If you can't do the time, don't do the crime here!

That is what Sheriff R. L. McFarlin says to would be law breakers. "If you can't do the time, don't do the crime!" The sheriff is going to crack-down on law-breakers and make it more difficult to break the law in Hansford County.

Last week was a busy week for Sheriff McFarlin and his deputies. Sheriff McFarlin announced the following alleged criminal cases in Hansford County.

Chris Schneider, Age 27, charge: Burglary, unlawful delivery; burglary of Callaway Lumber Co., \$1000 cash; Taylor Petroleum \$700 cash; Bunkhouse on Main Street in Spearman \$540 worth of merchandise, clothing and boots; Blackburn Flower Shop \$25.00. These burglaries were allegedly committed between the months of July through January of this year.

Chris Schneider, Age: 27, Charge: Burglary/unlawful Delivery; Bond \$30,000.00, Subject still in custody.

Dirk Umphress, Age: 20, Charge: Delivery Controlled Substance; Bond Denied, Released to Hutchinson County.

Leslie Williamson, Age: 23, Charge: Delivery controlled substance; Bond \$30,000.00 Possession of Marijuana, subject out on bond.

Rhonda Buster, Age: 28, Charge: possession of controlled substance. Bond \$30,000.00, Subject out on Bond, Elaine Fite, Age: 26, Charge: Delivery of controlled substance, Bond \$50,000.00, released to Hutchinson County.

Immunization

Crime in County decreasing

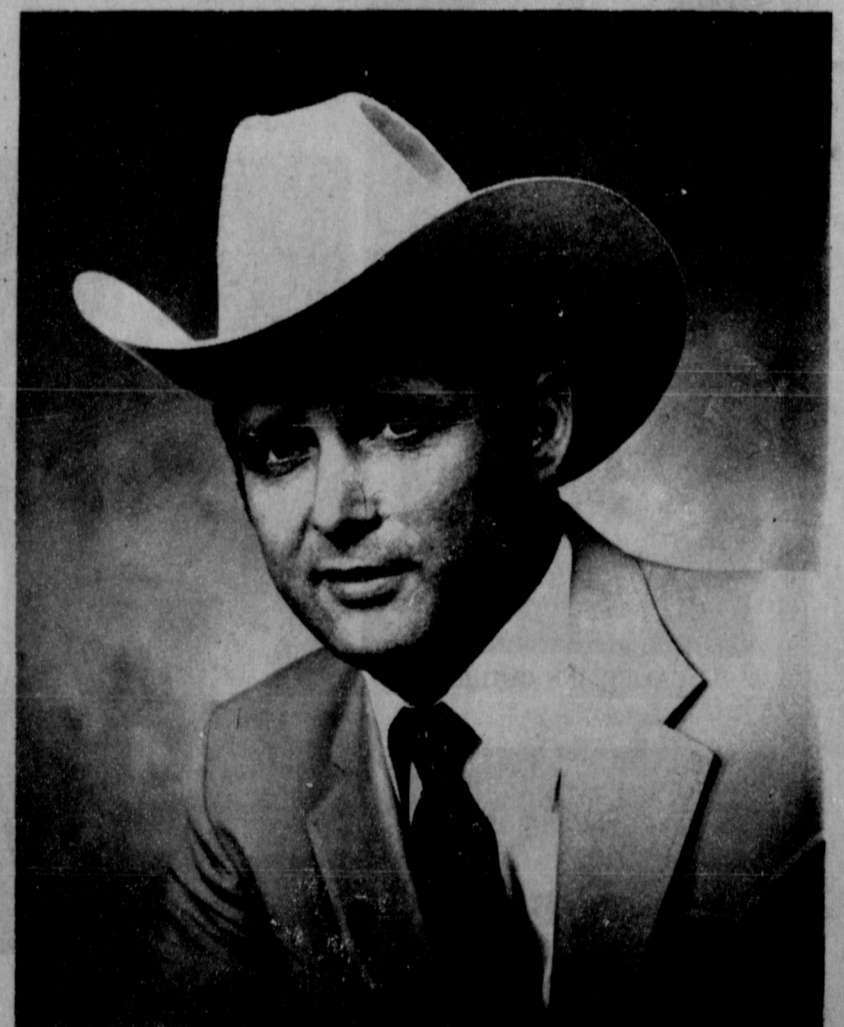
Incidence of crime in Hansford County decreased during the year of 1986, with burglary continuing to be a major problem along with alcohol.

While Spearman and Gruver, and all of Hansford County appear to be somewhat free of major crimes such as murder, arson, and rape, stealing is still somewhat of a problem as well as "drinking" booze in the public areas. In gauging our crime index in the county, the public has nothing but praise for our sheriff and his deputies. No murder or rape has occurred during the calendar year 1986.

Sheriff says no to parole!



R. L. MCFARLIN

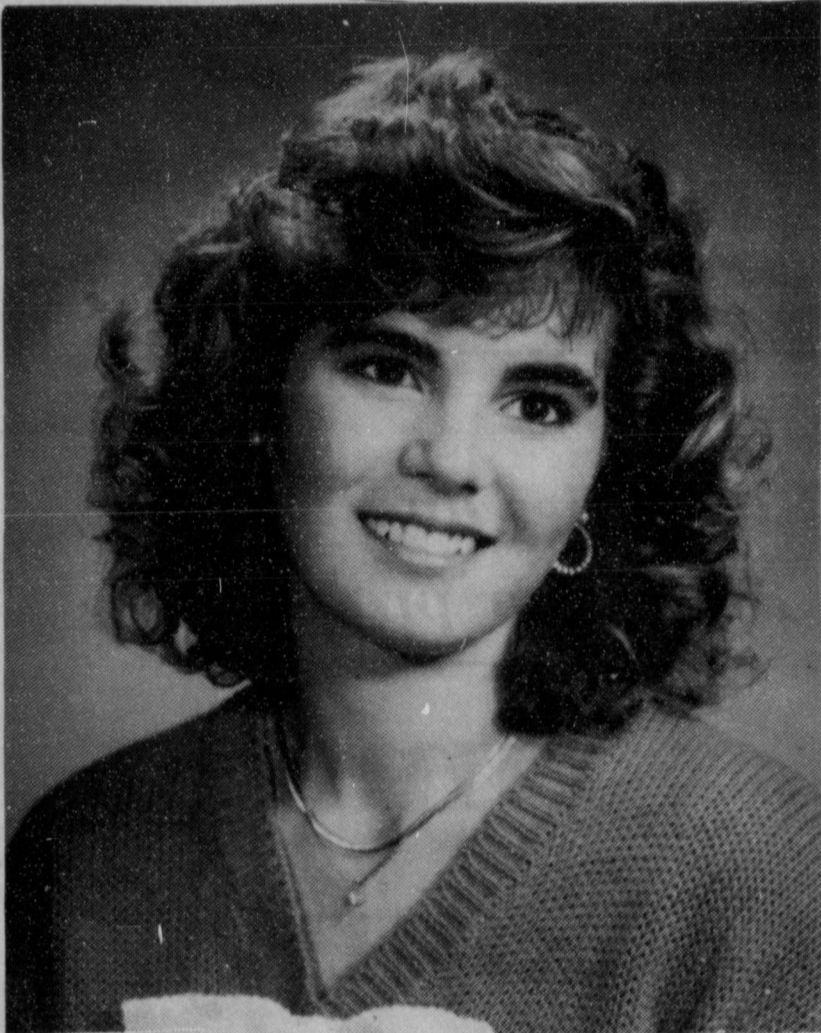
Sheriff R.L. McFarlin still says "no" to parole for John L. Grissam, who is serving a life sentence for the murder of Mickey Westerfield of Gruver. The sheriff stated "I cannot believe the federal court is still taking such frivolous law suits." It is my contention that 22 years in the pen, does not pay "his indebtedness" to society and the Westerfield family. Most of the entire county stands behind Sheriff McFarlin in his statement to keep this man behind bars. McFarlin went ahead to say "if this suit is intended to get me to change my mind -- the courts are just wasting their time!"

John L. Grissam filed suit in U.S. District Court in Amarillo seeking \$5 million dollars from R.L. McFarlin, Jr., in using his job as sheriff to exact revenge against Grissam because the man he killed was McFarlin's uncle.

The suit went ahead to say, that McFarlin is using his office to deny Grissam parole as "a personal vendetta and not based on any form of justification or rehabilitation standard."

Grissam also charged that McFarlin's stance violated his right to fair review of the facts in his case.

February 3, 1987 - Municipal, school and other political subdivision elections. First day to accept applications for absentee ballots to be voted by mail (Sec. 84.007, V.T.C.A., Election Code).

February 16, 1987 - Municipal elections. Last day to post notice of ballot position drawing if drawing is to be conducted on February 19, 1987.

February 18, 1987 - Municipal, school and other political subdivision elections. Absentee voting clerk may begin mailing absentee ballots to applicants as soon as the ballots are ready on or after this date (Sec. 86.004, V.T.C.A., Election Code). Municipal elections. 5 p.m. - deadline to file application for a place on the ballot. Last date to order election.

Other political subdivision elections. Last day to order election, unless otherwise provided by law [Sec. 3.005, V.T.C.A., Election Code].

February 19, 1987 - Municipal elections. Recommended date to conduct ballot position drawing (Sec. 52.094, V.T.C.A., Election Code).

February 23, 1987 - Municipal, school and other political subdivision elections. Last day to notify election judges of their appointment if they were appointed, as recommended, on Feb. 2, 1987.

March 2, 1987 - School elections. (at least 72 hours before ballot position drawing) Last day to post notice of ballot position drawing if drawing is to be conducted on March 5, 1987.

March 4, 1987 - School elections. Midnight - deadline to file application for a place on the ballot.

March 5, 1987 - Municipal and school

elections, and elections ordered by county commissioners court. First day of period during which notice of election must be published. **School elections.** Recommended date to conduct ballot position drawing.

March 16, 1987 - (19th day before election day) Municipal, school and other political subdivision elections. 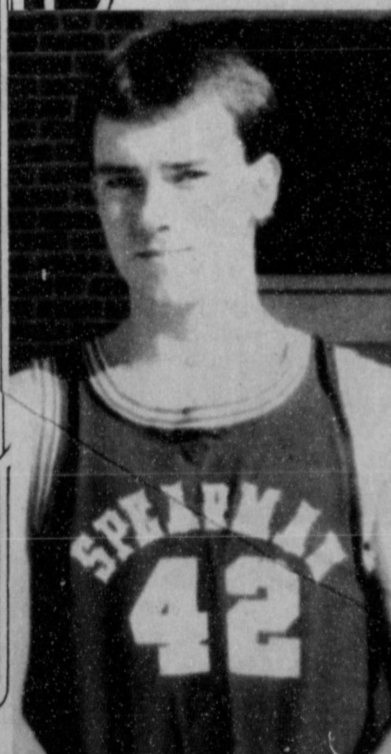

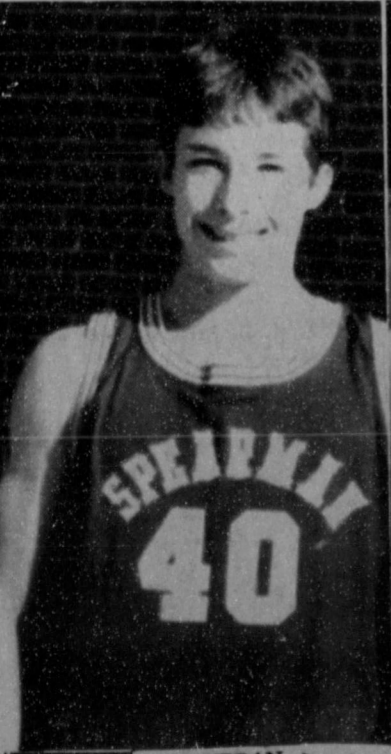
