2. Empty packing cases, cartons and other packing material should be disposed of promptly, as soon as goods are unpacked. Storerooms, back rooms and basements, should be cleared of such material daily.
3. All store exits should be clearly marked.
4. Retail stores should confine smoking by customers and employees to specifically desig. nated areas. In many stores, smoking by customers on the buying floors is unlawful. Easily seen signs at the store's entrance stating that smoking is forbidden are recommended.
5. Sales clerks and other employees should be given instructions on what to do in case of fire.
At the first appearance of flame or smoke, employees calm and leave the building calm and leave the building quickly by the nearest exit in a orderly fashion. Be certain exits are located where the exits are located.
6. Every store should give its sales clerks and other employees complete instructions on how to handle fire extinguishers and should be explained to them, however, that while fire extinguishers can help control small fires, the fire department should be summoned immediately.
Employees should be divided into teams of three in training for a fire emergency. One the fire extinguisher or fire hose, the second should call the fire department by telephone, and the third should summon the fire department by sounding an alarm in the nearest outside fire alarm box. The employee sounding the alarm from the box should stand by until

One sidelight on Christmas at the Ohio Penitentiary, as at others, is the search through the prisoners' packages - just to
make sure there is no contramake sure there is no contra-
band. War
Warden E. L. Maxwell says 000 packages contain forbidder Items. The search is carried out in front of the prisoner to whom the package is addressed. Very little of the contraband is actually dangerous.
Peanut butter, for example, is banned because it could conceal
narcotics. Prunes, raisins and narcotics. Prunes, raisıns and
dried fruit are forbidden because it's too easy to improvise brandy from them. Transistor radios are outlawed because enterprising prisoners might adapt them for cell-to-cell communic tions.

Picking Toys In Prison Another type of problem faces officials and inmates of the state reformatory for women at Dwight, III. Many of the women have children, and the ordinarients could turn into tragedy. This tragedy is averted, how ever, thanks to the efforts of the Salvation Army.
Each year, about the middle of November, the women file into a gaily decorated room with a toy-laden table in the middle.
The toys are paid for by donations to the Salvation Army.
