### Business Seminar Scheduled

AUSTIN--Amarillo area businessmen will have the opportunity to invest a few hours of their time with a profitable result December 14 at Amarillo College.

The Advisory Council on Small Business Assistance will sponsor a "How to Do Business with the State of Texas" seminar at the College Student Center. The seminar, coordinated by the Texas Industrial Commission and the Amarillo Chamber of Commerce, will alert area businessmen to the opportunities available by doing business with the state. There is no registration fee.

Procurement specialist from at least ten state agencies will be on hand for individual consultation with businessmen following the morning workshop session. Among the agencies represented will be: Texas Education Agency, Texas Department of Public Safety, Texas Department of Mental Health & Mental Retardation, Amarillo College, State Building Commission, West Texas State University, Texas State Technical Institute, Department of Welfare, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

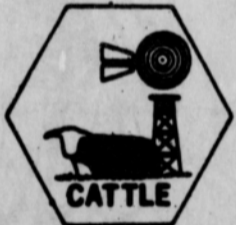

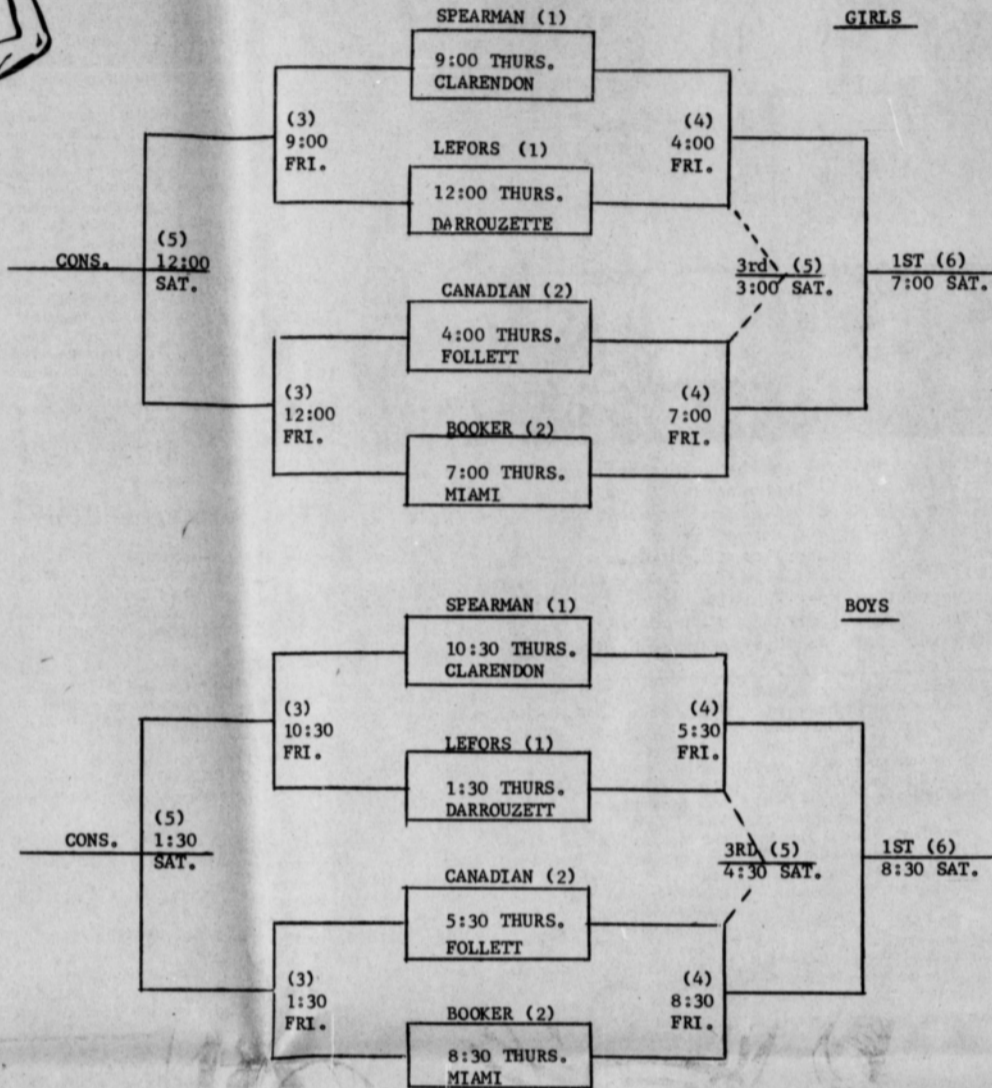

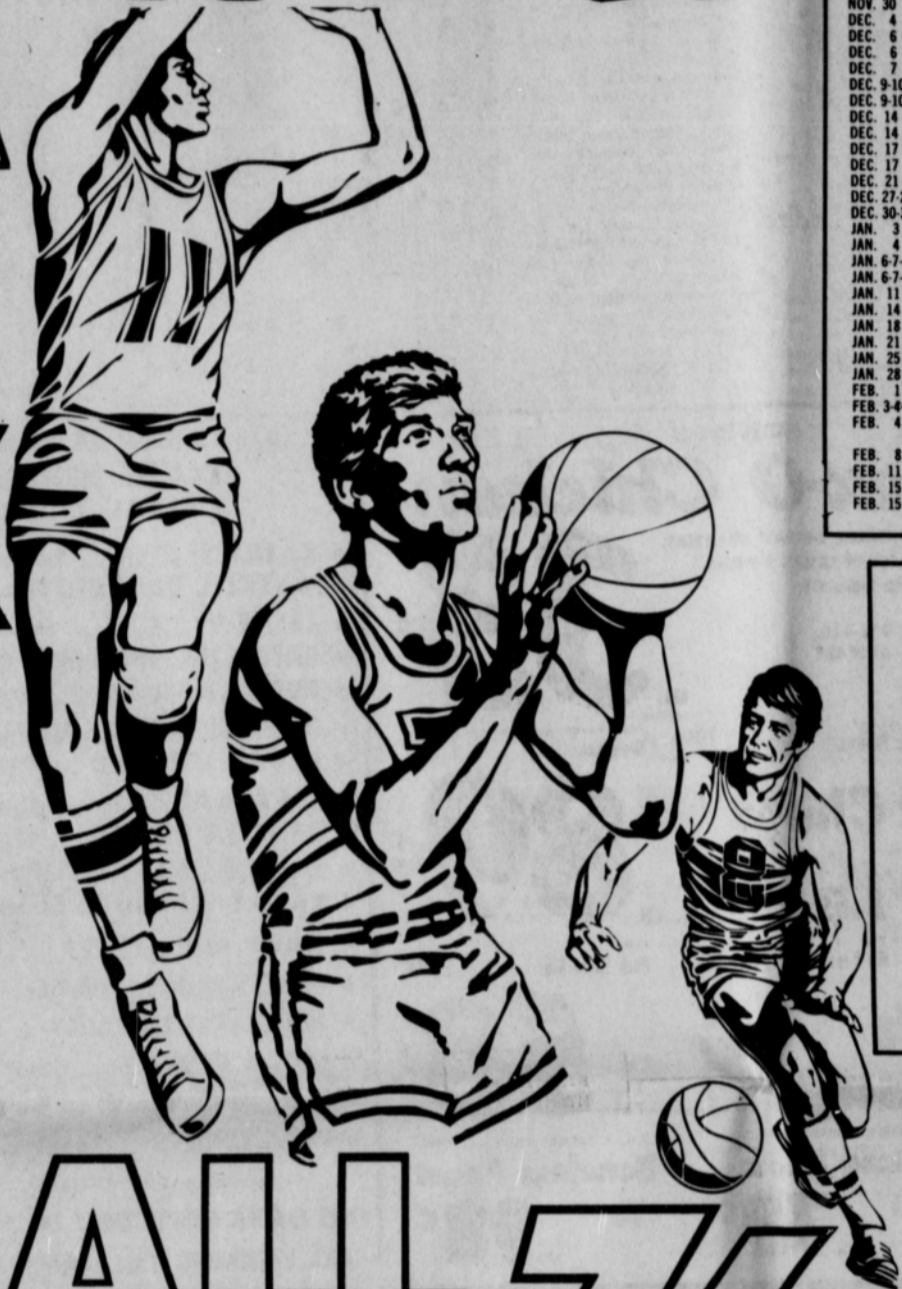

**It's Not Too Late To Mail Early**

"It's not too late to mail Christmas mail early," the Postmaster stated Tuesday. Christmas parcels to distant states should have been mailed by December 3rd. The Postmaster urged parcels for nearby states be mailed before Tuesday, December 14th and greeting cards not later than December 17th for before-Christmas delivery. After these dates, air mail and/or priority are the only way to assure delivery before Christmas.

The Postmaster gave some tips to insure speedy delivery at Christmas and to be followed throughout the year--

1. Correct and complete mailing address to a street number and/or post office box to eliminate misdelivery.
2. Write the address as legibly as possible. Be sure to always include the correct ZIP Code.
3. Complete return address of the sender be included on the

outside of each piece of mail. 4. Parcel shipping container should be of fiberboard and sealed with reinforcing tape with all flaps firmly secured. 5. If two or more items are enclosed in one carton, some type of good cushioning material should be used to protect all items from contact with each other.

6. All packages containing delicate articles should be cushioned adequately and marked FRAGILE.

7. Insurance should be taken on all parcels.
