The stones here are fiom the casing of a 200 foot well dug by hand to supply water to the town.
The erection of Official Texas Historical Markers is part of the five-year program of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee to record, appreey history in Texas (RAMPS), These markers are designed to interpret the history of an area or site, and are sponsored by he state or through counties. ities, civic clubs, local roups or individuals.
