Oil Reserve Needed

Sen. Bill Bradley (D-NJ) is urging that the nation fill its strategic petroleum reserve while oil prices are relatively low.

In salt caverns in Louisiana and Texas the nation has stored in recent years 502 million barrels of oil. The idea is to make the country less vulnerable to another oil embargo.

The Reagan Administration, however, has decided to stop adding to the reserve, in an economy move.

Barbecued Chicken

1 2 to 3 lb. Fryer halved



HOME APPLIANCE Update 

Air Conditioner
 During hot weather, many consumers wonder if it is better to start their air conditioners early, or wait until it begins to get really hot. According to home economists from Whirlpool Corporation, the unit should be started in the morning hours during hot weather. Air conditioners have to work harder and operate less efficiently when started during the warmest part of the day.




Consumers also wonder if it's really necessary to clean the filter in the air conditioner. The home economists advise that dirty filters can cause more service calls than any other problem. The air filter collects dust, lint and other particles from the air before it passes over the evaporator coil, so periodic cleaning of the filter (every 3 to 4 weeks) can really help to maintain peak performance.

It's also wise to have a service company inspect and clean the coils and condensate water passages, as well as check the fan and oil the fan motor once a year. Annual maintenance before hot weather arrives can save time and frustration of having a non-working unit when you need it the most.

Microwave Oven

Microwave ovens are entering more and more kitchens everyday. According to home economists from Whirlpool Corporation, new owners want to know if metal utensils can be safely used when cooking in a microwave oven.



Because microwave ovens are not all built alike, the home economists advise checking your user's manual before putting metal in any microwave oven. In most cases, when used properly, metal will not harm it. When using aluminum foil in your oven, be aware of and follow these cautions:


1. Aluminum must never touch the inside walls of the microwave oven.
2. Aluminum must never touch another piece of metal.
3. The amount of food must be greater than the amount of metal being used.

To determine if an oven utensil is safe for microwave cooking, the home economists advise placing the utensil in the microwave oven next to a measuring cup of water, and cook at HIGH for one minute. If the utensil is warm or hot, it is absorbing microwave energy and should not be used. When purchasing material for microwave oven use, look for utensils that say "microwave safe"

Murrow & Media

A new book about Edward R. Murrow points to the deficiency in the broadcast media today. "Murrow: His Life & Times" by A. M. Sperber, reminds us of the high goals Murrow sought for television and radio.

Speaking of the broadcast media, Murrow noted that it had no character, no conscience of its own. It must strive to be objective and possess a sense of responsibility, he argued. The only alternative is to justify broadcasting because it entertains, he held. That would be like justifying newspapers because they carry the funnies.

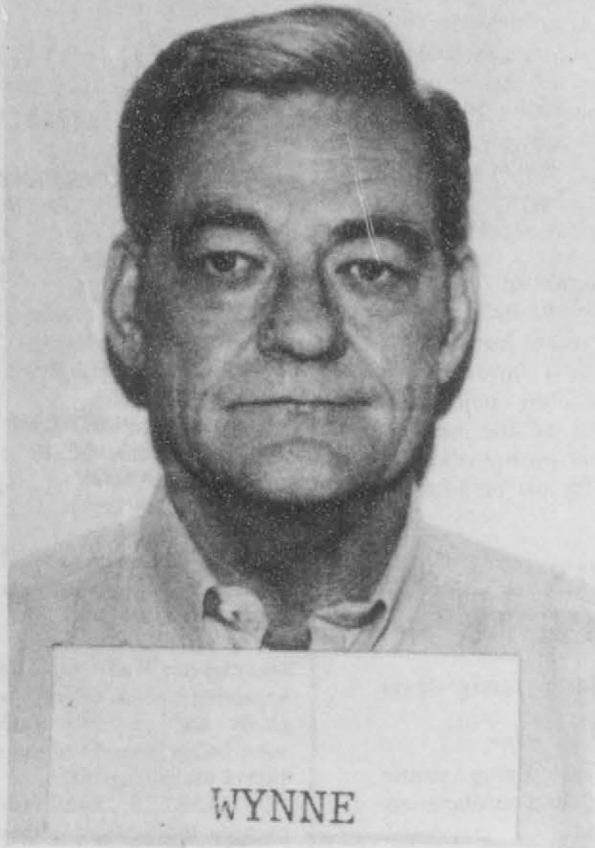

CRIME STOPPERS



WYNNE

L. R. Wynne

After a long, distinguished career in law enforcement, LaFayette Russell Wynne is now running from the same police department whose badge he used to wear.

Wynne, who will celebrate his 57th birthday on June 28, retired from the Amarillo Police Department in the early 1970's after achieving the rank of Chief of Detectives.

Now some of the same men he commanded are hunting for him for the 1982 murder of Eric Mathis on a downtown Amarillo street.

This week Wynne has been added to the Texas Most Wanted list. A reward of up to \$1,000 is being offered by the Governor's Office for information leading to Wynne's capture.

Police reports indicate that on the

afternoon of October 15, 1982, Mathis was shot several times with a .41-magnum revolver while his car was stopped at a traffic light.

Wynne was arrested a short time later, although a motive for the slaying remains somewhat of a mystery. He was convicted of the killing on two different occasions. The first conviction was overturned. The second trial ended on September 13, 1985, when a District Court jury found Wynne guilty once again.

The trial judge allowed Wynne to remain free following the conviction and told the ex-officer to return the next day for sentencing.

Not surprisingly, Wynne failed to show up the next day. He received a 50-year prison sentence in absentia.

Investigators discovered that Wynne, who was an experienced pilot, fled Amarillo via a small airplane. They theorize he flew south, possibly into Mexico and even as far away as South America.

He has not been seen by authorities since.

Wynne is described as a white male, 6-0, 200 pounds, with grey hair and blue eyes. He has some tattoos on his right arm and usually wears glasses.

Anyone who might have information on Wynne's whereabouts is asked to call the Texas Crime Stoppers Advisory Council toll-free at 1-800-252 or their local Crime Stoppers program. In all cases, callers do not have to reveal their identities.

Texas Most Wanted is a cooperative program between the Department of Public Safety and Texas Crime Stoppers.

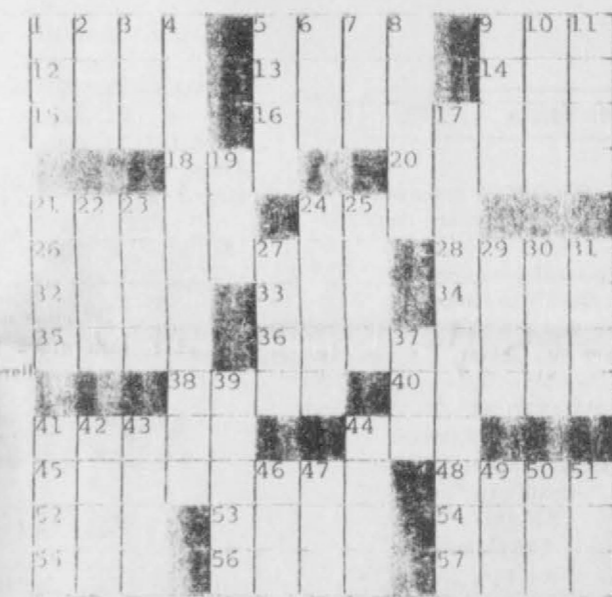

Society plans MS Arrest, Jail and Bail

How much would you pay to get your best friend out of jail? How about your boss?

The Panhandle Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society is planning a comical new fundraiser called *MS Arrest, Jail and Bail* to find out how much people will donate to "spring" their friends out of jail.

Carol Fisherman, program coordinator for the fundraiser, said area towns will conduct the "Jail and Bail" on a Saturday during the month of September. Individual towns will decide the specific day and details of the event.

"This is part of a large outreach program, a 'Space Program,' underway at the MS society to recruit more volunteers because we're the only MS society in the area," Mrs. Fisherman said. "Later on down

the road, we would like to establish branch offices."

Patients come from all over the Panhandle to the Amarillo MS office for assistance, she said.

This is everyone's chance to put his friends, relatives, boss, secretary, lawyer, CPA or teacher in jail, Mrs. Fisherman said. Children can even put their parents in jail, she said.

Requests for arrests are made by callers who are willing to make a donation to the MS society to have their friends arrested.

The fund raiser was also conducted last year, she said. Many cities have planned arrests of prominent citizens such as judges and mayors, Mrs. Fisherman said.

Arrestees are brought to a central location, the "jail," by volunteer "deputies." A "judge" sets their bail and the arrestee then telephones friends to help raise the bail, Mrs. Fisherman said.

To be released from jail, people must either raise the set amount of bail or make telephone calls for a specific amount of time, Mrs. Fisherman said.

"Bail may be \$50 or 2 hours for example," Mrs. Fisherman said.

The committee is in the process of calling Panhandle towns to secure committee chairmen and six committee members.

"We want to make it just as comical as we can," Mrs. Fisherman said. "They can make the arrestees wear striped shirts. Town residents can use their imagination and make it a fun, exciting community project."

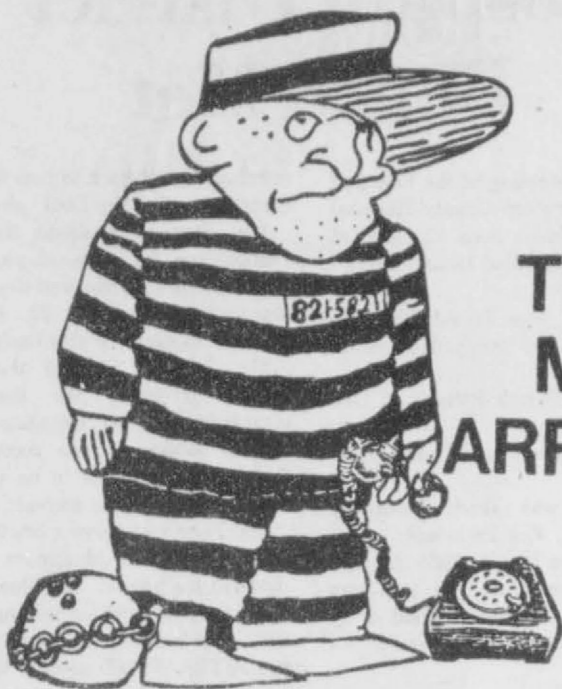
The fund raiser is ideal for towns with population under 30,000 throughout the Panhandle, Mrs. Fisherman said. The *MS, Jail and Bail in Amarillo* will be held later this year.

Multiple sclerosis is a disease of

the central nervous system - the brain, spinal cord and optic nerve. More Americans are affected by MS than by Muscular dystrophy, cystic fibrosis, hemophilia and myasthenia gravis combined, according to statistics released by the MS society.

No two cases of MS are the same, said Jo Ann Holt, executive director of the Amarillo office. MS generally strikes adults between the ages of 15 and 50 and is being diagnosed nationally at a rate of 200 new cases per week - a ratio greater than the polio epidemic of the 1940s and 1950s, she said.
