Absentee voting for the Republican and Democratic primaries has begun and will continue through April 27.

Persons who are eligible to vote by absentee ballot include registered voters planning to be out of town on May 1, those 65 years of age or older, those not able to vote on a Saturday because of their religious beliefs, those confined to jail, and sick or disabled persons not able to stand in line, said Potter County Election Supervisor Pat Clark.

Ballots may be cast at the Clerk's office, Hansford County Courthouse.

## In bike-pickup crash Cyclist suffers broken leg

A Spearman youth suffered a broken leg and wrist injuries Wednesday night in a motorcycle-pickup crash on county road number one, just south of the football stadium.

Motorcyclist Mike Goff was treated for apparent injuries at Hansford Hospital and transferred to an Amarillo hospital for a double check for possible internal injuries.

The driver of the pickup was uninjured. Investigating officer Max Gunn of the Texas Department of Public Safety said the driver of the pickup -- properly licensed as a minor -- was attempting a U-turn when the motorcycle, traveling without lights, struck the left front fender of the pickup.

Trooper Gunn took the opportunity to emphasize the importance of motorcyclists and bi-

cycle riders to be properly lighted. He also urged that motorists be constantly on the watch for either of these two-wheel vehicles.

Almost all motorcycleists

throughout the U.S. have adopted the practice of riding with their lights on even in the daytime. There is so little mass or bulk to a bike -- particularly in heavy traffic -- that the

daytime lights have helped other motorists to spot them in time to avert an accident.

Goff was reported in good condition at press time.

## Cleanup Campaign preview Twice-weekly trash pickup started

As one form of encouragement to Spearman residents for the Cleanup Campaign that is almost on us, city sanitation crews have already started twice-weekly trash collections -- normally scheduled to begin in May.

"The well-filled residential trash containers tell us many residents have already begun a cleanup at their place," City Manager Jim Murray said. "And we don't want to slow down the effort by having over-full containers awaiting once-a-week pickup so we have already put crews on the twice-a-week schedule."

Murray had a reminder: "Be sure to put grass and weed clippings in the trash containers. They are too fine for the flat-bed truck pick up -- especially with the winds we have been having."

The flat-bed pick up service has been offered for several seasons, now. These trucks, driven by city employees, will haul off discarded lumber and lumber scraps, tree limbs and the heavier twigs falling or trimmed from trees.

For any one with quite a bit of discard to be loaded on the flat-bed -- and particularly for working people who must do

their cleanup after regular work, the city will locate a flat-bed truck at your curb overnight. You can load at your convenience and a city driver will pick it up the next day.

Only city employees will operate these vehicles.

The concentrated Cleanup Campaign sparked by the Chamber of Commerce with the hope of enlisting all in the city will be "kicked-off" in a few days, offering other helps and services as well as some challenges to a sparkling clean city.

Between now and then, we repeat: do not worry about filling your trash container. Regular twice-a-week pickup has started.

# Spearman PD hosts school Rotary - YMCA Auction April 25

## Deadline Is May 1

A school for law enforcement officers emphasizing three areas of crime was conducted here this week with six area law enforcement agencies in attendance.

The presence of so many officers may have intimidated the "bad guys" for the Spearman Police Department enjoyed a quiet week, according to Chief Ron Robinson.

The school occupied three days -- Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday -- with one day given over to a study of all the ramifications of the investigation of burglary; one day to robbery and a day devoted to homicide.

Attending were representatives of Carson County, Dumas, Sunray, Gruver, the Hansford County Sheriff's Department and the hosts for the training period, the Spearman Police Department.

Chief Robinson termed it a highly successful seminar and said he hoped it would lead to more such schools in the area since there are so few conducted in the Panhandle compared to the number staged over the rest of the state.

Chief Robinson reported that his department investigated a one vehicle accident on the mall parking lot at 6:14 P.M., Thursday -- the lone accident reported during the week.

According to the investigative report, a 1979 Ford pickup truck driven by Regina C. Bontke of Morse, struck a utility pole when the driver was blinded by the sun. Little damage was done but minor injuries were reported.

Tuesday, one person was hospitalized following the report of a narcotics "over-dose" in the 200 block of Roland. Chief Robinson said his department is investigating.

Tuesday evening, officers investigated the report of an animal bite in the 200 block of N. Endicott. Investigation proved the animal was on the property of its owners.

--And that was the week of police activities in the city of Spearman.

Hansford County Sheriff R.L. McFarlin reported a similarly quiet week for his officers in the county.

Alice Peddy, chief appraiser for Hansford County Appraisal District, announced today that all persons required to render taxable property must have these reports filed prior to May 1.

The Texas Property Tax Code is specific in listing property which must be rendered to the chief appraiser for property taxation purposes. These include:

- \* All tangible personal property used for the production of income that is owned by a person or that he manages and controls as a fiduciary on January 1; and
- \* For banks located in Texas, a statement listing assets and liabilities;

In addition, the chief appraiser may require a person to render for taxation any other taxable property that he owns or manages and controls as a fiduciary on January 1. The chief appraiser will deliver written notice that the statement is required and attach to the notice a copy of the appropriate form.

(List what renditions will be required in appraisal district.) According to Chief Appraiser Alice Peddy, rendition statements are filed with the chief appraiser of the appraisal district where the taxable property is located.

Any taxpayer who believes that his property's value has decreased during the preceding tax year for any reason other than normal depreciation may file a report of decreased value. This report describes the property involved and states the nature and cause of the decrease.

Rendition and report of decreased value forms are available at the Hansford County

Appraisal District office. Any-one filing a rendition or report shall include all information required on the form, as well the signature of the property owner or an authorized individual.

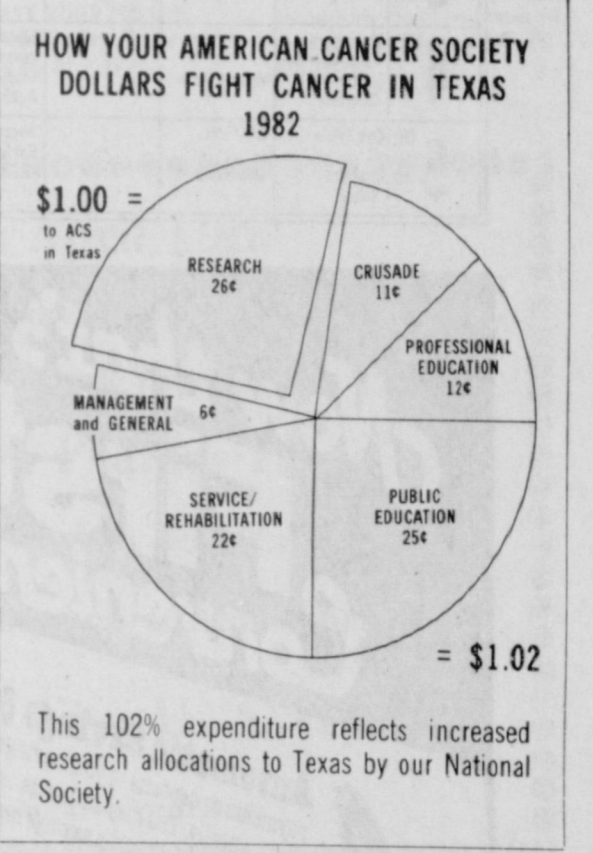
For the first time, persons rendering property are not required by law to state a market value for the property. However, a taxpayer may continue to state his opinion of the market value and assure himself of required notices if the value is changed. Renditions and property reports are confidential and no longer open to public inspection.

These forms must be filed with the Chief Appraiser after January 1 and before May 1 at the appraisal district office at 13 W. Kenneth. For more information, call 659-5575.

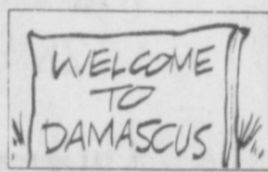

Texas' like to brag and according to Texas writer Bill Porterfield points out in a special issue of Context, the Du Pont Company's current affairs magazine, devoted to Texas, Texas has more cows than people. Texas ranks third behind California and Iowa in crop receipts. Farms are fewer, larger, specialized, more expensive to operate, but far more efficient and productive.

"As a result, Texas is the leading producer of cotton, grain sorghum, rice, watermelons, cabbage, spinach, onions and carrots. When you combine livestock with crops and timber and call it agribusiness, you have the state's leading industry, a \$20 billion a year production which even outsells oil," he declares.

Counting Our Blessings

There's now some encouraging news for cities and towns near rivers and marshes that have been breeding grounds for mosquitoes. A selective biological insecticide has been developed that kills the mosquito larvae but does not harm people or the environment.



Thomas Jefferson was the first US president to be inaugurated in Washington, D.C.

In a test in Georgia, the insecticide was applied to a river breeding ground for wild salt marsh mosquitoes. The pre-count of mosquito larvae found an average of 200 larvae per water dipper, a heavy infestation. After the site was sprayed, officials were delighted with the results. The insecticide, Teknar, manufactured by Sandoz Inc., San Diego, kills only first, second, third and early fourth stage mosquito larvae and does not hurt the environment.

AUSTIN--April 12, 1982 -- Governor William P. Clements is proclaiming May 2-8, 1982 Clean Air Week in Texas.

The purpose of Clean Air Week is to protect and conserve Texas' air resources.

The American Lung Association of Texas (ALAT) and the Texas Air Control Board (TACB), the state agency with responsibility for reducing and controlling air pollution, are cosponsoring Clean Air Week at the state level. "For the second consecutive year, energy conservation is Texas' theme for

Clean Air Week because of the relationship between energy production and air pollution," said Dr. Stanton P. Fischer, president of the American Lung Association of Texas.

TACB Executive Director Bill Stewart said, "The need for energy and for clean air need not be at odds. Conserving energy can help protect our precious air resources by limiting the amounts of air pollutants released when oil, gas, or coal is burned to produce energy. Even with the best control equipment available, we

cannot completely eliminate the release of air contaminants from industries and from motor vehicles.

"We hope that Texans will use Clean Air Week to focus their attention on how energy use relates to environmental pollution and to think of ways to conserve energy. Helping reduce air pollution can be as simple as using mass transportation or car pools, adjusting thermostats, using less hot water, and turning off lights when leaving a room," he said.

Dr. Fischer said, "The air we

breathes affects our lives and our lungs. By joining together to conserve energy, this community can reduce air pollution."

Dr. Fischer suggested several ways to help reduce air pollution:

- do not burn leaves and trash;
- keep automobiles properly tuned and keep pollution control devices maintained;
- do not smoke cigarettes;
- use car pools and public transportation and walk rather than ride as much as possible.

**Wind Electric Power**

Using windmills to generate electricity is a rather recent application of wind power, when you consider that windmills have been used to do man's work for more than 5000 years, reports Dr. Bill Cooper of Oklahoma State University. A number of people in the southwest can remember when windmills dotted the western skies generating electricity for farms. Dr. Cooper reports that Oklahoma State University's Engineering Extension continues to receive requests for reports dealing with windmill generation of electric power. Some of these reports date back to the early 1930's Cooper noted. He also noted that the homes and farms using wind power to generate electricity in the 1930 time period did not have the large power demands that our modern homes of today require. As a help to persons interested in the subject of wind electric power, Dr. P.M. Moretti of the Oklahoma State University Department of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering has written an article answering some of the most frequently asked questions. His article also gives the names and addresses of a number of manufacturers of wind electric systems. The article concludes with a list of references for further study, reports Dr. Cooper. 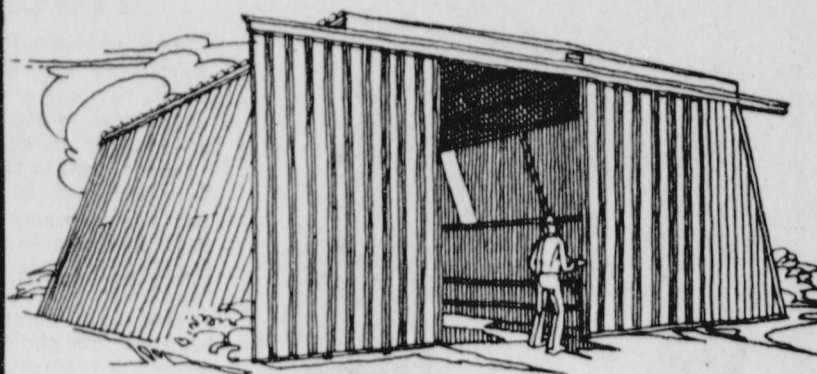
