recived last week by Hansford County extension servico office headed by Burt Williams. Grain sorghum producers har vested a 1984 crop which was
ranked the fifth largest in Texas however, irrigated production was the highest in the state. Corn growers had the ninth
largest crop listed in the state wide largest crop listed in the state wide
report. The year 1984 was a good year
for all crops in Hansford County. The first fall freeze was earlier than normal but did not cause the widespread damage experienced in
> The harvest by Hansford grain sorghum. producors was the largest irrigated crop in the state's history.
