How to save 72.37 in fuel!

Well, this morning, it is cold and crisp or at least it is in my house. Sometimes, I go outside in the wintertime just to get warm. My problem is usually because we keep the heat turned down low in an effort to economize on heating cost. It is the same principle as during the summer, trying to economize by keeping our thermostats turned high when we would like to turn the air conditioners to a lower setting.

Anyhow, I used to devour articles on the reasonable cost of solar energy or wind-mill power as a solution to our high utility bills. By the time I had spent \$25 on books that told me how to save money (in the long run of 25-50 years) I came to the conclusion that I would save more money by just paying the utility bills.

However in the winter time, I would get double pleasure out of a fireplace

or wood-burning stove and we have often contemplated purchasing an old fashioned wood-burning stove so we could contentedly sit and relax and also inhale that wonderful smell that would transport me in thoughts to the Ozark country of Arkansas. Now sitting around a pot-bellied stove doesn't give everyone the same peaceful vision that it does me, especially the one that has to stick his head out from under the warm covers in the morning to get up and "stoke the stove" and add some more firewood. But if we ever got a wood-burner, I believe my husband would be willing to do that little chore. The only problem I anticipate would be finding a stove that he could sit on top and dangle his legs over the edge and we might have to compromise a little and get one of those newer versions that we owned when we got married. Oh well whatever!

We consulted with a man who figured out what the total expenses of his conversion to an energy efficient wood burning stove and how he "counted the cost of cutting costs."

Outstanding Conservation Farmer DWIGHT GILLISPIE

Dwight Gillispie lives near the Morse community. He owns 320 acres of land a few miles northeast of Morse. Dwight also operates several hundred additional acres of land in Hutchinson and Hansford County with his father, Jack Gillispie of Gruver.

Several years ago technical assistance was requested through the Hansford Soil and Water Conservation District from the Soil Conservation Service personnel at Spearman to correct some severe soil erosion problems. In 1982 Dwight entered into a Great Plains Conservation Program contract, which provides cost-share assistance for installation of conservation practices.

Under the program, assistance has been provided for shaping and seeding of 20 acres of grassed waterways to protect the farm from erosive rainfall runoff from adjoining farmland. These waterways also serve as a stable outlet for the 3,963 feet of diversion terraces and 1,344 feet of parallel terrace which protect the sloping cropland on this farm from erosion by rainfall as well as irrigation tailwater.

Dwight's cropping system usually consists of irrigated grain sorghum and wheat with a portion of the farm planted to dryland wheat. He does an excellent job of managing crop residues to prevent wind and water erosion as well as conserve soil moisture.

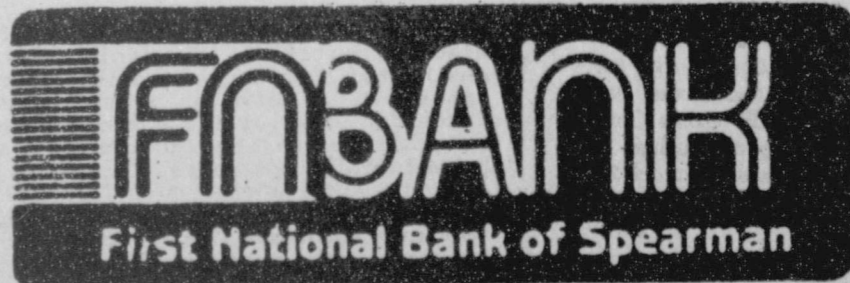
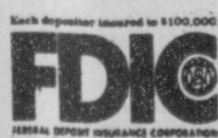

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Hansford County
Hospital District, hereby finds that an election should be held
to determine whether said governing body shall be authorized to
issue bonds of said District in the amounts and for the
purposes hereinafter identified; therefore,

BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE HANSFORD
COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT:

SECTION 1: An election shall be held on the 17th day of

"SHALL the Board of Directors of the Hansford
County Hospital District, be authorized to issue bonds
of the District in the principal amount of \$2,500,000
for the construction, repair or renovation of

otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years
from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more
series at any price or prices and to bear interest at
any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or
otherwise) as shall be determined within the
discretion of the Board of Directors at the time of
issuance or sale of the bonds; and whether ad valorem
taxes shall be levied upon all taxable property in the
District sufficient to pay the annual interest and
provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity?"

SECTION 2: Paper Ballots shall be used for said election,
which ballots shall be prepared in accordance with the V.A.T.S.
Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or
"AGAINST" the aforesaid proposition. Said proposition shall
appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

"THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,500,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION
BONDS FOR HOSPITAL PURPOSES"

SECTION 3: The District shall be divided into four (4)
election precincts for this election and the polling places

appointed to serve as Presiding Judge and Alternate Presiding
Judge for each polling place are shown in Exhibit "A", which is

nor more than six (6) qualified clerks to serve and assist in
holding said election; provided that if the Presiding Judge
herein appointed actually serves, the Alternate Presiding Judge
shall be one of the clerks.

On election day, the polls shall be open from 7:00 A.M. to
7:00 P.M.

Dennis Robertson is hereby appointed the Clerk and Debra
DeArmand the Deputy Clerk for absentee voting for said
election, and the Administration Office of the Hansford
Hospital District, 707 South Roland, Spearman, Texas 79081, is
hereby designated the place for absentee voting. The hours
designated for absentee voting by personal appearance shall be
from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. on each day, except Saturdays,
Sunday and official State holidays, during the period required
by law for conducting absentee voting.

A Special Canvassing Board shall be used for this election
in relation to absentee voting and Charlene Bryan is appointed
Presiding Judge and Muriel Boyd the Alternate Presiding Judge
of the Special Canvassing Board for absentee voting.

SECTION 4: All resident qualified electors of the District
shall be permitted to vote at such election, and on the day of
the election, such electors shall vote at the polling place
designated for the District Election Precinct in which they
reside. This election shall be held and conducted in
accordance with the Texas Election Code, except as modified by
Chapter 872, Acts of the 62nd Legislature, Regular Session,
1971, and as may be required by law, all election materials and
proceedings shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

SECTION 5: A substantial copy of this order shall serve as
proper notice of said election. Said notice, including a
Spanish translation thereof, shall be posted at three (3)
public places within the District and at the administration
offices of the District not less than fourteen (14) full days
prior to the date the election is to be held, and be published
on the same day in each of two successive weeks in a newspaper
of general circulation in the District, the first of said
publications to be made not less than fourteen (14) full days
prior to the date set for said election.

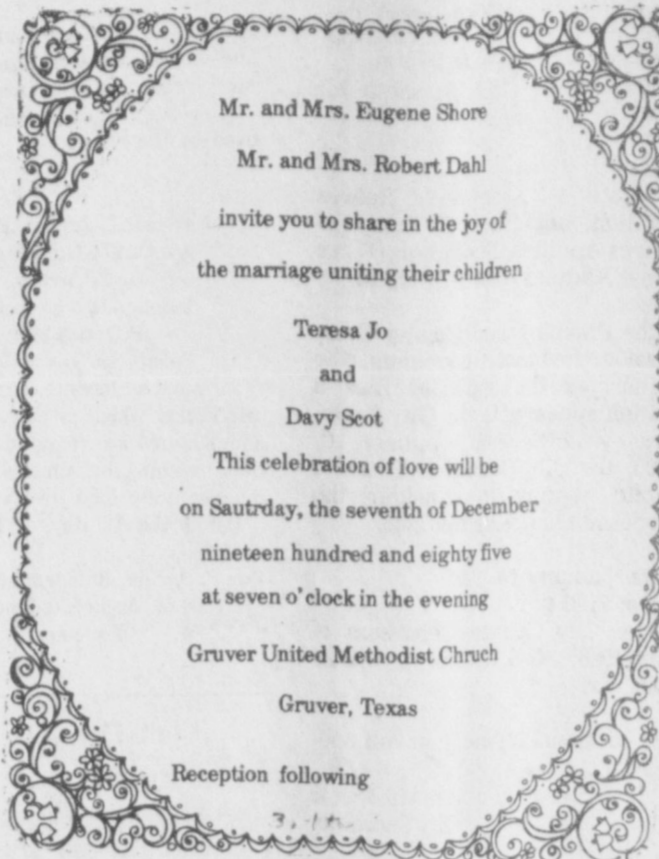

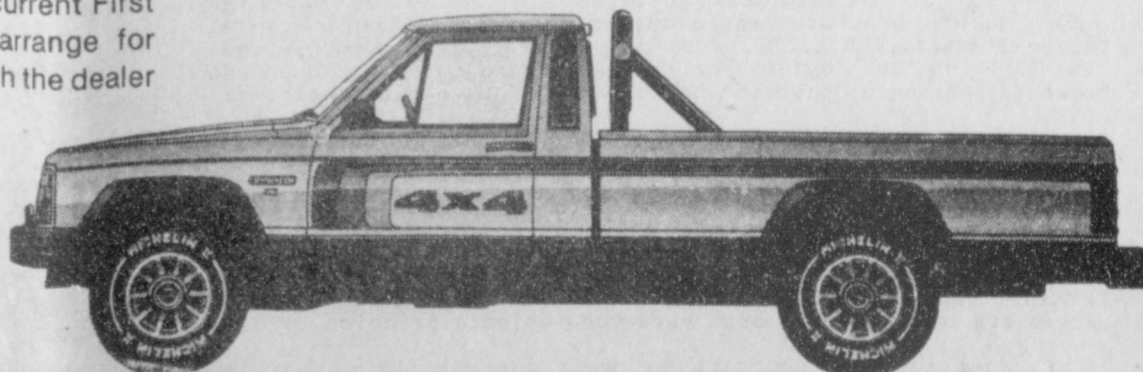

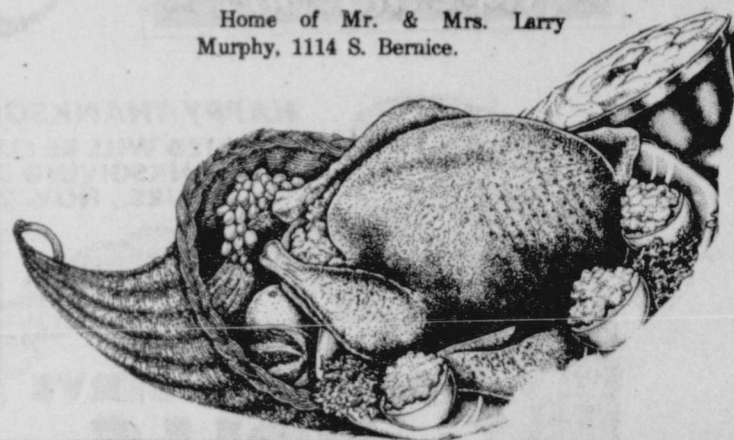
