land wheat bearing out predictions similar to Hansford: hardly any dry land wheat will be harvested. In both Hansford and Potter, harvest predictions for any dry land cutting is eight to ten bushels per acre.

In contrast, Potter County irregated wheat is estimated at a 35 bushel per acre harvest. No estimate will be made for Hansford until after June 15.

The story was pretty much the same over the central and western part of the Texas Panhandle.

To the east, things were a bit more optimistic. It appears--barring further destructive weather--Gray County will harvest its dry land wheat looking for a 15 or 18 bushel per are average. Predictions for irrigated wheat in Gray are about average: 30 to 40 bushels

per acre. Wheeler County, further east, is another story. There is very little irrigated wheat planted there. What they have in Wheeler is expected to make as high as 45 bushels per acre. But, of 61,000 acres planted, most is dry land crop. If no further destructive weather hits Wheeler, dry land wheat should make up to 14 bushels per acre on the "low end" and as high as 25 bushels for most of the crop.

The interesting point here is that the top end of Wheeler dry land wheat harvest is expected to fall only five bushels short of the low end of Gray's irrigated harvest--without the cost of

Despite the isolated spots of optimism for the dry land wheat harvest and pretty good looking irrigated crop acreage over most of the Texas Panhandle, no one expects, at this point, for High Plains growers to have a part in the predicted record wheat harvest predicted for


Library Display Of The Month






