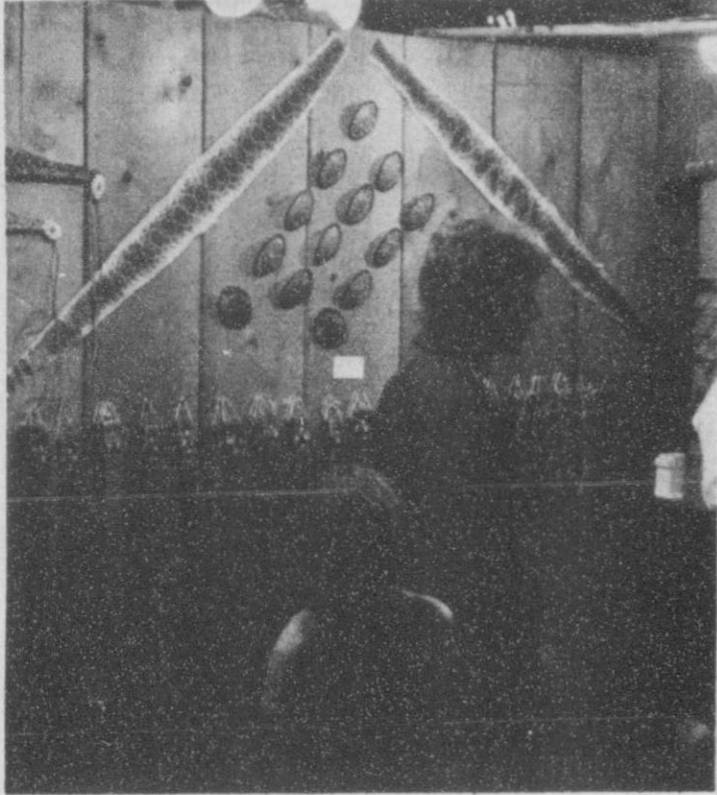
Along with the roundup, there is an open flea market, a gun show, snake demonstrations, western dances, a pageant, a devotional service on Sunday morning, a

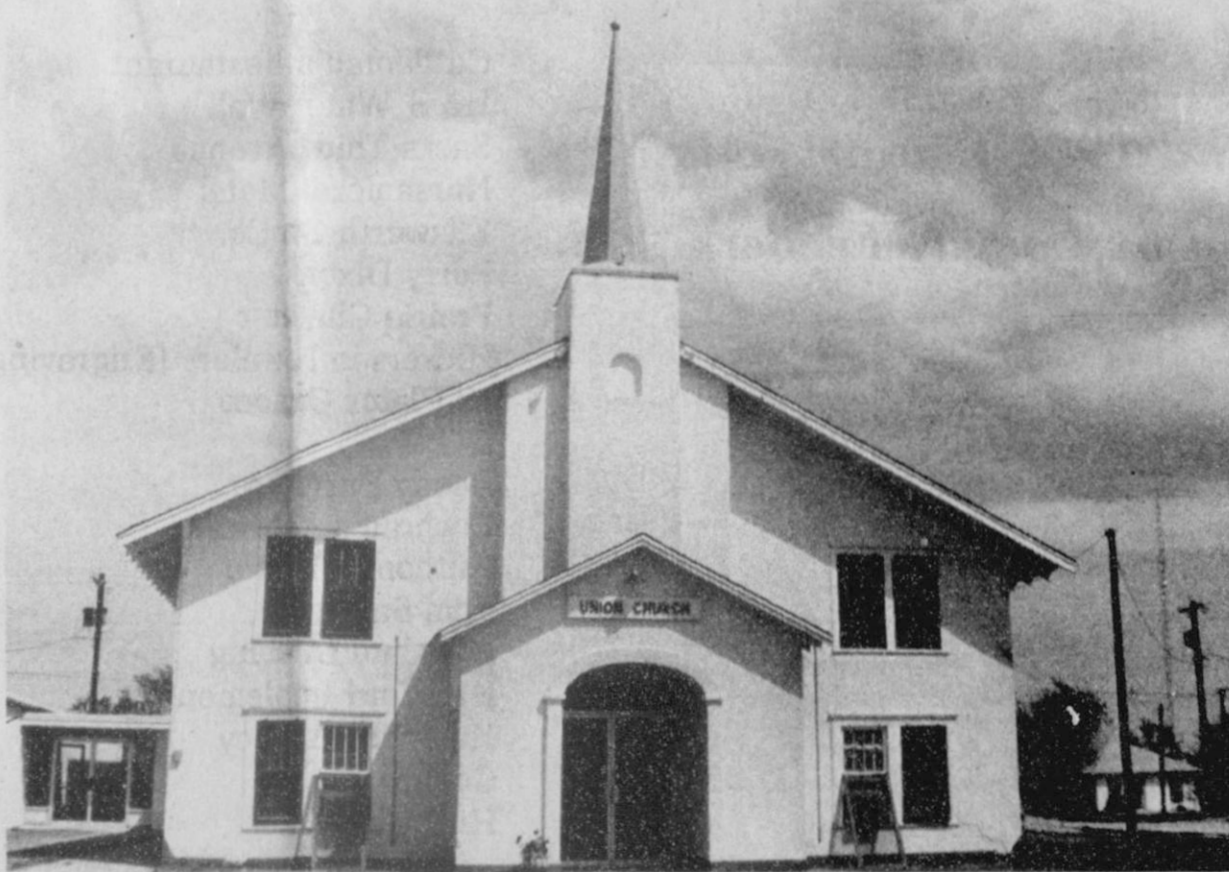

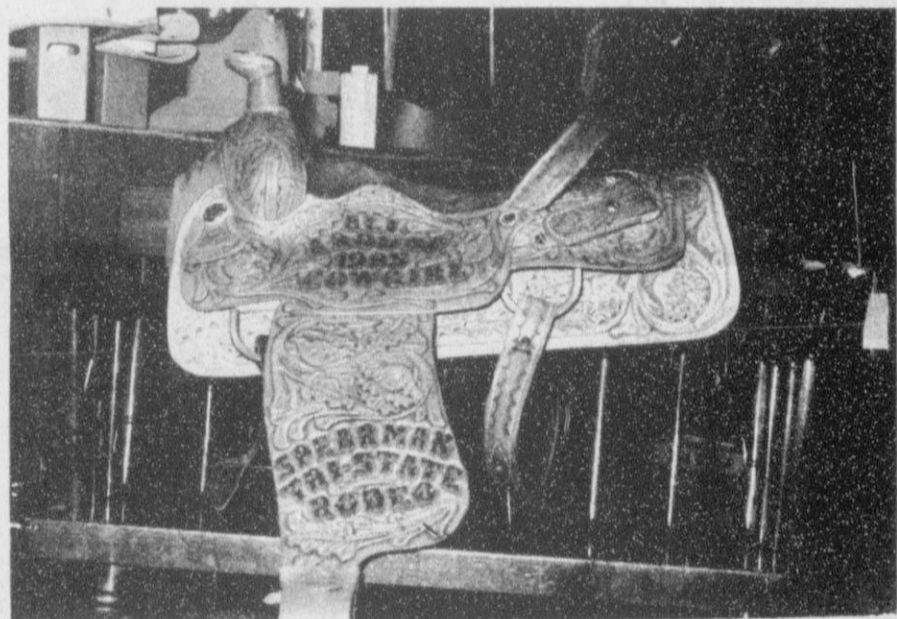
