# CRAZY DAY IS BIG SUCCESS

## Jack Frost Hits Area Crop Damage Light

Spearman and Hansford County got its first nipping cold front of the new fall season this week. The opinions as to the damage to crops vary.

The official low temperature in Spearman Friday morning was 33 degrees, as recorded by the Weather Bureau thermometer at the Pat Cates residence.

At the Northern Natural warehouse two miles west of Spearman the recording thermometer there registered 30 degrees for about 15 minutes just before sunrise Friday morning.

Frost damage to grain sorghum is varied according to different reports.

A check with elevator men in Spearman say some farmers are reporting some damage and others say they did not find any damage in their milo.

Some cotton and soybeans were reported nipped by the frost.

There was reports of the foliage on the maize being hurt by the frost, but the farmers said they would have to wait to see if the heads and stalks were damaged.

Some milo is already coming to the elevators, but much of the late crop is needing another two weeks of warm weather before a killing frost.

# Farmers Union Will Meet In Abilene

Texas Farmers Union is expecting a large attendance at its Sixty Second Annual State Convention in Abilene at the Windsor Hotel on November 4th, 5th, and 6th. The many new county Farmers Union or-

ganizations in the rolling plains area within easy driving distance of Abilene promises a capacity crowd. The Waco based group is the Texas affiliate of the National Farmers Union which was founded in Texas.

Convention delegates will voice their views on state and national issues when they adopt the 1966 policy statement, which is one of the highlights

of the three day meeting. State officers and delegates to the National Farmers Union convention will be elected by the assembled delegates.

The convention program will feature speeches by Senator Ralph Yarborough, Congressman Graham Purcell of Wichita Falls, and Congressman Jim Wright of Ft. Worth, President James G. Patton of the National Farmers Union will address the annual banquet session which will be held on Friday night, November 5th. Patton has served as president of the 750,000 member national organization longer than any other national farm organization leader and is internationally recognized as an authority on world agriculture.

Other speakers who will address the Farmers Union convention are H.M. Baggarly of Tulsa, noted journalist, and Bill Crawford of Dallas, Southwest Regional Director of the Neighborhood Youth Corps. Lyle Robinson of the Swisher County Electric Cooperative will speak to the convention on his experiences in Viet Nam while serving on a mission there.

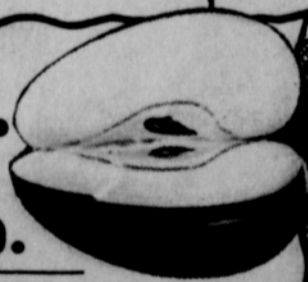
