Spearman Aids Disaster Area

Emergency supplies donated by Spearman residents as well as other communities in the Panhandle helped relieve the needs of the victims of the Wichita Falls tornado disaster. A team from Spearman drove a large truck and a van to the devastated area and spent the weekend distributing clothing, food, and bedding to victims of the tornado.

The Seventh-day Adventist Church had set up a distribution center in the heart of the ravaged area where thousands of victims received clothing and other items. "Many of those who came for help cried openly as we told them the items were

tree because of donations made by friends in other parts of the state," says the pastor Franklin Horne. "The generosity of the local people have helped heal a little of the hurt caused by the killer tornado," said Horne. The Spearman Red Cross who organized the local drive for supplies was

responsible for sorting, boxing, and buying a lot of the needed supplies. Many local residents worked many hours preparing these supplies for shipment to Wichita Falls. Each of those who spent time in the tornado area are now better prepared if any disaster hits our local area.

The Texas Athletic Dealers Association has named Scot Martin of Spearman High School as the recipient of their Scholarship Award this year.

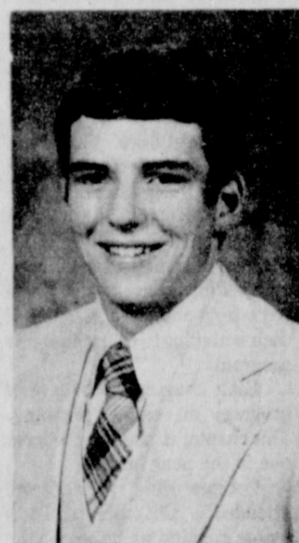
The award will be given to Scot at the Hall of Honor Luncheon to be held in Fort Worth Saturday, July 28 at 12 noon.

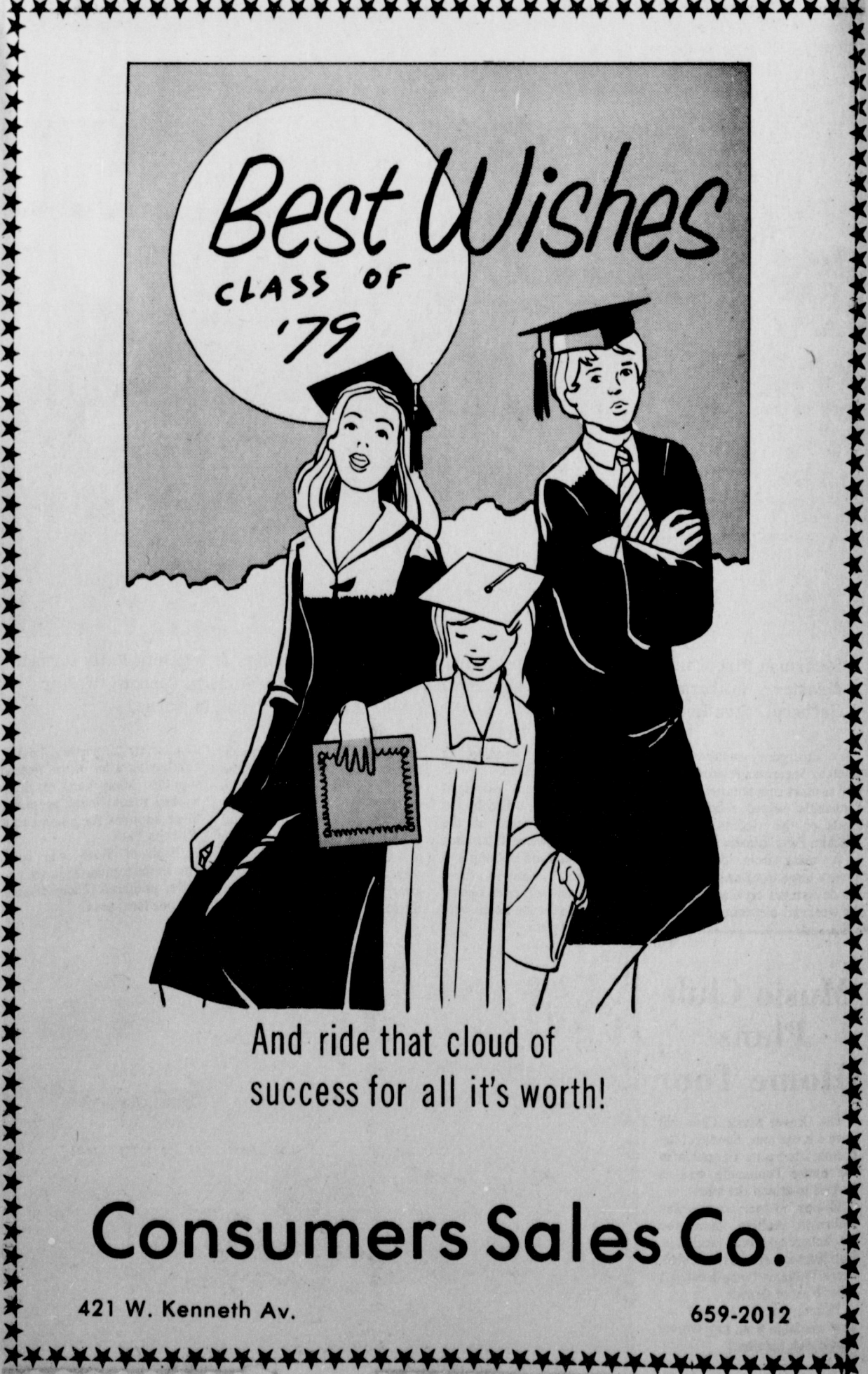
