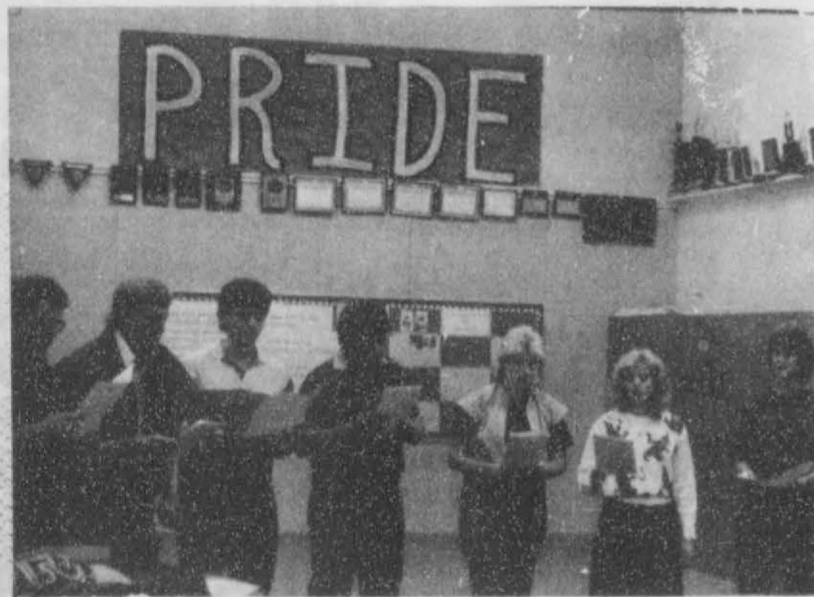
## Obituary

# 4-H's Learn By Doing

4-H is designed to promote an awareness of what 4-H is, and the benefits of the organization.

What does the term 4-H mean? It is the emblem, pledge and motto of the organization, and the four H's represent the four-square development of head, to help learn new and better ways of doing things; heart, to help develop ideals and standards for living in society; hands, to give the opportunity to develop useful skills and to apply them; and health, to help develop habits of good health.

4-H is not associated with just rural young people anymore. Members are just as often as not living in

town, and they participate in the programs, even the livestock show, as much as the rural 4-Hers.

Boys and girls ages 9-19 can take part in 4-H, and become a member of a 4-H Club. In the club, the group participates in 4-H projects, run their own club, elect officers, and develop their own program with the help of adult volunteer leaders.

Improving leadership and citizenship are two of the greatest benefits of 4-H, as well as being educational. There are a variety of projects to choose from, including automotive care and safety, beef cattle, clothing, dog care and training, food and nutrition, photography, plant

and soil sciences, woodworking, and wildlife management among others.

In addition, 4-H involves the family. Members select and conduct their projects with the approval and support of their parents. Giving encouragement and the resources needed by the 4-H'er is very important.

4-H is a non-profit, educational program open to all youth regardless of race, color, religion or national origin. There is no membership fee to join 4-H, although each member is usually responsible for financing his or her own projects. 4-H is the youth phase of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.
