## June sales tax rebate up for Spearman

Friday, August 12, State Comptroler Bob Bullock sent checks otaling $\$ 103$ million in local sales tax payments to 974 cities
the one-percent sales tax.
"So far this year, we are just a Bullock said. "This is about where we expected to be by this time when we put out our revenue for the state.
Seven of the 20 cities that collect the most local sales tax--Houston, El Midland and Tyler-continue to lag behind last year's receipts, But heAugust payment to all seven showed they had gained ground since last.
These checks of were for taxes
collected on sales made in June and reported to the Comptroller by the
end of July.
The City of Spearman received a check for $\$ 27,968$. 38 for this period which is up $\$ 2,857.30$ from the check 1982. While this monthly total is up. 983 payments to date are $\$ 135.296 .41$, which is off 2.68 from the 1982 payments of $\$ 138,993.02$ for the same period. Gruver continues to have a rise in heir rebate, recoiving $\$ 7,101.87$ for $\$ 5,926.68$ in 1982. Their total peyments to date this total peyments to date this year are
$\$ 26,985.12$ up $22.34 \%$
over last years payments for the same period of $\$ 22,057.06$.
