Officials stated that geophysical work on the dam could begin in 3 to 4 weeks with actual testing beginning in 2 to 3 months, Land acquisition will begin soon also. The dam construction will be layed out in 12 steps. The first step is the Water Conservation plan. Step 2 is the Archeological survey and testing. The step is final Geotechnical Analys-

is. These 3 steps will be done in 1986 and early 1987.

Step 4 will be Survey Of Land requirements, since most of the first 3 steps should be accomplished soon.

The 5th step is Conflict Evaluation. The 6th step is Land Appraisal. 7th step is Final Design. 8th step is Conflict Resolution. IN early 1988 the Texas Water Development Board will review the project. In Mid 1988 Advertising and Award of Contract for the Construction of the dam will be let. Actual construction which is step 12, should begin in 1988 with completion of the dam in 1990. A complete chart is printed on page 8 of this paper.
