Two seniors received the royal honors from the two teams.

This year's Basketball Queen is Miss Phyllis Patterson, the Lynxettes' leading scorer for the past three seasons, and holder of numerous all-district and all-tournament honors over the years.

The new Basketball King is Bob Phillips, one of the Lynx' top scorers and rebounders this year. He is also president of the Student Council.

The teams elect a king and queen from members of the two teams. The Lynx elect the queen and the Lynxettes elect the king by popular ballot.

Attendants this year were Lynda Lesly and Jim Kirkland, and Johnie Jo Vernon and Larry Butts.

Cheerleaders presented each of the Lynxette attendants with

a bouquet of red roses. Then Bob was presented with a jeweled crown with which he crowned the queen before presenting her with a bouquet of red roses also.

The king and two Lynx attendants each earned a kiss from the bouquets of roses.

The crowning took place in the middle of the basketball court with members of both teams forming an honor guard. This annual ceremony was witnessed by the largest crowd of the season.

Last year's king and queen were Jim Kirkland and Sharon Close.

Chamber Manager Don Floyd said the banquet will stress the work the chamber has planned for the future instead of past accomplishments.

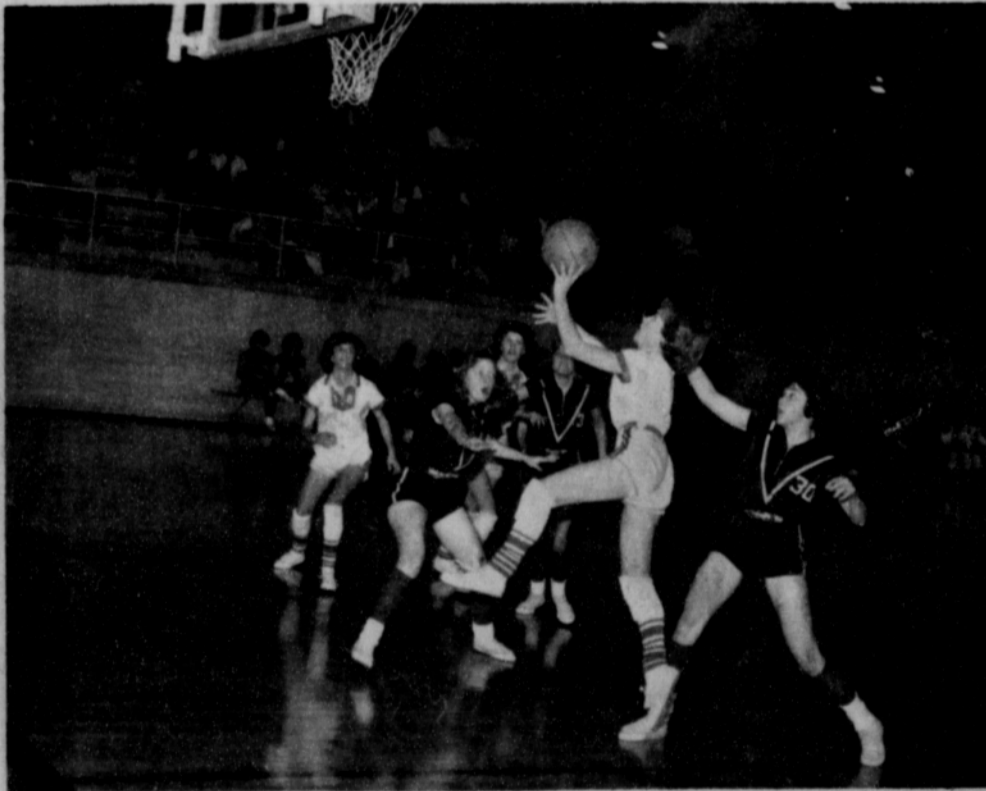
Hallmark Is Appointed to 5 Committees

Lynxettes Whip Dalhart Girls; Patterson Scores 36 Points

The Queen of the Spearman High School Basketball teams led the way Friday night as the Lynxettes mopped up the Dalhart girls 70-31.

Senior Phyllis Patterson, playing her last regular home game of a four year career, was magnificent as she hit 11 field goals and 14 free shots for 36 points, four more than enough to beat the Wolves.

The nets were not getting cold when Patterson was not shooting or riding the bench. The other four forwards pitched in 36 points.

The second senior on the

squad and Patterson's scoring mate for three seasons, Vicki Wilde, ran into foul trouble and left by the foul route early in the second half.

Johnie Vernon, the third senior forward was the second high scorer with 12 points.

Coach Dean Weese used his entire squad and the guards sewed up the Dalhart offense, allowing them only five field goals.

Dalhart got 21 free points as Spearman committed 25 fouls. Guard Robbie Ownbey found herself in foul trouble and left the game after five miscues.

Lynn Shultz had 16 for Dalhart and one other player hit two points for all the Wolves' scoring. Although Cunningham had a great night, he could not carry the load alone and he missed numerous shots when his guards kept him outside and forced him to rush his shooting.

Jim Kirkland, playing with a bad leg, Callaway, Phillips and others gave the Lynx good work on rebounds.

Larry Butts came alive to produce the points expected from him this season on driving lay-ups and shots from the outside. He also hit seven free shots to make him the scoring leader with 17 points.

Jim Kirkland thrilled the big crowd with some fine outside shooting. He hit six field goals and made one free shot for 13 points.

Five other Lynx got into the scoring columns with four or more points and this wide scoring threat was too much for the Wolves' two-man attack.

Spearman broke the Wolf full court press with little difficulty, then reversed the press and forced Dalhart to give up the ball on numerous miscues, walking, too long getting across the center line and bad passes.

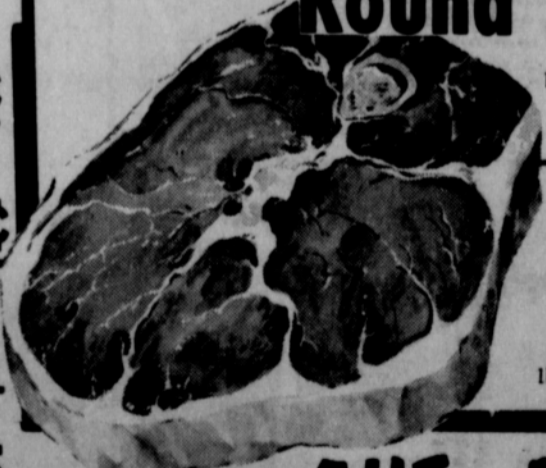
