On December 31, 1984 at approximately 4:13pm a Spearman residence entered the Spearman Police of his pickup. No citation was issued. The officer had been advised earlier of a vehicle matching the description in reference to the subject being very drunk at the Dairy Queen. The officer pulled in behind the vehicle. As the officer was checking out with the vehicle, the driver of the vehicle stepped out of the vehicle and almost fell down. As the officer approached the driver, he observed the driver stand back up. The sibject swayed as he stood and had wa strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath. The subject was asked for some identification and he handed the officer his drivers license. Subject was placed under arrest for public intoxication. Subject was booked into the Hansford County jail.
