
Nearly 75 percent of adults believe that breastfeeding is the best way to feed a baby according to a nationwide survey released last month by US

Surgeon General C. Everett Koop. The results of this survey affirm the efforts of La Leche League International, a support group for breastfeeding mothers founded 30 years ago this month. Fewer than 25 percent of new mothers were breastfeeding their babies in 1956 when La Leche League began. La Leche League's impact has spread beyond the U. S. Many of our field offic es have worked directly with La Leche League Groups on the national and local levels... UNICEF itself has learned much from La Leche League's approach." Ms. Cravero continues by mentioning 'the high-quality cooperation that La Leche League International organization with affiliates in over 43 countries."





Well here I am again I keep thinking I will get back to trying to keep you posted on what is going on at our Golden Spread Center. But the weeks seems to be only two or three days long.


