

Corps Of Engineers Proceed With Dam Project

Johnny Lee, Palo Duro River Authority director, said this week that the Southwest Region Corps of Engineers office at Dallas had overruled a recommendation from the Corps of Engineers of Tulsa, Okla. that the work on the proposed lake be delayed by two years. "The Corps felt the need for water was not here on the North Plains today," and they said we were ahead of ourselves," said Lee.

"The region office told the Corps to proceed with planning on the project," the Palo Duro executive reports. "This next report will go to the U.S. Congress for possible financing of the Palo Duro Lake." The proposed Palo Duro reservoir when built, will be impounded behind a 2 mile long dam some nine miles north of Spearman in Hansford County. The location would be near the junction of the North and South

Palo Duro creeks, which flow out of Moore County, and Horse Creek. Lee says the dam would be 160 feet in height and create a reservoir of 114,000 acre feet - A lake that would be larger than either Greenbelt, near Clarendon, or Optima, near Beaver, Okla. Corps of Engineers studies covering 50 years indicate sufficient water flows from the Palo Duro watershed in Hartley,

Moore and Hansford County to maintain and fill a lake. Conservatively, the annual flow is between 7 million and 8 million gallons average daily, but Lee claims it actually runs from 9 to 10 million gallons average daily. Lee calculates the May 27 rain and flood that hit the eastern edge of Hartley county and west and northern Moore county would have put some 9 billion gallons of water in a Palo

Duro Lake. "This would be roughly 28 percent of the water the lake could hold," he says and adds, "Even the rains the watershed had in 1978 would have filled it." He said that 30,280 acre feet of water went down the creeks in May. Calculating 325,860 gallons of water in an acre foot selling at an estimated \$1.00 a gallon, Lee concludes that the water that went down the drain in May came to approximately

\$9,000,000. The PDRA authority is going with the Corps of Engineers route to build the Palo Duro dam but there are other options. "We have an option to cut away from the Corps anytime until a contract for construction is let," he says. "If we had the money lined out-revenue bonds- and buyers for the water, the PDRA could go with the project now."

Service Quality Discussed

A number of items on the agenda of the regular meeting of the Spearman city council, Tuesday night, were tabled because Mayor Ralph Blodgett was absent due to illness.

Deferred to a later meeting were opening and consideration of bids on a true-lease financing method for airport hangers; grant applications to the Texas Aeronautic Commission for fiscal years 1981 and 1982 and a preapplication for a grant from the Federal Aviation Administration for fiscal year 1982.

Consideration discussion centered around the quality of service that General Telephone gives in Spearman in the light of a recent Texas Utilities Commission (TUC) approval of a rate hike effective Oct. 1. TUC, in granting the hike, had -- in an unprecedented move -- invoked a \$4-million poor service penalty.

It was noted in the discussion that there were two things yet to be decided by TUC: Following an investigation of the phone company service set for February, 1981, the penalty could be removed in the event of better service or -- if service is found below TUC standards, the commission could go so far as to initiate decertification proceedings against General Telephone Co. in all its serving areas in Texas.

City Manager Jim Murray said the final ruling TUC would give the true picture of what customers in Spearman could expect along with higher phone bills. That ruling is due momentarily.

Though Mayor Ralph Blodgett was absent, he has long been outspoken against what he called giving a company a raise in pay for increasingly poor service.

Council members present approved payment \$43,359.40 to Lipham Construction Co. for the recent seal coating of city streets and \$3,000 to Lipham for paving a city-owned parking lot next to Golden Spread Center. Funds for the latter will come from revenue sharing monies.

R & R Sheet Metal, Borger, was awarded the job of repairing one existing rotor assembly and constructing one new rotor assembly for the city's waste water treatment plant at a cost of \$4,234. It was noted that this amounted to a considerable saving compared to prices quoted by a former source of both repair service and new units.

Bid of the Passavat Corp. for 52 sets of aeration blades for the waste water treatment plant was accepted. The figure was \$1,500.

A public hearing was conducted and an ordinance passed to close an alley lying between Northeast Court and Avenue A. Actually, an alley as such had never existed but there existed an easement authorizing an alley. This was terminated without opposition.

The mayor was authorized to enter into a fire protection agreement with Ochiltree County covering rural properties in the west part of that county at a cost of \$250 per fire run. The agreement had previously been approved by Ochiltree County commissioners.

Remainder of the meeting was occupied with the routine reports and authorizations attendant to transaction of company business.

The Lynx have some 60 boys out for football so far this year.


The tractor pull which has been held on Sunday afternoons for the past few years was discontinued due to dwindling public interest and rising costs.



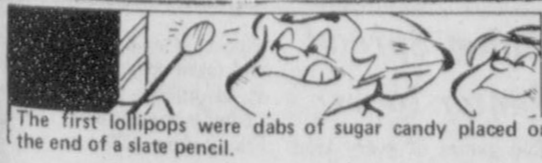

Golden Spread Center News

Lee Sanders, director of Retired Senior Volunteers Program at San Antonio, Texas, was the leader of the Nobody's Perfect II, section 2, Workshop in Spearman on Thursday, August 14 at the Golden Spread Center, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. This was a workshop conducted by the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission's Area Agency on Aging.

Mr. Sanders touched on the director, the center manager or volunteer coordinator as a manager of volunteers.

In his presentation on Volunteerism today, he explained the vast changes that are occurring in the field and what these changes dictate regarding the role of the volunteer manager.

He explained that the volunteer manager is the person who is directing a volunteer effort and is confronted with the fact that they are managers and must accept and understand their responsibilities. A good leader plans the time, concentrates on results, builds on strengths, concentrates on a few things that can get good results, makes objective, practical decisions, and is not a moaner or a groaner.

In decision making, one needs first to accurately define the problem, analyze needs, present all the alternatives, decide between alternatives, convert decisions into action, and focus on results.

In talking about why people volunteer, motivations were examined. The goal is to serve senior citizens. The objective

has to be expressed in terms of the client. It is necessary to develop a series of strategies. Who? What? When? Where? How? It is important to get a lot of people involved in the decision making. The important task is to sell the plan to others. Leaders control where we are going. It is important to evaluate where you are at. People volunteer for power, for affiliation, and for achievement.

In designing volunteer jobs to fill your needs, one needs to assess needs and create volunteer job designs to fill those needs. Staff acceptance of volunteers is extremely important and does not need to be threatening to paid staff.

Forty people were served at the noon covered dish dinner that was served. People attended the workshop from Amarillo, Borger, Darroutz, Dumas, Gruver, Hedley, McLean, and Spearman. Twenty-one of those registered were from outside of Spearman.

In the after lunch session, the discussion got down to the practical discussion of the nuts and bolts experience in using volunteers, the practical exercise in determining volunteers needs in senior citizens centers and nutrition programs. There was a group discussion of the volunteer needs and realistic expectations in each of the centers represented.

There was practical instruction in fund raising in communities, and how to get money out of the state, United States government agencies, and industry foundations. There was an exchange of ideas and interaction with trainer Lee Sanders on planning and im-

plementation of fund raising activities.

The afternoon concluded with an Information and Referral Model that helped to assemble and provide information to link older persons with needed resources. It was stressed to collect and report data about the needs of the elderly. It can be a cornerstone upon which new or different programs are developed.

Organization of staff, information and referral as an identifiable part of an organization, supervision and training, location, resources files were stressed.

A good resource list includes professionals, businesses and individuals who can be called on to help. Updating a resource file should be a continuous, non-stop process.

Board Votes Increase In Cafeteria Prices

The Spearman I.S.D. voted in their regular meeting to increase the price of the lunch and breakfast program in connection with our Child Nutrition Feeding Programs.

Elementary lunches, grades 1-4, will be 80 cents; in Jr. High, grades 5-8, lunches will be 85 cents; and High School lunches will be 90 cents. Breakfast prices for all students will be 40 cents and 75 cents for faculty. Faculty lunches will be \$1.30 and all guests' lunches will be \$2.00. There will not be a morning milk program.

Lunch tickets may be purchased for Elementary students for 1 week for \$4.00; 2 weeks for \$8.00; and for 1 month or a 20 day ticket for \$16.00. In Jr. High, 1 week for \$4.25; 2 weeks for \$8.50; and 1 month for \$17.00. In High School, 1 week for \$4.50; 2 weeks for \$9.00; and 1 month for \$18.00. Faculty tickets may be purchased for 1 week for \$6.50; 2 weeks for \$13.00; and 1 month for \$26.00. Tickets may also be purchased for the breakfast program and 1 week tickets are \$2.00; 2 weeks for \$4.00; and 1 month for \$8.00. Tickets will be sold on registration day in the all purpose room from 8:30 - 10:30 a.m. on August 28, Thursday.

Children from families whose income is at or below levels shown on the attached scale are eligible for free and reduced price meals. If children are eligible for free meals, they are also eligible for a free extra carton of milk, if served at a time other than the lunch hour. The reduced price for lunch and breakfast is 10 cents. If your income is greater than those shown, but you have unusually high medical bills or shelter costs in excess of 30% of your income, or special education expense due to the mental or physical condition of a child, or disaster or casualty losses, your children may still be eligible.

The school children of parents or guardians who become unemployed are eligible for free or reduced price meals and milk during the period of unemployment, provided that the loss of income causes the family income during the period of unemployment to be at or below the levels shown on the attached scale.

In certain cases, foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If you have foster children living with you and you wish to apply for such meals and milk for them, please notify us or indicate it on the application.

All children are treated the same regardless of ability to pay. In the operation of child feeding program, no child will be discriminated against because of sex, race, color, or national origin.

Applications for free and reduced price meals may be made anytime during the school year and forms are available in the school offices.

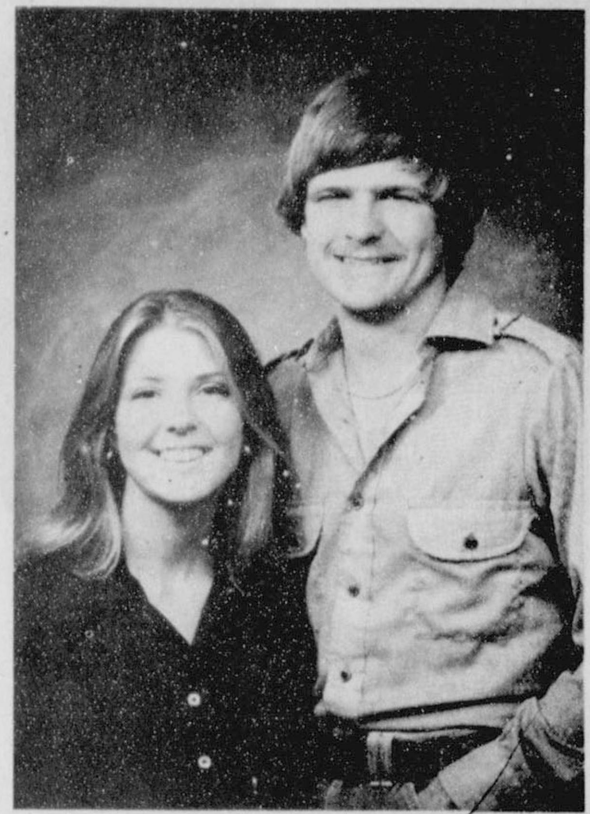

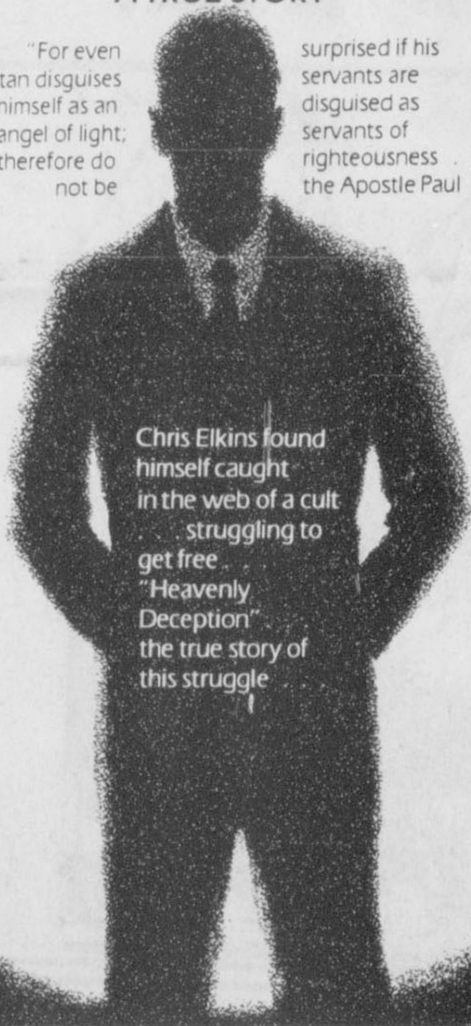

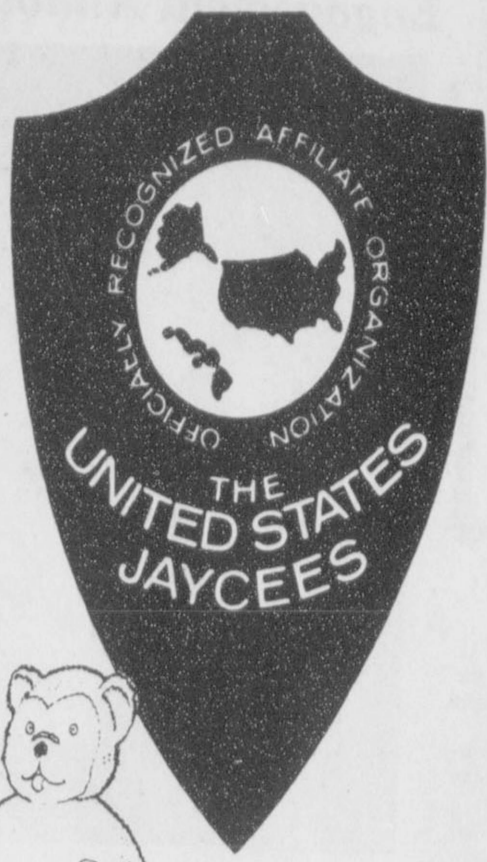
