Gruver Man Hansford Sheriff Named Director

Dies In One Truck Crash

A tragic, apparently unavoidable accident five miles west of Spearman on Hwy 15 claimed the life of a Gruver man, Robert William Bates.

Bates was dead at the scene of the one-truck accident apparently from injuries received when the semi-trailer-tractor rig overturned at least twice.

The truck hit a calf in the road and Department of Public Safety Officer Max Gunn said preliminary investigation of the mishap indicated the calf was already dead when struck by the moving truck. Veteran's News

Some delays in marking the graves of veterans with government furnished monuments have been traced to the use of outdated application forms bearing Department of Defense or Department of the Army addresses, according to a Veterans Administration official.

Veterans Service Officers and cemetery and funeral directors are urged to use VA Form 40-1330, "Application for Headstone or Marker," when assisting the next-of-kin after the death of a veteran, said Donald L. Wardle, VA Monument Service director.

The correct address for the completed VA application is: Monument Service (42), Veterans Administration, 810 Vermont Ave., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20420.

Although responsibility for the marker program was transferred to VA from the Army in 1973, many applications are still being sent to DOD or Army for processing.

Wardle said the resultant administrative delay can be reduced by discarding all DOD and Army monument applications and by mailing the proper form to the VA.

A supply of VA Form 40-1330 may be obtained from the nearest VA regional office or by writing Monument Service at the above address.

Newly developed hearing aid filters out background noise

Copley News Service A new-generation hearing aid that automatically filters out the noise of the modern world may allow millions of hearing-impaired people to listen to and comprehend speech.

The new device, which doesn't look much different from other hearing aids, was described by Dr. Robert E. Sandlin, a clinical audiologist and speech pathologist, and Jorgen Heide. an engineer who helped develop the

Sandlin, who has been evaluating the device, said he was "pleased with the results we have seen

Using new electronic and computerbased circuitry, he said, the aid can automatically--no need to tune up or tune down--reduce background noise and thus make speech more understandable.

"This is significant," he said, because a common complaint among hearing-aid users is that they cannot hear someone speaking to them when there is competing background noise, such as in an office or restaurant."

The problem is not unimportant, Sandlin said. More than 16 million Americans, he said, are affected by a hearing loss that is sufficient to require hearing aids.

'Therefore, the impact of new technology on this population is significant," he said.

In brief, Sandlin explained, the device can reduce automatically the background noise in a loud situation so that the hearing-impaired person can hear what his partner is saying. Then, he said, the aid can, without any adjustment, make a whisper sound like a whisper in a quiet conservation.

The small unit, which can fit into the ear or behind it, accomplishes this feat through a compact system that involves a microphone, an amplifier, a receiver and a loudspeaker that eventually connects with the nerve endings of the inner ear, which in turn sends the sound signals to the brain.

The system, developed by Telesonic Inc. of San Francisco, centers on the amplifier, according to Sandlin. The basic idea was proposed, he said, by a San Diego engineer, Hyman Goldberg of Dyn-Aura Engineering Laboratories, which now supplies the equipment to Telesonic

Heide, also an engineer, said the device copies the functions of the human ear through a system of electronic gates and compressors.

These components, Sandlin said, can either modulate excessive sound or allow normal sound to be heard more clearly without the need for adjustments that are common to some existing hearing aids.

Once the new aid is set at a comfortable level for the individual patient, he said, there is no need for further adjustment.

The device, Sandlin cautioned, has its limitations. It does not meet the needs of all hearing-impaired people. "We're not that clever yet," he said.

Its main use, he said, will be for people with moderate or mild hearing losses.

That, however, he said, includes the majority of people with hearing






