





A REQUEST TO THE PRESIDENT AND TO CONGRESS

Human Life Amendment to the Constitution to protect all persons born and pre-born

WHEREAS child-rearing is the God-given responsibility and privilege of parents, not the

WHEREAS child-rearing is the Godgeter responsibility of the government, and
WHEREAS Federally-controlled Early Child Development Programs empower the government to choose the ideology by which young lives are molded,
THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that pre-school child development programs shall be
controlled by the private sector, giving parents freedom of choice over the physical and
philosophical environment of their children.


