Following the two Junior High games at Stratford, the Lynx J.V. played an exciting game. Stratford scored early in the first quarter. The point after was good, and the Elks took an 8 to 0 lead.

In the second quarter #30 Danny Lopez returned a Stratford punt 65 yards and scored. Point after failed. With only 11 seconds remaining in the first half, #22 Jay Garnett connected with #12 Shawn Cook for the Lynx's 2nd touchdown. #28 Cody Reynolds kicked the extra point to give Spearman a 13 to 8 halftime lead.

Late into the third quarter #44 Mark Garcia scored on a 19 yard run, and Reynolds again made the extra point with 9:03 remaining in the fourth quarter #31 Scott Wilkerson scored on a 1 yard run, and Reynolds booted the extra point. The Lynx scored again with 5:57 left in the game. The score coming on a 1 yard run by #40 Delwin Whitmire. Reynolds kicked the extra point and the Lynx won by a score of 33 to 8.

The Lynx had two interception, one by #60 Keith Clark, and the other by #11 Edward Mayfield. #88 Jerold Blain recovered a fumble and the Lynx defense held Stratford to 4 first downs and 100 yards total offense. Spearman's offense gained 253 yards, 75

yards of the total on passes. The Lynx made 12 first downs, and won their second game of the regular season. The Junior Varsity now stands at 210.

Next Thursday game will be played against White Deer at Lynx Stadium. The game will follow the two Junior High games.

The United States has the greatest fire problem of all of the industrialized nations today. The sad truth is that six thousand Americans die and thirty thousand more are injured each year as a result of fire. Deaths and injuries are highest among the very young and the elderly. Eighty percent of these deaths and injuries were caused by fires in the home. Many of these losses could have been prevented if people would have known how to prevent fires, prepare for a fire, and protect themselves in a fire.

Many people still think that the fire departments only role is to fight fires, putting them out when they start. This leads them to believe that total fire safety and responsibilities lie in the fire departments. The firefighters today perform several functions that contribute to fire safety. When the variety of these functions are understood by all, they will realize that they too play a very important role in the prevention of fires.

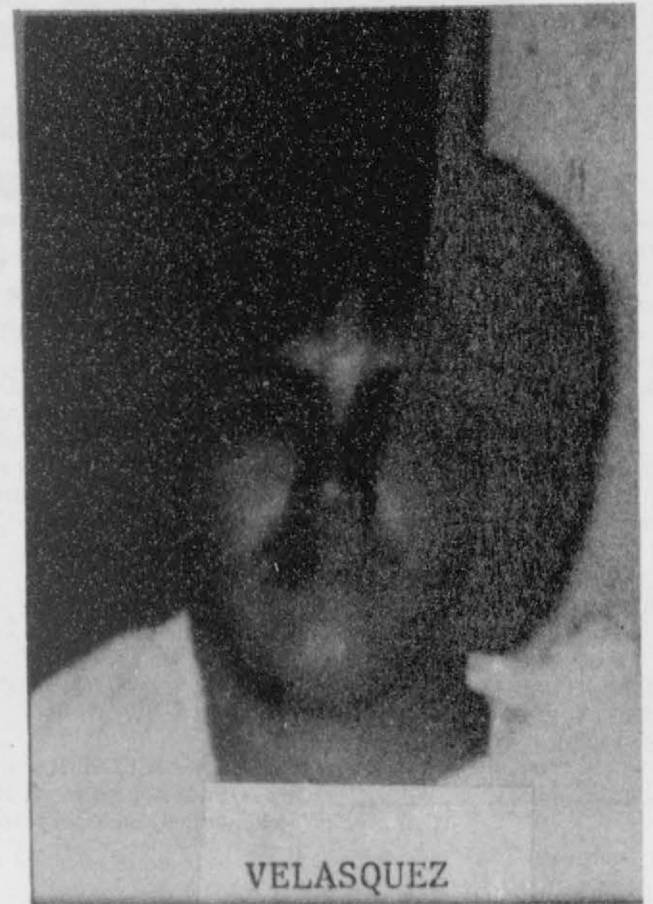

TEXAS MOST WANTED
DANIEL ALVARADO VELASQUEZ
FUGITIVE #77

LUFKIN, Texas -- Daniel Alvarado Velasquez recently spent his 28th birthday doing the same thing he probably did for his 27th birthday -- running from the Texas law.
Velasquez, a native of El Salvador, is wanted on a murder warrant issued out of Lufkin in connection with the Christmas Eve, 1984, killing of 58-year-old Jose Rojas.
Police reports indicate Rojas was attending a small neighborhood Christmas party when the incident occurred. Witnesses say Velasquez drove up to the get-together and jumped out of his vehicle hollering and brandishing a machete.
Investigators say the party-goers scattered quickly as the suspect swung the machete and cut one of the victims across the stomach. Fortunately, the injured person was able to escape.
However, Jose Rojas was not so lucky. He was stabbed in the abdomen with a black-handled utility knife, then staggered to a neighbor's house where he collapsed on the front porch.
He died about an hour later in the emergency room at a local hospital.
Detectives say witnesses identified Velasquez as the offender. The killing has left investigators rather perplexed. According to a Lufkin Police Department spokesman, no one seems to know why Velasquez was upset when he drove up to the party, or why he allegedly acted in such a violent matter.
In an effort to learn the answer to that question, this week Daniel Alvarado Velasquez has been added to the Texas Most Wanted list.
A reward of up to \$1,000 is being offered by the Texas Crime Stoppers Advisory Council for information leading to the capture of Velasquez.
Police say Velasquez is about 5-foot tall, 120 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes.
After fleeing from the crime scene, the suspect reportedly went to Houston and still might be in that area.
Anyone who might have information concerning Velasquez' whereabouts is asked to call the Texas Crime Stoppers Advisory Council toll-free at 1-800-252-8477 or their local Crime Stoppers program. In all cases, callers do not have to reveal their identities.
Texas Most Wanted is a cooperative program between the Department of Public Safety and Texas Crime Stoppers.

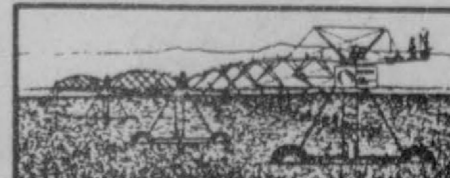

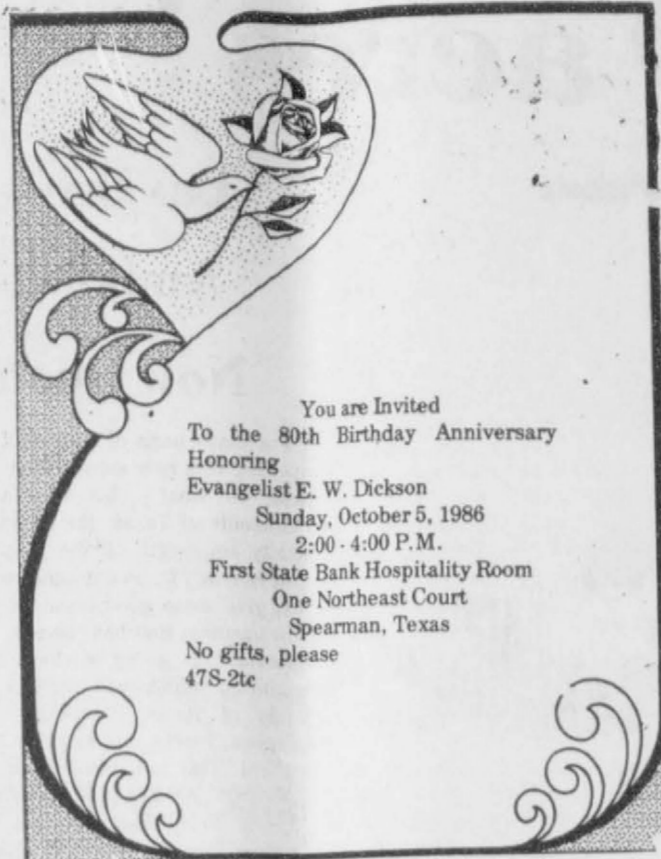

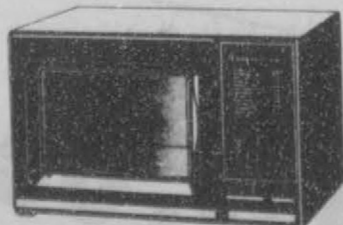
