# School bells will ring Thursday as first 83-84 classes open

Bells will begin ringing throughout halls of Spearman schools Friday morning as the community's youngsters return to classes for the first day of the new school year. The first bell will ring at 8:15 and the tardy bell at 8:25.

Last week, new students transferring into Spearman High School and Elementary School registered. Kenneth Friemel, Spearman Junior High School principal, has asked all junior high students new to the district to register at the school Monday through Thursday, with Thursday the main day.

Registration for all other high school and elementary students will be held Thursday. At the elementary school, regular registration will be held Thursday for kindergarten through fourth grades from 8:30 a.m. until

10:30. Thursday high school registration will be--seniors at 8:30 a.m., juniors at 9:30 a.m., sophomores at 10:30 and freshman at 11:30.

At the junior high, a general assembly will be held in the auditorium beginning at 8:20 Friday morning, then students will be sent for pre-enrollment to their homerooms. A short schedule of classes will be held at the junior high that first day.

Teachers meanwhile will be reporting for inservice on Monday at 8:30 a.m. and spend the entire school day in in-service here. On Tuesday, the teachers will attend a joint inservice in Perryton for the entire school day. On Wednesday they will be back in their respective schools for individual building inservice and will have

a work day on Thursday in their respective classrooms.

The office of Superintendent James Cunningham reminds new employees to check with his office concerning required personnel records. And new employees who will be driving school buses were required to attend driver certification sessions, while those requiring refresher driving courses attended sesssions on Aug. 17 and 18.

# June sales tax rebate up for Spearman

Friday, August 12, State Comptroler Bob Bullock sent checks totaling \$103 million in local sales tax payments to 974 cities that levy the one-percent sales tax.

"So far this year, we are just a little ahead of 1982 payments." Bullock said. "This is about where we expected to be by this time when we put out our revenue for the state.'

Seven of the 20 cities that collect the most local sales tax--Houston, El Paso, Beaumont, Odessa, Abilene, Midland and Tyler-continue to lag behind last year's receipts. But theAugust payment to all seven

collected on sales made in June and reported to the Comptroller by the end of July.

The City of Spearman received a check for \$27,968.38 for this period which is up \$2,857.30 from the check for \$25,111.06 for the same period in 1982. While this monthly total is up. 1983 payments to date are \$135,296.41, which is off 2.66 from the 1982 payments of \$138,993.02 for the same period.

Gruver continues to have a rise in their rebate, receiving \$7,101.87 for the June sales as compared to \$5,926.68 in 1982. Their total payments to date this year are

In our neighboring county of Hutchinson Borger sales tax is off 20.80% for payments to date, while Fritch, Sanford, Stinnett all report increases. Fritch is up 10.20%. Sanford up 22.37% and Stinnett up 20.48%

In Ochiltree County, Perryton's city tax rebute is off 29.06 percent for the year. In 1982 their payments to date were \$562,609.32 and in 1983, they received \$399,109.43.

Canadian, which has been a boom town as far as oil industry is concerned the past several years and experienced new growth, is also hard hit. Their receipts to date for this vear are \$120,261.66. off 38.04% from the \$194,095.97 received for the same period last year.



# Spearman band selling pizza

Mama Mial--Spearman High School Band is going into the pizza business.

Lynx band members, including the rifle corp and flag girls, Spearman Band Boosters, and other interested persons met with Band Director Pat Daniels and his wife in the band hall Tuesday evening to consider a fund raising project for the band.

Dan Keating, vice-president of marketing for Perry County Cheese Co. of Reynoldsburg, Ohio, treated the gathering to fresh, cooked-on-the-spot samples of pizza. Keating described his company's fund raising program which he said was designed specifically for school bands and choirs, by people who understand band and choir fund raising problems.

He explained his company's name is somewhat misleading as it really sells pizzas and not cheese, marketing the pizzas through fund raising programs of high school band and choirs.

Keating said his company's product is unique in the fund raising field because "it is the only product on the market that can be sold to the same people on a regular basis."

He explained by saying that when a person is approached by a young band member who rings his doorbell and tries to sell him something as a fund raiser for the band, usually something of token value, the customer feels bad, no matter what he does.

He said that if the customer bought the product, he reaction tended to be, "You did it again. You're just a sucker for a soft touch.

And if the student fund raiser is refused, the customer accuses himself -- "Poor little kid it wasn't her for his fault St. ... trying to help out her band."

Keating then added that the pizza sales plan is different because it is not sold door-to-door and it offers a quality product at a bargain price, a price that makes it a bargain even to people on limited income and a tight food budget.

The program calls for the Lynx band students to sell the pizzas in do-it-yourself at home packages so customers make the pizzas themselves to their own tastes, using ingredients supplied by the company.

> There are three different kinds of packages, or kits, which the company will ship to the band students in Perry County Cheese refrigerated trucks, Keating said. One is a pepperoni kit, one is a sausage kit and one is a cheese kit, he said.

In addition each kit contains the already shaped crusts for six 211/2 ounce pizzas, a bag of sauce, and cheese. The pepperoni kit offers 12 pounds of pepperoni, and the

sausage an equal amount of sausage. The cheese kit offers no meat but 21/2 pounds of cheese rather than the usual 11/2 pounds of cheese that comes in all kits. Customers can order extras, or may add their own ingredients, Keating said.

The band buys the kits for \$10.95 and sells them to customers for \$14.95, which means the six pizzas in a kit each cost the customer about \$2.49, depending on whether they add extra ingredients or not.

Keating stressed the customers will be making fresh pizzas, not frozen ones, although they can make them up all at once and then freeze them, if they want to.

Although band students are responsible for selling the pizzas, "we insist kids do not go door-to-door," Keating said. He gave each of the band students a present a card, and asked them to list names and addresses and phone numbers of 12 people they know.

They turned in these cards Thursday, and from these a master list is to be drawn up, Keating said, and sent to Perry County Cheese. The company will then send each prospective customer on the list illustrated information on the pizzas and the program, with the name Spearman High School Lynx Band prominently printed on it.

After the prospective customers have had time to read up on the pizza program, the band students then call by phone and take orders from those that want to buy, Keating said. The orders are sent to the company, which in turn sends the pizza kits in refrigerated trucks to the school. The students then distribute the kits to the customers


Keating said Spearman High School band is the first in the Panhandle -- and all West Texas to sign up for the pizza fund raising program, although the program has been a success in other states and in East Texas, and is beginning to expand into West Texas.

The pizza sales will be sponsored by Spearman Music Boosters and Keating urged the parents to get involved and set up an organization that would make the sales a big success.

Daniels said they wanted to start the fund raising sales early so that they could take advantage of the company's truck passing through enroute to El Paso.

# Officers chase local speeders, thief leaves trail of potato chips

On August 13, 1983, at approximately 5:50 p.m. an officer was advised of a fight in progress at a Spearma residence. Officer responded to the call and advised the Spearman Police Department dispatcher to call for a backup. Two officers resonded.

At approximately 5:52 p.m. an officer arrived at the scene and met with two subjects. One subject advised that a female subject had come to the residence and broke the window out in the front door and then had gone to the kitchen and broke the window out of the back door and then proceeded to the Weat bedroom and tore the gun rack off the wall. She then grabbed an unloaded shotgun and pointed it at him and the other subject.

Subject advised that he and the other subject then grabbed the female subject and took the shotgun away from her and pushed her out of the residence. Subject advised that he did not want to file charges at this time, but he wanted the officers to advise the female subject not to come back or she would be placed under arrest for criminal trespass.

On August 13, 1983, at approximately 10:50 p.m. an officer observed a vehicle west bound on Kenneth. The vehicle failed to make a complete stop at the flashing red light. At this time, the officer activated his emergency lights and proceeded after the vehicle. The vehicle stopped on South Highway 207. The driver was identified. observed what appeared to be a carton of beer in the sack. Upon further examination by the officer. the sack was found to contain two cartons of beer. One was full and the other had two full cans inside. The officer discovered two full cans that were open on the passenger front side. Upon talking with the subjects it was discovered that all subjects were under age. Subjects were advised to be in court Monday. August 15, 1983, to appear before the judge.

On August 14, 1983, at approximately 2:00 a.m. a Police officer was was parked in his unit watching traffic, when a vehicle traveling west on Kenneth entered the Crazy Corners intersection, disregarding the red flashing light and proceeding West on Highway 15 at a high rate of speed. At this time the officer began chasing the vehicle with beacon lights and siren on.

This chase continued west on Highway 15 and when the officer passed the intersection of Highway 15 and FM 2378, the officer called for a unit from Gruver for a backup because the vehicle the officer was chasing was a good 2 miles ahead of the patrol unit. The officer saw the tail lights disappear when the vehicle went into Old Hansford Canyon.

The officers continued the chase until meeting with the Gruver unit. Officer at this time returned Old Hansford Canyon. Officers started searching the area for the vechicle

feet of another subject. Officer that a vehicle matching the description was west bound at his location. The officer advised the Gruver unit to stop the vehicle. At this time the officers proceeded to the Gruver unit location.

> Upon arrival, Gruver unit advised the officer that this subject had stated he was asleep at Old Hansford and the sirens had awakened him. At this time the officer went to the front of the subjects vehicle and felt for heat from the hood and found that the hood was not very warm, as it would have been if this vehicle had been involved in the chase. At this time the officers released the vehicle and returned to Spearman and continued patrol.

On August 14, 1983, at approximately 8:40 p.m. a officer was dispatched to a Spearman residence in referene to a disturbance. The officer arrived and was met by 2 complainants One stated that while she was at the residence, she had been kicked in the upper portion of her back next to her right shoulder. She then signed a complaint against a subject for assualt. Complainant advised that subject was very intoxicated.

Officers went to the subject's residence and informed him that he was under arrest for assualt. Subject was arrested and transported to the Spearman Police Department. Subject appeared before the judge and then released on a P. R. bond, and advised to appear in court August 15, 1983.

On August 14, 1983, at approximately 10:56 p.m. an officer observed a vehicle turn off Kenneth onto Main. At this time the officer observed the vehicle swerving side ways and when the driver corrected the direction of the swerve, the vehicle would swerve the other direction. At this time the officer gave chase after the vehicle, catching up with the vehicle at Highway 15 East and Main, at this time the officer activated the beacon lights and the vehicle sped away, entering the crazy corners intersection dodging vehicles that were already in the intersection and proceeding West on Highway 15 toward Gruver. The officer chased the vehicle with the beacon lights and siren on to the intersection of Highway 15 and FM 2387 where the vehicle turned North still at a high rate of speed. The officer chased the vehicle 81/2 miles to where the vehicle turned off onto a country road and proceeded North for 2 miles and then turned East for 1 mile and crossed a cattle guard and proceeded East for nearly 3 miles in a pasture road. The officer, along with 3 others followed this road until the road came out on FM 760 and at at this time lost visual contact with the vehicle. At this time the officer and all other patrol units proceeded back to Spearman, except 2 units from Gruver which were coming up Highway 207. Upon arrival at the Police Station, 1 county unit reported that he spotted this vehicle and was chasing it. After giving chase for a long period of time, the vehicle finally stopped at Highway and FM 1261. The vehicle was identified. Subject was arrested and transported to the Spearman Police Department. Upon arrival at the Police Department, subject admitted that he was the person that out ran officers to avoid gatting a ticket. Subject was issued 4 citations and advised to meet with the judge on August 15, 1983. On August 15, 1983, at approximately 8:30 a.m. the Spearman Police Department received a call in reference to a burglary at the City Hall. Officer arrived and observed the South West window of the building had been broken out apparently with a board 2"x4"x3'. Observation by the officer disclosed that the board way lying on top of an air conditioner approximately 31/2' above the ground positioned in an East-West direction. The board was 10" inside the window. Glass distribution was mainly outside the building with a small amount of glass directly inside the window with small fragments about the room in an approximately 4 foot radius.

The officer could not determine the position of the person[s] involved. Officer was advised by two employees, that nothing was missing at this time. The board was taken as evidence and pictures of the scene were taken by the officer.

On August 15, 1983, at approximately 8:45 p.m. the Spearman Police Department received a call in reference to a theft. Officer arrived and was met by the complainant. He advised the officer that sometime between 6 p.m. on Sunday, August 14, 1983 and 5:30 a.m. Monday, August 15, 1983 that someone had taken a Whirlpool dryer that was sitting on the South side of the residence. They dryer was sitting be a washer which was still there.

Officer did check and observe some tire tracks going up to the South side of the residence, but due to the fact that people had been walking around the area, any other evidence was destroyed. Officer was advised that Friday or Saturday an older model vehicle pulled up to the house. The vehicle was discribed by the complainant. Case still under investigation.

On August 17, 1983, at approximately 10:25 a.m. an officer was advised of a damaged gas meter. The officer arrived and was advised by two city employees of the damage to the meter. Observation of the area revealed that the regulator was on the North side of the meter and that a subject who was identified, was operating a tractor and mower in that area and had been in the general area of the gas meter, but revealed no evidence of anyone mowing in that area. The attempt to remove the gas meter revealed that the top of the meter would have to be replaced.

On August 17, 1983, at approximately 9:11 p.m. the Spearman Police Department received a call in reference to a burglary at a Spearman residence. Officer arrived and spoke with the complainant, who advised that someone had gotten into their house and ransacked the bedrooms and had gotten into the icebox. Another officer was dispatched to the residence. Complainant advised the officer that some items were removed from the icebox but nothing was taken from the bedrooms. Officers observed that some of the items from the icebox were found outside, laving on the back porch and underneath a window. Upon observation it was noticed that two screens had been taken down and that a window had been opened. Officers observed the back gate open and asked the complainant if the gate had been shut, he advised he thought it was. Officers serched the alley and found a bag of potato chips. Complainant advised the officers of two subjects that were last see at the house before they had left. The names of the subjects were given to the officers. Complainant advised that he would not file charges.
