He is the author of several books and articles on the Panhandle-Plains region of Texas and Oklahoma.

Mrs. Henderson, born in Stevens County, had lived in Hutchinson County 80 years. She and her husband, Lloyd C., were married in 1917 in Hutchinson County. He died in 1968.

She was a member of First United Methodist Church in Stinnett.

Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Denzil Lee Carp of Borger; and a brother, C. E. Lieb of Stinnett.

"Panhandle Pioneer" is the story of Henry C. Hitch, his ranch and his family. In the history of the tristate Panhandle region--the three corners of Oklahoma, Texas and Kansas--the saga of Henry C. Hitch and his ranch is also the story of the social, cultural and economic fortunes of the region.

Late in the nineteenth century young James Kerrick Hitch left his home in Tennessee for the High Plains and a hoped-for fortune. After ten years spent working and learning as a cowboy, he rode into the Coldwater Creek region of No Man's Land, the fertile subirrigated valley that was to be his Promised Land.

It was Henry Charles Hitch, James' son, who was to turn the valley and its adjoining uplands into an empire. Henry and the rest of the Hitches were a hardy, long-lived family who eked out a subsistence, raising cattle, borrowing money, going broke several times, flourishing at other times, lending money to neighbors. Always optimistic about the future of the Panhandle, the Hitches were willing to take risks, willing to borrow large sums of money, willing to experiment and change. Henry's genius and hard work paid off. In time the family owned 30,000 acres of land in three states.

Rev. Freeman Speaker Men's Prayer Breakfast

Pastor Ed Freeman, substituting for the scheduled speaker who couldn't be there, spoke to the interdenominational men's prayer breakfast Wednesday, September 5 at 6:30 a.m. in the garden room of the Cattleman's Restaurant.

Quoting Proverbs 11:11, "By blessing of the upright a city is exalted, but it is overthrown by the mouth of the wicked", he said that it made him think of the time when King Uzziah died and Isaiah concerned for his nation went to church and prayed about the situation. Too often when government officials do not measure up to high standards, we bad mouth them instead of praying for them.

As Isaiah prayed, he had a vision of the transcendent God "high and lifted up". He saw God in His perfect holiness and he saw himself and his nation as sinners. Too often we compare ourselves with people around us and we can always come out rather creditably, but when we compare ourselves to God, we

see that we are sinners. But Isaiah also saw God as imminent, "His train filled the Temple." God was as near as breathing, closer than hands or feet.

As Isaiah confessed his own sin and the sins of his nation, he had a vision of an angel taking a hot coal from off the altar and cleansing him for all his sin.

With the cleansing came also the call to service. "Who will go for us?" and Isaiah responded by saying, "Lord, send me." When our nation, our state, or our city are not all they should be, then we need to confess it before God and then be willing in obedience to God, to go for Him and proclaim the good news to the people of our community, state, and nation.

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT
(H.J.R. 108)
House Joint Resolution 108 proposes an amendment to the Texas Constitution relating to the appointment and terms of notaries public. The proposed amendment would:

—Require the Secretary of State to appoint a convenient number of Notaries Public for the state; and
—Authorize terms of office of Notaries Public of not less than two years nor more than four years.

A temporary provision of the proposed constitutional amendment provides that the amendment would take effect January 1, 1980; that each person who was appointed a notary public before January 1, 1980, would continue to serve as a notary public for the term for which the person was appointed; and that this temporary provision would expire January 1, 1982.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:
"The constitutional amendment to provide for the appointment of notaries public for the state and for a term of not less than two years nor more than four years as provided by law."

PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT
(H.J.R. 133)
House Joint Resolution 133 proposes an amendment to the Texas Constitution to provide for legislative review of the process of rulemaking by agencies in the executive department. The proposed amendment would allow the Legislature to enact laws:

—To provide for legislative review of the process of rulemaking by agencies in the executive department;
—To prescribe conditions for rules to take effect;
—To provide for suspension, repeal, or expiration of rules;
—To prescribe procedures; and
—To delegate powers to either or both houses or to committees of either or both houses.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:
"The constitutional amendment to provide for legislative review of

the process of rulemaking by agencies in the executive department."

PROPOSITION NO. 3 ON THE BALLOT
(S.J.R. 13)
Senate Joint Resolution 13 proposes an amendment to the Texas Constitution authorizing the Legislature to provide for the guarantee of loans used to purchase farm and ranch real estate for qualified borrowers. The proposed amendment would allow the Legislature to provide for, issue, and sell general obligation bonds called "Farm and Ranch Loan Security Bonds" of the State of Texas not to exceed 10 million dollars. All money received from the sale of such bonds would be deposited in a separate fund with the State Treasurer and administered by the commissioner of agriculture without further appropriations. These funds would be used to guarantee loans for the purchase of farm and ranch real estate. The commissioner of agriculture would use these funds, under provisions to be prescribed by the Legislature for the purpose of guaranteeing loans used for the purchase of farm and ranch real estate, to acquire real estate mortgages or deeds of trust on lands purchased with guaranteed loans. These funds would also be used to advance to the borrower a percentage of the principal and interest due. The Legislature may also authorize the commissioner of agriculture to sell to foreclosure any land acquired in the manner authorized by this amendment. The commissioner of agriculture would be required to charge at least 6 percent interest on such loans. The proposed amendment appropriates an amount that is sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the bonds that mature or become due during the fiscal year less the amount in the interest and sinking fund at the close of the prior fiscal year.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:
"The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for the guarantee of loans for purchase of farm and ranch real estate for qualified borrowers by the sale of general obligation bonds of the State of Texas."

SPRINKLER LEAKAGE INSURANCE

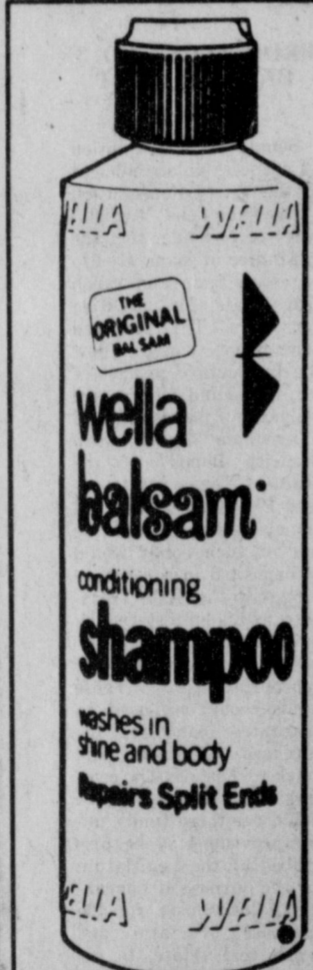

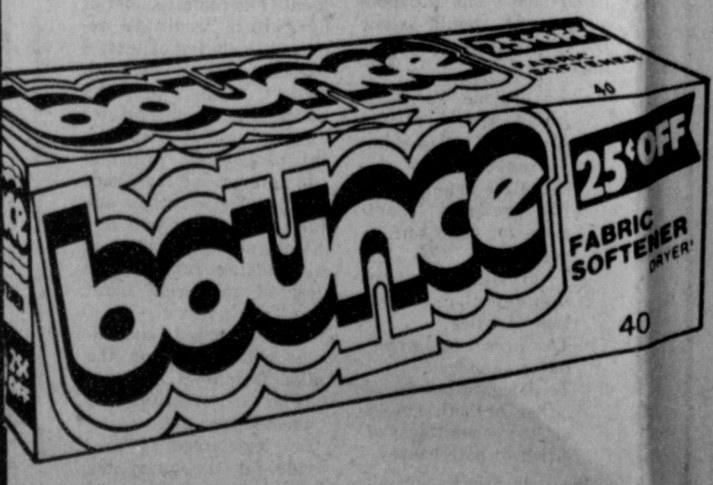
