City receives early Christmas present

Bob Bullock reported the City sales and use tax allocation summary thru period ending 11-01-85, and Hansford County received a pretty good Christmas present—that is the City of Spearman and Gruver both showed an increase in sales tax for the last 30 days. Gruver was up 9.92%, and Spearman was up 196.24%—an all time record for the City of Spearman.

Net payment for the City of Gruver for this period was 4,631.21. Comparable payment last year was 4,095.38. 1985 payments to date for Gruver is 37,873.33. 1984 payments to date were 34,454.53, an increase of 9.92%.

Spearman received a big Christmas present, when Bob Bullock's office sent the City of Spearman a check for 168,783.18. 1985 payment totals to date is 357,470.97. The 1984 payments on this same date last year was 142,339.67 an increase this year of 151.14%!

In a talk with city officials, we learned that Bob Bullock informed the City of Spearman that some company, apparently an oil co. that had been doing business out of Spearman was some 4 years behind on paying their taxes and now the situation had been resolved and the city of Spearman receives the large sales tax for this period.

IN THE OPINION OF THE COURT

Crime, drug abuse, sexual license, contempt for society — on all counts the situation is worse, not better. Why do we no longer hear much about juvenile and parental delinquency?

First, the more common evil becomes, the less it is called *delinquency*. Lower standards enough and there are no delinquents!

Second, it wasn't juvenile or parental delinquency that caused our plight. It was *spiritual delinquency*. Millions in our society set their spiritual standards at a level where such delinquency became custom.

The thing to do with an opinion like this is to REVERSE it. That can be done by a Higher Court — such as an *aroused* citizenry, seeking every spiritual opportunity and fulfilling every religious responsibility that its churches provide and teach.

Will's wife, Deana May came out to visit with Juanita and after a few minutes went back into the house. As Juanita was beginning to leave and begin her walk home, she heard Deana May yelling for help from within the house. Juanita rushed to the back door of house only to find the door locked! Through the window in the door, Juanita could see Will sitting at the table, slumped over and as Deana May came to the door, Will fell to the floor. As Deana May opened the door another hindrance appeared to Juanita—the family dog was at Will's side protecting him and Juanita knows how well he can protect since she had been bitten previously by this dog. As Deana May was trying to pull the dog into the bedroom, Juanita made her way to Will and found him unconscious and cyanotic. Juanita

yelled to Deana May to call for an ambulance as she rolled Will to his side and gave him four back blows and the obstruction was cleared from the airway and spontaneous respirations were detected by Juanita. She turned Will's head to the side and swept his mouth. When she turned his head up, Will said "Juanita". When the ambulance arrived, Will confused about what was happening to him, but was otherwise doing fine. He was transported to Hansford Hospital in Spearman where he was admitted. Will was released from the hospital on Thursday, November 7. Saturday, November 9, H&S EMS held their 6th annual banquet. Dave Clark, Executive-Director of Panhandle Emergency Medical Services System was guest speaker and presented Juanita with their Merit of Honor award, the highest award given, for her actions. Mr. Clark also told the group that Juanita would be receiving an award from the American Heart Association. New average rate for savings bond

The market-based interest rate for Series EE Saving Bonds issued between November 1, 1985 and April 30, 1986 is 8.36 percent for their first semiannual interest period, C.A. Gibner Chairman of First State Bank, Spearman, Texas, Hansford County Savings Bonds Chairman, announced today. This is the seventh semiannual rate to take effect since market-based, variable rates were introduced on November 1, 1982 and represents a decline for the May-October rate of 9.49 percent. The rates are adjusted semiannually, each November and May.

"This new rate is consistent with other rates available in the market and should continue the strong sales of Savings Bonds that we have seen in the past year," said C.A. Gibner. "Approximately 70 percent of all Bonds are sold through the payroll savings plan. As more people learn the features and benefits of Bonds, we anticipate excellent results from our volunteers conducting payroll savings campaigns at 38,000 companies nationwide."

When combined with the previous market-based rates -- 11.09 percent from November 1982 to April 1983, 8.64 percent from May to October

1983, 9.38 percent from November 1983 to April 1984, 9.95 percent May to October 1984, 10.94 percent from November 1984 to April 1985, and 9.49 from May through October 1985 -- the average yield for the seven periods is 9.69 percent. This average is part of the market-based formula only for eligible Bonds issued in or before April 1983.

The market-based rate is 85 percent of the average return on Treasury five-year securities during the previous six months. All Bonds must be held at least five years from their date of issue or November 1, 1982, whichever is later, to receive the market-based rate. New bonds are guaranteed to earn a minimum rate of 7.5 percent per annum, compounded semiannually, when held at least five years.

New Savings Bonds held less than five years earn interest on a fixed, graduated scale -- ranging from 5.5 percent after one year to 7.25 percent after 4-1/2 years.

More than \$78 billion worth of Savings Bonds are now held by the public. Bond holdings represent debt that does not have to be financed in the open market at higher cost to taxpayers.

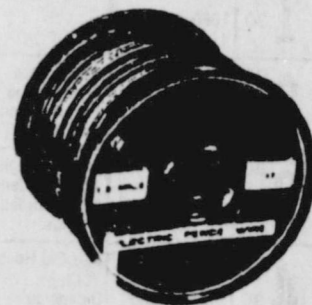
